

Merton Rise - An Update

Further to previous updates in July this year and August 2009, the Merton Rise Project Team has been working hard to bring forward the rest of the site as soon as possible.

Many of you will have seen that a public exhibition was held at the Community Suite of Everest Community College on the 9th and 10th July, showing the County Council's outline proposals and masterplan. The event generated tremendous interest in what the County Council wants to achieve at Merton Rise, so thank you to everyone who came along.

In addition, a presentation was made to a public meeting at Sherborne St John Parish Council on 28th June and consideration has been given to all of the views and responses received. An Outline Planning Application has now

been submitted to Basingstoke & Deane Borough Council, which is the Local Planning Authority. This is a major application and the Borough Council will therefore take some time to consider the proposals and will undertake its own consultation as part of the statutory process.

Whilst the planning application is being considered, the County Council will commence its marketing strategy, which will initially comprise an Expressions of Interest (or EOI) soon. We of course hope that the EOI will generate significant interest in the development opportunity and it is this interest that will inform the next stage of formal marketing.

We are hopeful that formal marketing will take place early in the new year and subject to suitable purchasers being selected and them getting their detailed scheme proposals approved, construction could start again late next year or early 2012.

Bonfire/Firework Safety.

REMEMBER:

- Fireworks are explosives.
- Always buy fireworks that comply with the British Standard.
- Follow all instructions and always put safety first.

AI WAYS:

- Light sparklers one at a time and wear gloves.
- Dispose of sparklers in a bucket of water as soon as they are finished.
- Never give sparklers to a child under five.
- Ensure that all children with fireworks are well supervised.
- Keep fireworks in a closed box or tin.
- Use them one at a time, replacing the lid immediately.
- Follow the instructions on each firework, using a torch never use a naked flame.
- Light fireworks at arm's length using a taper or a firework lighter.
- Do not drink alcohol if setting off fireworks.
- Stand well back.

NEVER:

Never go back to a lit firework, it could explode in your face. Never put fireworks in your pocket. Never throw fireworks.

BONFIRE TIPS:

- Never use/pour petrol or other flammable liquids onto a fire to get it going.
- Always start and keep bonfires away from buildings, sheds and fences etc.
- Check the bonfire for animals/pets that may be hiding within it before lighting it.
- Be aware of neighbouring/nearby thatch properties.

The calculation shows your total income and the allowances that are due to you for each of these years. If you do get a Tax Calculation, you should check the calculation carefully to make sure you agree with all the information given. If you don't agree with the calculation, contact HMRC on 0845 3000 627 and tell them why. Or you can write to HMRC at the address shown on the calculation.

What happens if you do agree with HMRC's calculation

If you agree with the calculation, you don't need to do anything - just keep it somewhere you can find it again easily if you need to.

If the amount you owe is under £2,000, HMRC will automatically collect the money from your pay during the tax year 2011-12. This spreads repayment throughout the year, but you can ask to pay it back over a longer period of time if you need to.

If the amount you owe HMRC is £2,000 or more, HMRC will write to you again and ask for direct payment. You can ask to pay the money back in instalments, rather than all in one go. You can contact HMRC by phone on 0845 3000 627.

In certain very specific circumstances, it may be possible to argue that HMRC had all the information they needed to calculate your tax correctly but did not use it at the right time. If it was reasonable for you to expect your tax deductions to be right, you may be able to ask HMRC to write off the underpayment. If you think you are in this position, you should phone HMRC and say that you want to make a claim under the Extra Statutory Concession, or ESC A19. You will need to make sure you've got all the facts of your case to hand before you speak to anyone about this.

What if you have paid too much tax

If you have paid too much tax, HMRC will automatically send you a repayment, usually within a week.

If you get an email

If you get an email which says it comes from HMRC, rather than a calculation, this is a scam and you should not respond to it. HMRC will only be sending out mail through the post about this, they do not send out emails.

It's a discounted rental scheme that helps people who can't afford to rent privately.

Do I need to be on the housing needs waiting list to apply?

No, but as Sentinel is a charitable organisation, you will have to meet certain criteria:

- You must be in housing need
- Your income must be too low to allow you to rent on the private market
- Your household income must be over £22,470 a year and less than £28,800 a year
- You must not be in receipt of housing benefit
- You can't have any legal or beneficiary interest in any other property
- The property must be used as your sole residence.







Phillips' Legal Corner



Question: What can low income couples do if they want to divorce, now that there aren't many local solicitors offering Legal Aid?

Answer: 'Finding a legal aid solicitor to help with the costs of divorce proceedings, not to mention the issues surrounding children and finances, has become almost impossible,' says Howard Gardener, solicitor and mediator at Phillips, 'especially in and around Basingstoke. The government has cut back enormously on renewing legal aid contracts, making it very difficult for couples on low incomes to manage their divorces. But what few people know is that you don't always have to battle your way through the courts at huge expense and have decisions about children and finances imposed upon you. Whatever stage of separation you have reached, or whatever issues you find most troubling, you should consider mediation.

