

The boys were born in March 2009 and since then, have suffered many respiratory health problems and have been diagnosed with a condition called bronchomalcia. Due to this, and a few other health problems, they have spent many months in and out of the hospital in the last two years.

I originally came up with the idea of raising money for the Children's Ward as a way of saying thank you to the staff for all that they have done for my children, Noah and Freddie, myself and my wife, Gemma. I wanted it to be a challenge that would be difficult and require hard work and determination. When I talked about it to my family and friends, their reaction was great and at that point, my brother, friend and Dad offered to help join in the worthy cause.

We started our ascent at Ben Nevis at 5.30pm. The skies were clear and we were ready for our challenge to commence. This mountain was the biggest of the three and towards the start it was a tough, steep incline where it dawned upon us what lay ahead for the next 24 hours. It took us 4 hours 15 minutes, which was a great achievement. We soon got back on the road after a quick hot drink and dinner that my father had already prepared and a change of clothes.

We arrived at Scafell Pike at 4am after a long drive due to a couple of road closures. We quickly jumped out and got going. Surprisingly for the time of the day, there were lots of other people starting their walks. This mountain was relentlessly steep and rocky and took us 3 hours 15 minutes to complete. By now, we were starting to feel the tiredness kicking in but we were thrilled to be ahead of schedule.

After sorting out a few minor Sat Nav problems, we arrived at Snowdon at midday. Again, we were changed and ready to jump out of the car as soon as we arrived. At this stage our legs and knees were feeling it but we knew we had time on our side and just carried on with one foot in front of the other. It took us 4 hours to complete and our final time for the whole challenge was 22 hours and 28 minutes. At the final mark we had a glass of champagne waiting for us which was well deserved.

We all agreed that it was one of the best experiences of our lives, it was full of adrenalin, it was tough but it was well worth it, however, we never want to see another mountain again!

So far we have raised approx £2,650 which will go directly to the ward which beat our original target of £2,000. My Visits to Minsk

Minsk is the capital of Belarus, which is the most westerly republic of the former Soviet Union.

Belarus is bordered by Poland to the west, Lithuania to the north, the Ukraine to the south and Russia to the east and north east.

After the collapse of the Soviet Union in 1991, Belarus became an independent republic.

Russia is still widely spoken with Belarusian being encouraged and is now the official language. Most of the students I meet speak both languages.

My first visit to Minsk was in 1995 due to my interest in the history of the Second World War in general and the Russian campaign in particular. The Second World War is known as the 'Great Patriotic War' in all the countries of the former Soviet Union.

This war is deeply ingrained in the culture of Belarus. This is hardly surprising when you consider that one in four of the population of Belarus was killed, or died, during the Nazi occupation from late July 1941 to July 1944.

I now stay with Sergei, who speaks excellent English and his family. With Sergei's help I now travel around Minsk by trolley bus and Metro (their underground).

The Linguistic University invites me to meet teachers and students of English, make recordings of everything from Shakespearian sonnets to single words (this is for the sound of words), help post-graduate students with their projects and edit the latest textbook the Professor of English is constantly updating!

The Pedagogical University invites me to meet the teachers and students and I have also made recordings for this university in the past.

The Belarusian State University is another university I'm invited to again meet the teachers and students.

More recently, I also now visit Radio Belarus to participate in English language broadcasts and assist in English language broadcasts and assist in their translations from Russian into English.

People in Minsk speak English! I become involved in heated discussions

with taxi drivers over which football team is better, Manchester United or Liverpool!

I'm currently preparing for my next trip in the middle of October!

All vehicles kept off-road must be insured

New rules mean it's now an offence to keep a vehicle off a public road without insurance. This applies even if your vehicle is parked in your driveway, garage or kept away from your home address.

From the end of June 2011, if your vehicle appears to be uninsured, you will receive a letter telling you that you are uninsured. The letter will ask you either to insure your vehicle or check your insurance company has correctly entered your insurance policy details on the Motor Insurers' Bureau database (MID). If you fail to insure your vehicle within a specified time, you face:

a fixed penalty fine of £100, reduced to £50.00 if you pay early, having your vehicle clamped, seized and destroyed or being taken to court.

The new rules apply to most vehicles. However, you won't have to insure your vehicle if:

- you have a valid Statutory Off Road Notice (SORN) or
- your vehicle has been kept off a public road since before 1 February 1998 or
- your vehicle has been scrapped, stolen or exported and you have notified the relevant authorities
- your vehicle is in between keepers
- your vehicle is held in stock by an authorised motor dealer.

Councillors Page: As your County Councillor I have the chance to help our local clubs and groups with small grants. The application forms are on the Hampshire County Council site www.hants.gov.uk or you can obtain them from me.

Some of the grants I was able to enact were for the Get With programme at Everest Community College. Marnel Football Club also had a grant to professionally train three coaches. I also gave a grant to Melrose Hall for new tables. Amongst other grants.

