



Popley Safer Neighbourhoods Team: Community update:

To all our residents, we hope that you have enjoyed your summer, and that you managed to get a well earned break. Anti-Social Behaviour over the summer holidays was lower than in previous years, with less reported incidents than 2009 - 2010. We would like to thank those of you who have reported incidents of ASB to us. This has helped the Safer Neighbourhoods Team to work alongside our partner agencies to prevent further ASB occurring. A way in which we have been dealing with reported ASB is to place those responsible on Acceptable Behaviour Contracts (ABCs). Those placed on the contract have conditions they must follow, such as areas they cannot go to, and Curfews. The Popley Safer Neighbourhoods Team have also issued £80 Fixed Penalty Notices to those committing ASB. Please continue to report ASB to the 101 number.

Over the summer we saw a slight increase in bicycle thefts, particularly in the Poets, and new estate areas of Popley East. We would like to take this opportunity to advise all of our residents who own bicycles to please follow the steps below.

- * Please ensure your bicycle is locked and secured at all times when not in use. Even if your bicycle is in a designated bike storage shed, it is essential it is still locked.
- * Make a note of your frame number. This is usually located on the underside of the bike and will make it easier for Police to recover.
- * Take a photo of your bicycle, so that, if it is stolen, we have a clear description of what we are looking for.

Several arrests have been made throughout Popley in relation to drug activity. The arrests have occurred in Abbey Road, and Priestley Road which are both current PSNP (Popley Safer Neighbourhoods Panel) core priorities. If you are interested in joining, or you would like more information about the work of the PSNP, please contact PC Dan Carter on the details below.

With Halloween fast approaching, and Bonfire Night, we would like to remind all of our residents to stay safe and be considerate towards other members of your community. If you have children who are considering "Trick or Treating" over the Halloween period, please be considerate towards residents, especially those displaying "No Trick or Treat" signs. The Popley Safer Neighbourhoods Team are committed to ensuring ASB stays low, especially over this period, and we are appealing to residents to assist us in monitoring their children. With regards to fireworks, please remember that in no circumstances should fireworks be let off in a public place. Fireworks which can be purchased from the local shops, and should only be used in your garden (facing away from a main road) or a licensed, or approved public showing. SNT have previously issued £80 fines for using fireworks that breach these conditions, so please bear this in mind.

Finally, the Safer Neighbourhoods Team would like to thank residents who attended the Pebbles Children Centre community event. The event was a great success, and you may have seen either PC Dan Carter or PCSO Phil Rapley posing for photos with the children of our community. Everybody had a



Police Support. We have had great support from the Neighbourhood Team who attend the beginning of all Parish Council meetings - to report in, and receive any feedback you want to give them. Thanks Mims and Geoff!

Parish Boundaries. We expect that BDBC will initiate the consultation process with Parish residents very soon. This is a question for all residents to respond to. The Parish Council considers that it is time for the two wards - SSJ Village and Popley Fields - to split (as was successfully achieved with Rooksdown).

Merton Rise and Marnel Park. Most of you will have received the invitation from Curtin and Co (on behalf of David Wilson Homes) to their exhibition in mid September. The Parish Council believes this proposed development is not in the interest of current residents of SSJ Village, Marnel Park, Merton Rise or Popley. We believe that:

- the existing development (Marnel Park and Merton Rise) must be completed before any new greenfield development such as this is considered
- vital community facilities promised for Marnel Park & Merton Rise should be provided without further delay.

New Homes in Basingstoke / SHLAA / Localism Bill. Basingstoke residents have told BDBC that it is time to rein back on house building in the Borough. This applies equally to the Marnel Park development – recent public meetings have shown unanimous opposition to yet more houses. This is clear!

What is not yet clear is which areas are included in BDBC's new Strategic Housing Land Availability Assessment (SHLAA) land bank - although we do know that the Park Prewett golf course <u>is</u> included. According to BDBC's timetable, this will have been decided at the BDBC Cabinet meeting on 27^{th} September. (The draft Core Strategy for the Local Development Framework should follow this in November).