Family mediation is mainly used for relationship and family breakdown issues, including divorce and separation, financial matters, and arrangements for children. It can help you and other family members come to an agreement about how life will carry on from now. What happens is that you and your partner meet with a qualified mediator (at Phillips both our trained mediators are qualified solicitors) in a neutral environment. The mediator offers a calm, impartial centre and helps you both to limit the conflict so that you can discuss things sensibly and make the right decisions over your own lives. Very importantly a mediator will help you to keep the needs of any children at the forefront of your negotiations – both of you may be parents of your children and need to consider their feelings because you will have a continuing relationship and responsibility even after your relationship as a couple has ended.

Mediation can be much cheaper, emotionally and financially, than fighting through the courts. It is voluntary, confidential and can be totally flexible, culminating in a detailed summary of the proposals reached, which you can have made into a legally binding agreement or court order.'

'So going back to your question,' concludes Howard, 'couples should certainly try mediation as a sensible and cost effective way of resolving problems when their relationship has broken down. The good news is that Phillips' mediation service – Town Gate Mediation – does still offer a legally aided service if you satisfy the income criteria.'

Dear Popley Residents

I would just like to give you a quick update from the Popley Safer Neighbourhoods Team on the Policing activities in your area. As you may be aware PC Chris Brindley has recently joined the team as the Safer Neighbourhoods Team (SNT) Beat Officer for Popley East. PC Brindley has a a lot of experience and I hope you would join me in welcoming him to Popley.

Over the summer holidays the Safer Neighbourhoods Team saw an increase in reports of anti-social behaviour around Marnel school and Chineham Park School. These reports were somewhat expected as, traditionally, these areas have had previous damage caused to them over the summer holidays by

youths acting in an anti-social manner. The Popley Safer Neighbourhoods Team and our partner agencies including Sentinel Housing and BDBC, have worked alongside the parents of some of these youths in order to prevent further anti-social behaviour and damage occurring at the school sites. PC Dan Carter recently met with staff at the new Spotlight Centre which used to be the Old Chineham Park School. The Spotlight Centre offers lots of variety and things to do for all community members.

Our team also received several reports of youths climbing on the new builds in the Poets areas. Several of these youths have been dealt with and we are hoping that this result will mean less occurrences relating to this type of anti-social behaviour.

Popley East currently has two of the three PSNP (Popley Safer Neighbourhoods Panel) core priorities. One of the core priorities we are dealing with is anti-social behaviour around Chineham Park. The Popley Team was actively patrolled this area in order to prevent large groups loitering in the area and causing a nuisance to our residents. You may also be aware that due to the concerns some of our residents have we are in the process of setting up a Neighbourhood Watch scheme in this area. Residents who have not yet signed up to be a member are encouraged to do so via contact the Safer Neighbourhoods Team on the details below.

The other priority currently active in Popley East is anti-social behaviour in Carpenters Down woodland area. The Popley Safer Neighbourhoods Team recently ran Operation VIXEN in the area which was a series of pro-active patrols by numerous Police officers, PCSOs and CSPOs in order to identify and deal with such behaviour in this area. We are still receiving a large amount of reports regarding nuisance motorcycles in the area. Please can I ask that if you witness motorcycles using this area or may have any information regarding the owner(s) of these vehicles that you contact PC Brindley or myself on the details below. Alternatively if you use the woodland area off of Carpenters Down I would just like to remind you that under no circumstances are motorcycles allowed in the area and offenders will be dealt with accordingly!

Work continues in Abbey Road to identify drugs misuse and the Popley Team will deal with offenders robustly. The PSNP will meet at the end of the month to vote three new priorities. This meeting will be the first chaired by a residents since the PSNP formed in 2007.

Recently Safer Neighbourhood Teams from all over Basingstoke helped out in Brighton Hill with the large fire on Gershwin Road. The scene was live for a week and took massive organising and lots of goodwill from officers.

PC Dan Carter has been gathering details of interested residents for a possible Neighbourhood Watch area in Barrington Drive in Popley West and a meeting will soon be arranged for the residents will meet to discuss roles and how information will be disseminated amongst the residents.

Finally with Halloween vastly approaching the Popley Safer Neighbourhoods Team are again working with Marnel Infant School in order to promote a safe and appropriate Halloween. The children at the school will be designing their very own "Be Safe Over Halloween" poster with the winning entrants poster being placed in shop windows, Hampshire Constabularies website and the Popley Matters magazine. The lucky winner will also be receiving a £50 voucher with runner up prizes too. Further information on this will be released soon.

I hope you are all keeping well and look forward to seeing you when we are out and about.



Many sewers serve only one property, but can potentially serve many, particularly on housing estates. Where a defect or blockage is found in a shared private sewer, the responsibility for repair rests equally with all the properties served by the sewer at the point of the defect. Householders should obtain the services of a contractor and split the costs equally amongst the appropriate occupiers".
