New Blood Donors Needed in Popley

National Blood and Transplant (NHSBT) is encouraging people who live in Popley to attend a blood donation session at a new venue on Monday 14th March or Monday 20th June at Popley Fields Centre, Carpenters Down, Basingstoke, RG24 9AE.

Amanda Whatley, Donor Relations Co-ordinator at NHSBT said: "We're working hard to increase our blood collection in Popley so new donors. Donors who have got out of the routine of donating as well as existing donors, are welcome. We'd really love to see the local community take advantage of these sessions so please make the effort to roll up your sleeve and save a life."

The sessions will be open from: 11.30-13.30pm and 14.30-16.30pm.

NHSBT needs to collect around 7000 donations of blood every day to meet hospital demand. There are 4 main blood groups - O, A, B and AB. Group O is the most common and therefore the most in demand. A regular supply of blood is vital - red cells last only 35 days and platelets only 5 days.

Giving blood is vital to ensure that patients undergoing surgery and receiving treatment for cancer and blood diseases, such as leukaemia, continue to receive the transfusions they need.

To be potentially eligible to give blood you must be aged 17-65, weigh at least 7st 12lbs (50 kgs) and be in good health. I'm sure you are aware of the terrible incident in Tewkesbury Road where a resident was badly assaulted recently. The Criminal Investigation Department known as CID are progressing well with the investigation and several males have been arrested and bailed. I have visited the victim on a number of occasions and, apart from being brave, he is a genuinely nice chap. If you do have information in relation to the assault then please make contact as soon as possible.

The PSNP or Popley Safer Neighbourhood Panel met recently to vote on the three core priorities for the first Quarter of the year. They are 1) Anti Social Behaviour in and around Chineham Park 2) Anti Social Behaviour in Shakespeare Road 3) Drug related issues in Abbey Road. These issues were highlighted by the community and voted in until April 2011. If you would like issues considered for the next meeting in April then please make contact. Redundancy is a form of dismissal. It occurs when an employer decides s/he needs fewer employees in the business or organisation. It is a potentially **fair** reason for dismissal.

Situations where you can be made redundant include:

- Your employer's business, or part of the business, has ceased to operate; Or
- Your employer's business has moved to a different place; *Of*
- The business's need for work of a particular type to be done has ceased or diminished.

You could be made redundant if:

the charity for

your community

- The work you do is no longer needed
- Your job no longer exists because your work is being done by other employees
- Your employer has ceased trading but is not insolvent
- Your employer's business, or the work you are doing, **MOVES** to another area
- Your employer needs fewer employees to carry out the work you are doing, although the level of work remains the same
- Your employer's business becomes insolvent
- Your employer was the sole proprietor of the business and the employer dies.

Redundancy payments -The **Statutory** redundancy payment scheme obliges your employer to make basic redundancy payments if you are made redundant and if you qualify because you have worked for your employer for at **least two years**. Your **employment contract** may give you a right to larger redundancy payments.

Points to consider - Is there a real redundancy? Because it is a neutral sounding reason for dismissing someone, it can be used to hide other reasons for your dismissal, such as discrimination. If you don't really think you've been made redundant when your employer says you have, you may be able to make a claim to an employment tribunal for unfair dismissal, discrimination, or both.

Popley Conservation Volunteers

Popley Conservation Volunteers (PCV) have been undertaking wildlife conservation work since 2004. The main focus has been Popley Ponds, a local nature reserve also known as the White Horse. Few people know of the pond's existence, let alone that it supports a population of smooth, palmate and Great Crested Newts, the latter being the largest of the native species.

The Great Crested Newt is one of Europe's most impressive amphibians. Both sexes grow to about 15cm long. The dorsal skin is dark brown to black with darker spots, a granular texture, and very fine white spots on the flanks. In contrast the underside is strikingly marked with orange/yellow spots. During the breeding season, males develop prominent dorsal crests and have silvery tail stripes. This time of the year, and up to mid July, the Great Crested Newts make their yearly excursion to breed in ponds and pools. The female will lay eggs on submerged aquatic plants, carefully wrapping each egg in a leaf. This species of newts is protected under European and UK regulations.

