

A View from the Fire Station

These fires are occurring mostly during the Friday and Saturday evenings and night time involving refuse left out for collections, road side bins and grass / woodland areas.

These fires are not being caused accidently and whilst all are thankfully still small when the fire service arrive, all big fires start from small ones. The danger to public and property is obvious and it is disappointing that as we begin to enjoy the start of our better weather and what will hopefully be a long warm summer, there is this increased risk to us all caused by a few people setting deliberate fires.

The fire service work closely with our partner organisations, including the police, and will support any prosecution of persons found starting fires. We only have to look at the local and national news to see the devastation caused by fires in woodlands that have occurred just over the county border in Berkshire and to see the consequences of fire. The fire stations the north of the county, including Basingstoke, have been sent to support our colleagues in Berkshire to tackle the woodland fire they have faced. We do not want it to happen here.

North Popley Accessibility Improvements scheme

SOUTH EAST WATER HELPS DANCE BOGUS CALLERS AWAY

A combination of tea, tips on home safety and twinkle-toed pensioners has helped South East Water deliver a crucial message about bogus callers.

South East Water, supported by Hampshire Police, hosted a free tea dance yesterday (19 May 2011) for senior residents from Basingstoke to raise awareness of 'bogus callers' who pretend to be from the water board.

The dance was held at Carnival Hall and featured lots of advice and tips from South East Water, Hampshire County Council Trading Standards, the Gas Safe Register and local Police Community Support Officers on how customers can keep themselves safe in their own homes.

The event comes as South East Water undertakes a programme of work starting in Basingstoke in July 2011 to install customer water meters across parts of Sussex, Hampshire, Kent, Berkshire and Surrey to secure water resources for customers in the region.

Customer safety is a priority for South East Water, which is working closely with Hampshire Police to help customers protect themselves against bogus callers whilst meters are being installed in the area.

Steve George, South East Water Customer Services Director, said: "We are delighted with the turn out for our tea dance. We were keen to find a fun way of communicating the important message about bogus caller safety to vulnerable members of society and we were encouraged by the response we received from the community. A good time was had by all."

In most cases, the installation of a new meter will not involve South East Water staff or contractors needing to enter people's homes as most new meters are installed in the ground just outside the property. However, on some occasions this may be necessary and South East Water staff will always try and make an appointment in advance.

Detective Sergeant Chris Daw of Hampshire Constabulary, said: "If you are in any doubt when someone calls at your home claiming to be from South East Water, you should ask for their identification card.

"South East Water staff, as well as contractors working for the company, are fully aware of this procedure and are happy to wait while customers check their identification.

"You can also call Hampshire Police on 101 to report any suspicious activity of individuals claiming to be from South East Water, but who are not presenting the required ID or have not abided by the procedure to wait whilst their identification is checked."

Anyone with concerns that someone isn't genuinely working for the water company can also call South East Water's metering helpline on 0333 000 0003 to ask for confirmation.

New residents are receiving Travel Plan welcome packs and the first travel surveys will take place in June to find out residents' local travel views. Councillors Page: Eight Traveller vans moved onto Merton Rise on the 8th, I contacted both councils and a welfare visit was conducted on the 9th. Five vans appeared to leave, leaving three, but within two days there were 22. I went to Winchester and saw the Leader of the Council to ask for urgent action. By the 17th there were two illegal camps. One camp of 22 by the hospital and 12 Romany in front of Everest College. There were many calls to 101 over these days by myself and residents and I constantly contacted the councils. I was adamant that we were not going to have the many months of Travellers on these sites like last year. Visits were made by Gypsy/Traveller Liaison Officers and police on a daily basis. Section 61 to move them quickly could and should have been used after the many calls of fearful residents and an incident in the local Fastfare shop.

On the 20th a summons was ready to be served but the encampment of 22 had gone in the night before. The 12 remaining were served with the notice and a court date on the 24th with enforcement by bailiffs if they didn't move on. I have been assured that even more sturdy defences against incursions will be introduced but I remain sceptical. Please phone 101 as soon as you see even one van anywhere in Popley. If you see any anti-social behaviour or suspect crime, phone 101 and please contact any of your local Councillors as well.

Summary of the Chairman's Report to the May 2011 SSJ Parish Council AGM

Last year we reflected that SSJ Parish comprised 1,100 dwellings – split roughly 50/50 between SSJ Village and the newer areas of Speckled Wood Road, Merton Rise and Marnel Park. One year on, that number has increased to 1,250; the newer areas are now in the majority!

The Regional Planning Strategy, the review of the BDBC Strategic Housing Land Availability Assessment (SHLAA), the BDBC New Homes Consultation late in 2010 and finally the proposal for further houses at Marnel Park (Phase 2) mean that planning and the threat of further building is never far from the Parish Council's considerations. The preliminary proposals for further building at Marnel Park - referred to as BAS104 in the SHLAA - prompted two well-attended open meetings with a strong majority against development; especially as the current building at Merton Rise is still a long way from complete. Everyone is urged to write to BDBC and make their opposition known (details can be found on the PC website).