Even less clear is how many homes BDBC will be looking to build in the future. The South East Regional Plan (which may or may not be revoked by HM Government) demanded 920per annum. Current BDBC thinking seems to be in favour of 594pa, but there is no guarantee this figure will be accepted by central government. The National Planning Policy Framework (NPPF) – a section of the controversial Localism Bill – is currently under review by BDBC as part of the Government's consultation process.

You will be aware that The National Trust, CPRE, and Daily Telegraph, alongside other organisations, are all campaigning against the Bill – which seems to me to be ambiguous at best, and argues for a presumption in favour of *sustainable* development (whatever that means!) at worst.

Church Path Repairs. As programmed, these repairs were completed by HCC's Contractor just in time for the end of the School summer holiday. The dangerous path edge has been replaced - a definite improvement.

Bus Services to SSJ Village. Following feedback from the recent Transport Survey and a review of expenditure by HCC, we understand that it is proposed that the No14/15 bus service will be discontinued – but between 9am and 4.30pm the 'Jazz#2' service (which runs along the A340) will divert through the Village via Elm and Cranes Roads. We wait to see if this has any effect on HCC / BDBC views on requirements at Elm Bottom!

Moss Hill Allotments. Following consultation with allotment holders, the Parish Council is proceeding with installation of a new gate at the Sherborne Rd entrance. This will be 50% funded by the Parish Council.

Red Telephone Boxes. Both red telephone boxes in the village are looking very much better – well done and thank you to both sets of volunteers - John Edwards and Mike and Margaret Larby for Elm Road and Mandy Haworth and her team for Spring Close.

Hedges Please can we remind you that it is the homeowner responsibility to cut back any overhanging trees, bushes and hedges that form the boundary of your property, both on your own side and on the highway side so that they do not cause an obstruction. and finally

<u>Kiln Farm Development?</u>

As I write this article, the Planning and Infrastructure Committee are sitting to recommend to the Cabinet in Basingstoke and Deane Council what land should be included for more housing. The fields at the back of Marnel Park alongside Jersey and Guernsey Close are on that proposed list. Residents and your Labour Councillors went and spoke as to why it should not be included. Some of the reasons given were that Popley has already taken the bulk of new housing within the whole borough. There are still 784 to be completed in Merton Rise and this should happen so that we can see how the roads, doctors, shops, and transport copes before possibly choking Popley even more. We also said about how beautiful and tranquil these fields are, and that there are protected and endangered species there, for instance sky larks, slow worms and a sole badger family that were reported as being in the Kiln Farm Area. We spoke of our community and how we need time to settle. This was a view had also been expressed by the previous Inspectors report, not to build to give the community time to settle.

What will happen? I am unsure at present but David Wilson Homes have said they are putting in the planning application before Christmas for 450 more homes. 

Top tips for private tenants

Are you a private tenant living in poor housing conditions? Here are some top tips to help you understand your legal rights and work out what action you might want to take.