It is important for the survival of newt species that habitat be maintained. The general decline of amphibians has been caused by agricultural intensification and urban development, which have had serious adverse effects on ponds and their surroundings. If ponds are not managed they can lose their value to newts by becoming silted up or too heavily shaded by trees. Residents around new housing estate may have noticed the exclusion systems or the silver newt fencing put in place to prevent the newts from entering the development site.

Another serious threat to the ponds is garbage that pollutes the ponds and nature reserves. The Popley Conservation Group is dedicated to maintaining the site and improving the habitat for all species. Recently the group has started to extend the range of activities to include conservation work and surveying the wildlife.

Lynch Gate at the Cemetery

A revised quotation is awaited from Goodall Barnard as the previous one is out of date. The Parish Council will apply for the CEEF grant from BDBC when this is received – and must consider whether it wishes to contribute 50% (max'm grant is 50%). The application closing date is 28 February 2011.

Dark Lane Allotments

Carter Jonas Estate Agents has contacted the Parish Council on behalf of Downing College, Cambridge regarding development proposals for the Dark Lane Allotments site. A pre-application submission has been registered with BDBC comprising - one pair of semi-detached houses at the North end, a detached house at the Kiln Road end, with an open / allotment area between the houses. It was considered that the open space might form an extension to the Village Green.

The Parish Council has asked whether Downing College would consider transferring ownership of the open and allotment land to the Parish Council (on behalf of the Villagers); no formal decision has been made by the College, but this could be discussed in more detail once a formal preapplication response from BDBC has been received.

The Parish Council is not in favour of building (this is a flood plain), although these could be 'low-cost' for local needs. Cllr will draft an interim response to BDBC for circulation and review by other Cllrs.

A prince, a princess and a possible 'pre-nup'?

'Pre-nuptial agreements' may still seem a bit too un-British for many normal couples but for Will and Kate the stakes are much higher, so will the royal couple choose to have one and should you and I' asks Hayley Eachus, family lawyer at Phillips Solicitors. 'Both Will and Kate are likely to be realistic considering the royals' recent record for divorces and would have valid reasons to sign a pre-nuptial agreement: both families have independent financial assets and are not likely to be complacent about money; they may wish to protect family assets which are intended to pass through generations; and a pre-nup could contain really useful privacy and confidentiality clauses that would keep royal business private in the future. Questions of wealth and background surrounding the royal couple have consumed the media at a time when all the focus should really be on love and romance. But there are substantial assets involved which the two families may wish to ring-fence, so a pre-nuptial agreement will provide an effective means to do so.

Pre-nups have become increasingly common in Britain, especially among the wealthy, but are they worth the paper they're printed on for ordinary couples? Whilst the assets in the royal family do not represent the average financial position of most of us, pre-nuptial agreements may prove a significant safeguard for many: for example if you're entering a second marriage; or where personal or business assets have been acquired prior to the marriage; or where there is a desire to protect an inheritance and the needs of children from previous marriages.

What's coming over loud and clear from recent well-publicised legal battles ' concludes Hayley 'is that these agreements will be treated as binding and won't just affect the wealthy but will filter down to all intelligent adults where there is a significant disparity in the wealth you and your partner are bringing into a marriage. My advice is – it's certainly better to have one than not.'



OK, you may say I am wrong on many things but we all see things in a different light. First is our glass half full or empty? I feel that our glass has emptied out and no one is around to help fill it up. It has been filled with houses where not long ago there were open spaces. Long gone are the thick hedgerows, only the odd twigs you now see about. There is little room left for the wildlife except the rats.



There is no mention of the cost of these amenities and like the other items in the school there are costs. I read that Popley North (The Islands) are getting the inner paths upgraded. But they have bypassed The Poets. I will come to that in the next few lines. Regeneration leaves a bitter taste in my mouth; the first place to be regenerated was the centre of the Poets with the new flats and houses. Nothing that I can see has been regenerated from the money gained from it. I spent three months going round the Poets on my scooter looking at the paths and dropped curbs for the council. This was handed in and I expect put through the shredder as I never heard anything. I see that Sentinel Housing Association is going to put in new play areas to replace the others that will be removed. We were told this was going to happen on the Poets! What we did get was jet washing. The path going to the small play area is so bad that people are forever tripping over this. I proposed an extra play area in front of Dryden Close for the youngsters so they did not have to cross over to the park. The play area at the back of Dryden Close needs attention. I feel that this estate has been left unfinished and I feel noone gives a damn about the state of the area.