In the Village, we have also been in correspondence with Carter Jonas (for the owner) and BDBC regarding the options for the allotments in Dark Lane. A proposal for three houses plus open land and allotments has been put forward – and rejected by BDBC. The final outcome is not yet clear.

In anticipation of development of the Park Prewett Golf Course with 750 houses – reportedly one of the first build now/ pay later schemes for government-owned land - we have been successful in obtaining a TPO for the tree belt along the A340. The development will inevitably add to the traffic congestion in the area and the dangers of using the A340 - especially in West End. With this very much in mind, the PC purchased a second SID during the year – so that one of the units alternates between the northbound and southbound A340. The A340 / Elm Rd junction at Elm Bottom remains a major concern - we are still trying to persuade HCC to take more positive measures, without destroying the rural nature of SSJ.

Do please complete and return the Public Transport Survey that was sent to you this month.

We note that ECC has applied for Academy Status - the Parish Council is very concerned about the poor recent academic results; we should remember that improved academic achievement was one of the driving arguments for the Merton Rise / Marnel Park development in the first place. This has not yet been delivered.

The SSJ Football Club has been extremely successful again this year - well done to the Mens' and Boys' teams. There have been parking problems on match days – not acceptable and very annoying for residents in Vyne Rd. We hope that the plan which has now been put into action will deliver better results.

The Chute Teenage Ball Play Area was completed recently - with grants from BDBC, the LEADER Fund, and HAT's (Hampshire Action Teams) Initial reaction has been really positive - I must specifically thank Clover Morgan for her hard work in that respect – although we are monitoring a possible weed problem.

Church Path Repairs are planned for the summer – so we can get rid of the unsightly temporary barriers. We are very pleased to record that the PC collected further funding via the Precept to allow for two donations to the Village Hall mortgage fund. The Parish Council continues with its modest support of the Village

The Parish Council has met with the newly-formed Marnel and Merton Community Group and stands ready to assist where possible. After the AGM, we will be hearing from Paul Chatterton about the BDBC Governance process to consider whether there should be a change in the Parish Council boundaries - specifically whether SSJ Village and Marnel Park / Merton Rise should spilt, or continue together. This is a matter for all electors to exercise their democratic rights.

During the year, Mrs Becky Jones resigned as a Cllr after 6 years on the Parish Council – I would like to thank her (again) for her dedicated and forceful service. Becky's resignation left a vacancy on the Council, so we were delighted that Mr Syd Abraham applied to join us, and he was duly co-opted.

Thanks, as always, go to my fellow Cllrs, Mrs Clover Morgan the Parish Clerk, the Village Hall Management Committee led by Mrs Sue Burlingham, the Chute Pavilion Management Committee - John Edwards and Judith Darmady, Shelley Moore and the other volunteers who run the Seniors' Coffee Morning, Mrs Shelagh Cooper - our litter picker, Mike Barham the Caretaker for both VH and Chute Pavilion, BDBC Cllrs - Jane Frankum and John Leek and our HCC Cllr Keith Chapman. We are delighted to see WPC Edwards (Mims) 'back on the beat' – thanks to PCSO Geoff Fermor-Dunman for looking after us again.

The Officers for 2011/12 remain unchanged - please continue to show your support for the Parish Council. Julian Crawley, Chairman

DIARIES FROM THE OLD CODGER.

June, count down to Christmas! How the years fly by, as we grow older we can't turn back time but we can keep doing what we can whilst we are still fit and able. I am lucky in some ways as I have Her Indoors that keeps pushing me on. Saying that, I have to make sure she is not behind me at the top of the stairs. I keep coming up with ideas for the community and the town and yes a few have come to fruition and some have not got off the drawing board. The main thing is not to

give up trying or you just grow old and useless and the brain box gives in. When as a youngster I, along with my granddad, dad and my uncle, would often be seen down

Petticoat Lane selling pigeons and finches that granddad bred. He had hundreds of finches so he made a good few bob from them, at a shilling a time, or five pence in "new " money. Pigeons were half a crown depending on the colour of them. The best bit about that was people would take them home and after a week let them out. Of course straight back home they came and then down the lane to sell again; boy anything to make a living. People think chicken eggs for breakfast but two or three pigeon eggs were wonderful so another source of food for us. None of my sisters or brother would eat them so that was more for me. They were great days. My childhood is full of memories, like long distance pigeon racing. \some races were 400 miles and you could only time your pigeon up to 9pm at night. If they did not get home by then, at 4am in the morning we would be seen sitting on the platform of the pigeon loft waiting for the birds to arrive. They eventually did so. Mum would be up as well. I was the tea boy and mum would make tea and bacon sandwiches. I would have to go down to the house to get them. Our back garden was very long and it was on a steep hill so you can imagine a young lad with 4 cups of tea and a pile of bacon sandwiches on a tray taking them back up to them? You had tea soaked sandwiches and half the tea swimming in the tray. After the war we lived in the country, near to Kenley Aerodrome in Surrey. They made the film Reach for the Sky up there. I can remember my brother and I going up to see them do some of the filming. By the aerodrome was a very large tree. As far back as I could remember it never had a leaf on it and you could see it right across the valley. This was the direction we would scan our eyes. If one of our pigeons came home from over that tree we knew it was a winner most of the time. Also on another note about my younger years, as we sat in the early morning sun granddad said to me "Always remember son, the childhood you have now, your adulthood is built on this." At the time I did not quite get it but still granddad was always right so I did not say anything. It was not until my adulthood I remembered those words, and how true they were. The way your life starts out you should build on the strengths of that and take this through your life,. No obstacle is too great and you can give love and help when people need you the most, even if it is only an ear.