- as a tenant, you have the right to have the structure of your home kept in good repair by your landlord. Heating and hot water systems must also be kept in working order. Details about repair responsibilities are usually set out in a written tenancy agreement
- there may be several ways of getting repairs or improvements done if you need them. But
 you should always check what type of agreement you have with your landlord before you
 complain about housing conditions. Your landlord may try to evict you if you ask for repairs
 to be carried out so you need to know how easy it would be for them to do this. If in doubt,
 get advice from an experienced adviser at your local housing aid centre, law centre or
 Citizens Advice Bureau
- the first step to getting repairs done is usually to talk to your landlord. It may be worth trying
 to negotiate with them, even if they do not have a legal duty to carry out a repair. Put your
 request in writing and keep a copy
- if talking to your landlord doesn't work, don't just stop paying your rent. You don't have the
 right to withhold rent and you shouldn't do this to try to force your landlord to do repairs.
 Your landlord could take legal action against you for rent arrears and you could lose your
 home
- if your property is in poor condition, your landlord may have broken the tenancy agreement
 or the law in not carrying out repairs. This means you may be able to take court action
 against them. But it's really important to get advice first, in case your landlord tries to evict
 you. If you do decide you want to take court action, you will need to give your landlord
 written notice of the repairs that need doing and you won't be able to start court action until
 you have given your landlord reasonable time to carry out the repairs
- if you think the condition of the property is either affecting your health or causing a nuisance to others, you should complain to the Environmental Health Department of your local council. They should investigate and they have the power to order your landlord to do the necessary repairs. Local councils also have a duty to take action against a landlord if they consider that housing conditions are not acceptable for people to live in. Popley West: All the team of Labour Councillors for Popley are working to have the Kiln Farm development site removed as a suitable site to build yet another 450 dwellings. Enough is enough with the further 784 due to start in Merton Rise, regeneration of Maldive and Faroe, the old John Hunt site, then proposals for 122 more at The Spinney, and the land in front of the hospital that the last application for was 313 more is sheer madness. The roads are heaving now at peak times before these are even being built. What about doctors, dentists and other services that all these people will require?

If building goes ahead by Jersey and Guernsey Close and at the back of Marnel Park we will lose some amazing wildlife and landscape. The deer are frequent visitors and the now rare sound of the skylarks, a fully protected species, could be lost forever in our area. There were reports of a family of badgers though there used to be more badger families in this area. This is a tranquil area. We are aware that people need homes, but let us complete what has been started and give our community time to settle, see how the infrastructure copes before we even contemplate even more housing in this part of town.

However, this is not the right site and it is time for Popley to say no more, enough is enough. I attended the David Wilson Homes exhibition on the proposals at Popley Fields Community Centre on Friday night and was pleased to see many of you there voicing your objections to the developers. In addition to this if you want to object to these plans please write to Giorgio Frammalicco, Head of Planning at Basingstoke and Deane Borough Council, Civic Offices London Rd, Basingstoke RG21 4AH and ask the Council to stop the land at Kiln Farm, known as BAS104, from being allocated for development.


There is a meeting at the Council on Tuesday 20th September to discuss potential development sites and I will be attending to speak out against allocating the Kiln Farm site for development.

Helping the Homeless: The Camrose Centre Appeals for Volunteers!

Most of us lucky enough to live in the relative affluence of Basingstoke and its surrounds take the basic things in life, like having a roof over our head and enough food to eat, for granted. But not everyone is that lucky. Some of you may be surprised to learn that here in Basingstoke, up to as many as 11 people sleep rough each night. And many more will have to stay in unsatisfactory temporary accommodation such as in a hostel or sleeping on a friend's floor.

Right here on our doorstep there are people who, because of a variety of problems including unemployment, relationship breakdown, mental ill health, addiction or just plain bad luck, find themselves homeless. Let's face it, there but for the grace of God goes any one of us.

The Camrose Centre is the charity that provides practical and emotional support to people who are unlucky enough to find themselves homeless or vulnerably housed.

Our aim is to promote positive fulfilling lifestyles, emotional wellbeing and long-term changes for those experiencing the effects of homelessness. This starts with the basics, including hot meals, clothing, washing facilities and a contact address, and goes on to providing opportunities to make real, positive long-term changes through counselling and learning.

As a result, service users who might otherwise have felt they had no hope of turning their lives around are able to take positive steps towards change as individuals and as part of the wider community. One service user said, "If it wasn't for Camrose I wouldn't have a place to live or a job. I now have a future to look forward to".

The Camrose Centre is a direct access day service in Basingstoke that is available without judgement to anyone who asks for help.

The Camrose Centre works closely alongside other local organisations and services to provide help and support to people in Hampshire who are homeless and vulnerably housed.

Employers and employees need to get set for the Olympics 2012

'Hosting the 2012 Olympic Games is a fantastic opportunity for the UK and if you are lucky enough to have tickets for one or more events, you should be planning now to talk to your employer about taking leave or arranging flexible hours so that you don't miss out' says Gill Brown, head of the employment law team at Phillips.