The Boys Brigade needed a replacement Cook Tent for when they go on camps, and Everest Health and Fitness got a grant to set up a GP referral unit to help people achieve better health. Another good news story is that the formal 30mph traffic order is in place, just in time for the school summer holidays. Both Popley Way and Carpenters Down badly needed to see traffic slow down.

It never ceases to amaze me that people drive so fast on estate roads and that they would rather rush through estate roads than uses the Ring Road especially after spending so much money on improving it to make it quicker to use it.

Popley West: August is traditionally a "quiet" month in the Council's calendar but as usual we seem to get more planning applications around that time. Guess they hope that they can be rushed through. But ever watchful we have picked up the 450 in Kiln Farm fields and a conversion from a family home to two conversions in Selby Walk flats in Selby Walk. The last two were refused and one appealed and the inspector accepted our submission. The residents around that area are totally against for several reasons including parking. We are concerned that the flats are taking away another family home when we have so many families desperate for their own home. We have raised our objections so lets hope that the officer recommends refusal as we will fight this application. We have yet to hand in the petition against the 450 more houses crammed by the side of Jersey and Guernsey Closes as they have withdrawn the meeting that was to be held to discuss this and other housing numbers. Watch this space!

Popley East: This month I made my maiden speech in the council chamber. I used this opportunity to present a petition to the Council on behalf of residents in Lawrence Close calling for more car parking spaces. Currently there are 46 properties in Lawrence Close but only 26 car park spaces. Residents have informed me that they frequently have nowhere to park and the situation has sometimes led to neighbourly disputes. From my time spent on the doorstep over the election, I know that lack of parking spaces is an issue right across the ward and this is something that I intend to take up. However, the Tory-led council has recently cut £84,000 from the Parking and Access Scheme budget, which pays for parking improvement schemes such as those needed in

In other news, it is my understanding that David Wilson Homes wish to formally put in their planning application to the council to build 450 homes on the land at Kiln Farm next to Jersey and Guernsey Closes in September. Along with many local residents, I am opposed to these plans. I am not against development but Popley has had more than its fair share in recent years and it is time to say enough is enough. A reminder that if you want to object to these plans, please write to Giorgio Frammalicco, Head of Planning at the Council to stop the land at Kiln Farm, known as BAS104, from being allocated for development.

Phillips' Legal Corner



Question: What are you risking if you and your partner choose to live together?

Answer:

'If you and your partner choose to live together it is important to know that you are potentially at risk if you don't make some arrangements over your shared property and assets,' warns Rob Parker, one of the family solicitors at Phillips 'because you have almost no rights compared to those who are married or in a civil partnership.'

Increasing numbers of couples are moving in together and believe they have 'common law' rights but at the moment the law does not recognise such rights and you do not have an automatic entitlement to maintenance, pension or claims on property if you split up. Worse still, if you stay together and your partner dies, the estate may not automatically pass to you and, unless there is a will, you may find yourself treated the same as a housemate or friend, however long you've been together.

However this may be about to change: judges at the Supreme Court are deliberating a case, Kernott v Jones, of an unmarried couple who separated years ago and one has made a claim for a larger share of the jointly-owned property. The outcome of the Supreme Court's decision will have great significance for separating couples as well as for unmarried couples setting up home together, including those who are looking to buy a house together and want to own it in different shares, or for someone who already owns a house and is arranging for a partner to move in.

'It's a minefield,' says Rob, 'trying to advise clients about what potential claim a former partner does or does not have against a house which was jointly owned or in one person's sole name, in the absence of any formal document recording their intentions.'

'The question in the mean time,' concludes Rob 'is how best to protect yourself. So if you don't want to be left out in the cold if you separate or your partner dies, then my advice is think about the practical consequences, seek legal advice and depending on your circumstances take out a cohabitation or separation agreement, or a declaration of trust and a will.'

Open Forum.

Cllr Cooke (with the agreement of Janet Page) presented the reasons why the post office and shop were advertised for sale. In essence her business is becoming less profitable. Janet and her family have therefore been forced to extend their hours to substitute for paid employees in order to maintain sufficient profits to service the mortgage. As a result it is hard to balance very long hours with family life and commitments. Janet is reluctant to sell and leave the village but feels she has no choice. Ideally Janet would like to remain as postmistress in Sherborne St John if the business can be made more profitable and her and her family's hours can be reduced.

An in depth discussion took place on the future of the Village Shop/Post Office. It is very obvious that all the people attending did not want the village to be without the facility. Cllr Cooke proposed that a "Friends of the SSJ PO" sub-committee be formed from experienced village volunteers. It's mandate to identify tactical changes to improve profitability, to develop longer term plans and to liaise with Janet.

Lych Gate for the Cemetery.