Again on saying that I, as you know have Her Indoors. Over the years I have become quite deaf I now wear two hearing aids. Not very good to look at but when she gets going I can just turn them off and just nod now and then. Boy it gets her going... Well I hope you all enjoyed the Popley Festival again this year. I know I will be around as usual health and weather permitting. Until next month

Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment (WEEE)

Basingstoke and Deane Borough Council's fourth trial waste electrical and electronic equipment (WEEE) collection will start in June and residents are being encouraged to put out all their unused, broken or redundant electrical equipment and batteries for collection.

So far the trial has resulted in more than 160 tonnes of residents' electrical items being recycled instead of being sent to the incinerator as waste.

In addition, some changes have been made to these collections following feedback from residents and the collection company and it is hoped that the new changes will make the system more simple and efficient.

Previously, households included in the trial would receive a leaflet with a collection date on it. Now those residents who would like WEEE collected will need to request a collection, either through the council website or by telephoning Midex on 0800 731 6646. They will then be given a collection date and instructions on where to leave their WEEE items.

Cabinet Member for the Environment and Climate Change Cllr Elaine Still said: "The WEEE collections are a simple and convenient way to recycle all of the broken or unwanted electrical items residents have in their homes. It is really encouraging to see how many residents have got involved with the trial so far and I would encourage even more people to get on board to save these items from going to waste."

WEEE is any redundant or waste electrical items, with a plug or which used batteries, and includes your small domestic

batteries.

Three Peaks Challenge

My name is Tony Hart and I have lived in Popley for several years. In March 2009, my wife, Gemma, gave birth to identical twin boys, Noah and Freddie, who were born seven weeks premature. They both spent a month in the Special Care Baby Unit in Basingstoke Hospital. When the boys came, home, they were healthy happy individuals. In November 2009 we went for a day out to the Sea Life Centre in Portsmouth, only to find that one of our boys wasn't breathing properly. That night he was taken into the High Dependency Unit and two days later, his twin brother followed. Both boys had caught bronchiolitis, Respiratory Syncytial Virus, (RSV) and adenovirus. The boys spent three months in hospital that winter. Sometimes they got home for 24/48 hours and occasionally they made it home for a week before becoming ill again. Both boys needed help with their breathing, whether it was oxygen head boxes or more seriously when they were put on breathing machines called CPAP.

We finally came home in the February with lots of long term medication and managed to stay pretty healthy over the summer except for a few little trips to hospital for respiratory problems. Then in the September, we found Noah having a seizure, something we hadn't expected and we were very new to it. Noah was back in hospital for several days for monitoring but then was again, fit and healthy. We managed to go on a winter holiday with the boys but within 2 weeks of returning home the hospital trips started again. Noah had more seizures and then they both had more respiratory problems. We have been in hospital this winter, every month since September. Noah has been on a ventilator in Southampton's Intensive Care Unit and Freddie has been on CPAP machines in Basingstoke's High Dependency Unit. For eight days we travelled to and from the two hospitals splitting our time between them.

The boys have had many tests done and we now know they have a condition called Broncomalcia. They are also treated for asthma, chronic constipation, seizures, (which we are still awaiting the MRI) and both are on a high calorie diet due to them having lost a lot of weight during their months of illness. We also have a Broncoscopy booked in for Freddie next week and are awaiting a date for CT scans for both boys. They are developmentally delayed and receive a lot of physiotherapy from a great team of people and are currently being referred to another team called Portage to help with all over development.

Throughout their short lives so far we have been up and down at Basingstoke Hospital for over twenty admissions. We have used an awful lot

of resources and continue to still need them. We have met many consultants, doctors and nurses and we now have a great team of people who look after the boys including the community nurses who come out to the house when the boys are poorly plus the physiotherapists and everyone else who helps us. We have made friends with a lot of the staff and without their help and support, myself and my wife would have felt the last two years to have been a great strain. We can't thank them enough for what they have done, for the excellent service and support that we have received throughout.

With all this in mind, I'm completing the Three Peaks Challenge with my brother, Matt, friend, Dan and my father, Chris. We aim to complete the Three Peaks within 24 hours including the travel time, climbing the highest peaks in Scotland, England and Wales in July 2011. We aim to raise money and awareness for the Children's Ward, G2 at Basingstoke Hospital for everything that they have done for me and my family.

The boys will hopefully have a good summer this year and it will give them time to grow and become stronger. We see our team regulary and are in close contact with Basingstoke Hospital. The boys take a lot of regular medication and will continue to do so for some time, we hope that the next winter will be a little kinder to the boys and their health issues. When Noah and Freddie are well, they are happy little boys with lots of personality.