'Look at it from the other side and you can imagine the significant impact that 17 sporting days could have on business productivity.

ACAS has already issued guidelines to help employers prepare for this major sporting event and minimise absenteeism, so if you need time off or flexibility of hours, speak to your employer in good time so that your expectations can be considered.

If you have a business and employ people, you need to start planning now to avoid problems later on, check policies and procedures and remind staff how these work in practice.

Here are some recommendations:

Communication – start talking early to employees about managing leave and working hours: include those lucky enough to have tickets, those who have volunteered to help and those who have no interest whatsoever.

Fairness – respond fairly to requests for time off. Encourage those with tickets to book holidays as soon as they know the dates. Remember that some members of staff may get fed up with the fuss and won't want to see any favouritism shown to those with sporting interests.

Flexibility - consider whether you can alter starting and finishing times, allow lunch breaks to be taken at different times or increase breaks so that staff can take time to watch key events during the working day.

Clarity – ensure your expectations are crystal clear. Spell out what you expect from your employees' attendance, performance and flexibility; give transparent reasons for any temporary changes in working practices; and remember that Olympic volunteers will have rights too.

'Proper planning' concludes Gill 'can minimise problems of absenteeism and productivity and maximise enjoyment of one of the greatest sporting events the UK has ever hosted.'





Bonfire/Firework Safety.

REMEMBER:

- Fireworks are explosives.
- Always buy fireworks that comply with the British Standard.
- Follow all instructions and always put safety first.

ALWAYS:

- Light sparklers one at a time and wear gloves.
- Dispose of sparklers in a bucket of water as soon as they are finished.
- Never give sparklers to a child under five.
- Ensure that all children with fireworks are well supervised.
- Keep fireworks in a closed box or tin.
- Use them one at a time, replacing the lid immediately.
- Follow the instructions on each firework, using a torch never use a naked flame.
- Light fireworks at arm's length using a taper or a firework lighter.
- Do not drink alcohol if setting off fireworks.
- Stand well back.

NEVER:

Never go back to a lit firework, it could explode in your face. Never put fireworks in your pocket.

Never throw fireworks.

BONFIRE TIPS:

Never use/pour petrol or other flammable liquids onto a fire to get it going.

Always start and keep bonfires away from buildings, sheds and fences etc.

Check the bonfire for animals/pets that may be hiding within it before lighting it.

Be aware of neighbouring/nearby thatch properties.

Junction 6 Youth Centre moved from the old John Hunt Site to a new building 4 years ago. It has been a thriving youth centre on Popley for more than 16 years. Most people in Popley will at least know someone who has been here if they haven't actually used it themselves! I have managed the project for 11 years during which time I have worked with hundreds of local young people on tens of exciting and challenging projects as well as regular youth club nights where young people have built up some trusting and constructive brilliant relationships with their youth workers over time.

In these difficult times when all Councils see their budgets decreasing and pressure is put on to make significant cuts to services, Hampshire County Council will no longer be directly providing young people with youth centre services. As a consequence, Junction 6 in its current form, will be coming to an end in October this year. The new Youth Support Service is currently working to secure provision in the future with the voluntary sector and local partnerships. It is anticipated that a new youth project will run from the current building next to Everest Community Academy site in the near future.

In the meantime, the current Junction 6 team, Shirley, Junior Simmone and I will all be moving on from our youth worker jobs. We would like to take the opportunity to thank the young people of Popley for some amazing times at the project and we leave with very fond memories of you all! We don't deny there have been plenty of challenging moments – you know who you are!! – but they have always worked out with the commitment and skill of the staff teams current and past.

Please pass on the message to those who may not read this article that we will be open on Tuesday nights throughout September into October and working on the streets on Wednesdays. We will also be supporting the Monday night youth centre now thriving at Popley Fields Community Centre. It would be great if those who want to could pop by to say goodbye, and stay informed about new developments and how you might be involved.