As a grant from BDBC of 50% of the cost has been offered, council voted to proceed with the project.

Marnel Park/Merton Rise.

Cllrs Agnew, Abraham and Eales attended a meeting chaired by Curtin & Co for the developer, David Wilson Homes.

Curtin & Co were aware that a significant majority of people were not in favour of more development in this area. They asked for ideas to make the development more acceptable. Suggestions were made for community centres, efficient transport facilities and links as well as the types of houses.

Travellers.

Long discussion took place regarding the danger of traveller's occupying sites in the village. It was felt that we were not a good target for them and whatever locks and obstacles are placed, they would be broken and moved to gain access.



Crime Prevention Advice Thefts from vehicles

We would like to make you aware that there have recently been incidents of thefts from vehicles in your area.

Our aim is not to scare you, but to raise your awareness, and to ask you to be extra vigilant. Your vehicle is a shop window to a thief; it only takes a few seconds to steal property, even if an alarm is fitted.

Please help us to help you by ensuring your vehicle is secured and any item of value is removed when you are not present. The vast majority of these thefts are opportunist; offenders who take advantage of vulnerable vehicles – those that are left insecure or that have items on display.

To reduce the risk of being a victim of car crime, motorists are urged to take the following simple precautions:

- Make sure the doors of your vehicle are locked and the windows and sunroof shut, no matter how hot the weather.
- If possible, park your vehicle in a well used area, and if you have a garage try to use it. Make sure it is parked in a location where it is in clear view of other members of the public, not obscured from sight and therefore more vulnerable.
- Wherever possible, do not leave anything in your vehicle, including in the boot.
- Make sure you do not leave a jacket or coat behind when you leave the vehicle. It may be of very
 little value to you, but a thief may think it has been used to hide a laptop or handbag and break
 into your car to find out.
- If you have a removable music system, take it with you don't forget to take your CDs as well.
- Make sure you do not leave documents in your vehicle which have your address on.
- If you have a satellite navigation system, take it with you don't forget to remove the cradle and
 wipe the suction marks from your windscreen. Do not store your home address on your device
 if you do, save it under a different location.

Popley Safer Neighbourhoods Team

Hello to all our Popley Residents, we hope this message finds you well. We would just like to take this opportunity to give you a brief update on what is occurring in and around Popley and the work your local Safer Neighbourhoods Team are doing to keep Popley safe.

The new Community priorities for Popley are:-

Drug dealing: Abbey road and adjoining areas.

This was voted a core priority by members of the Popley Safer Neighbourhoods Panel due to the ongoing concern from residents about drug use in these areas. The Popley Safer Neighbourhoods Team have conducted a number of stop searches and arrests relating to drug use and supply in and around the Abbey Road area. The Popley Safer Neighbourhoods Team will continue to patrol the area but we are requesting any residents who have any information relating to drug related activity in the area contact us with this information.

Anti-Social Behaviour: Priestley Road.

This was voted a core priority by members of the Popley Safer Neighbourhoods Panel due to an increase in reports of Anti-Social Behaviour on Priestley Road. The reports include Anti-Social Behaviour at the flats and apartments on Priestley Road where residents are reporting varied accounts of neighbour disputes. We would like to remind all of our residents to be courteous and respectful to neighbouring properties and their residents. The Popley Safer Neighbourhoods Team are working with the various housing companies to solve long term neighbour disputes. The Popley Safer Neighbourhoods Team have also seen an increase in cycle thefts and attempted cycle thefts. If you own a bicycle and reside in the flats or apartments please ensure they are securely locked and stored in the bike sheds provided.

Anti-Social Behaviour: School sites

This was voted a core priority by members of the Popley Safer Neighbourhoods

Panel due to the potential for Anti-Social Behaviour on School sites over the summer holiday period. Historically schools in Popley have suffered thousands of pounds worth of damage caused by youths loitering, playing and climbing on school property. Please can all parents ensure that their children do not go on school sites and buildings without permission in order to prevent their children being a possible suspect to any damage which may be caused. Entering school sites without permission is Civil Trespass and, as such ,Hampshire Constabulary and the Popley Safer Neighbourhoods Team will support the schools with any potential prosecution. If any youths are found on school sites without permission their details will be taken and a Trespass Warning letter will be issued. If a youth is found on more than one occasion on school sites, the Popley Safer Neighbourhoods Team will work with our partner agencies to consider an Acceptable Behaviour Contract agreement on this person.

The Popley Safer Neighbourhoods Team would like to make residents aware of the following occurrences.

*Theft of lead from the roofs of garages - Islands

*Garage break ins - Timor Close, Malta Close

Please ensure that you keep an eye out for yours and your neighbours sheds and garages. If you own or rent a garage please ensure that no valuable belongings are left in the garages. Please try to ensure that you do not advertise bicycles or motorcycles as this may encourage breaks-ins the area.