It was a great day for me when my son and his wife and their baby came to live on the Poets. Now sad I feel for them now as I know they are going to move away, Their cars have been damaged time and time again, I keep telling them to report it and get crime numbers as this will show the true reflection of the crime. Too many residents just give in and do not report crime. I can remember quite a few years ago when in my road on one night twelve cars had one or all their car tyres slashed. Two policemen came up dressed like Robocops with so many gadgets on their waists they had a job getting out of their car. After walking up the road they said that people should go to the station and report the damage. What was the point of them even coming out to see I wonder? Only one or two did go to the station the rest said "what's the point?", I have been here 40 years and have fond memories of the Poets and Popley. I was proud to say I live on Popley.

I and Her Indoors are looking at moving away if our son goes but it will be with a heavy heart, I feel we on Poets, no longer have we the good communities we once had. I do not know who I can trust the residents and the council and all the housing associations. I feel they have long abandoned the Poets whilst other seem to thrive.

As I have said at the start you will all have your own views but in your heart of hearts you have to agree with a lot of what I am trying to put across to you all. The love of my area is draining out of me and I have never felt so low. I give you one last thought, never trust in what you are promised, only believe the end results. I feel too many empty promises were made to us on the Poets and I feel we have been let down. Just believe in yourself and your own family it can be a cruel world out there. Well I hope you do not mind me putting this down. I just feel so hurt the way things are turning out on the Poets.

And I think that the County Council would rather spend 40 million on refurbishing plush new offices meeting rooms instead of the estates that need improvement.

The Nation Youth Volunteer Service vinvolved closes on March 31st for North Hampshire

Basingstoke Voluntary Services can confirm that Government have declined continuing support for the national \mathbf{v} involved youth volunteering program. This has meant that \mathbf{v} (our fund givers) has now provided all the \mathbf{v} Teams and Projects throughout the nation with the official notice of closure of the contract.

This has resulted in many experienced youth workers employment contracts discontinuing March 31st, and tens of thousands young volunteers left in a void while the current government reviews how to deliver a new youth volunteer program. To date, **v** funded 107 **v**involved Teams giving full coverage across the country so that young people were offered a high quality and consistent support enabling them to volunteer.

The vinvolved youth volunteer program has provided quality support, advice and guidance to young people and organisations interested in engaging with youth volunteering. The teams also work with young people in their local area to champion youth-led action and recruit Youth Action Teams – ambassadors to champion volunteering and inspire their peers to volunteer in their local communities.

Basingstoke Voluntary Services have delivered the vinvolved national youth program throughout North Hampshire with a team of 6 staff and numerous volunteers for the last 3 years and before this, delivered 10 years of the Millennium Volunteer youth program. However, this 13 year program of local youth volunteer support will cease to operate from the 31st of March 2011.

BVS youth manager Jaynie Lewis states "It is really disappointing to be in this situation after all the hard work put in by our dedicated v-team and local young volunteers especially when it links so nicely with the governments vision of the Big Society aspiration for more people to get involved in their local communities".

During the 3 years of delivering the V contract, the BVS vinvolved Team covering North Hampshire have encouraged, placed and supported over 1,350 young people into volunteering opportunities, youth led activities and action in their communities.

If these 1350 volunteers, gave 4 hours of their time to volunteer per week for 12 weeks this equals 259,200 young people hours given freely to the community. If we equate this to a monetary value of using the basic minimum wage, young people gave £1,537,056 in monetary value if this time was paid.

Future youth volunteers will be able to access the vinspired website (the volunteer portal for young people) to look for local volunteer opportunities. Or go to their local Volunteer Centres for 1-2-1 support. However with Volunteer Centre resources already overstretched struggling with high volumes of referrals from the Job Centres it is uncertain what support to people wanting to volunteer will continue in years to come.

Basingstoke Voluntary Services are committed to continuing our youth support work therefore we will be continuing a number of the activities developed and delivered by the BVS Youth in Action Team using our reserves, however with limited funding and a limited staff it is unknown how long this work will continue.
