



A Walk in The Park

How many of us really take notice of what's around us every day? Interesting buildings, open spaces, parkland and areas of natural beauty. All things we take for granted until they are gone.

Every now and then it's nice to slow down and really see things again. Buildings and architecture that remind us of bygone times. Childhood haunts, and the memories of laughter and friends.

One of my favourite childhood haunts was Chineham Park. My sister, cousins and myself had hours of fun playing in the park, marvelling at the natural spring, dry as a bone most summers and a frozen pond in the winter. Exploring the overgrown garden at the back of the Chineham House and imagining who would have lived in this lovely large house. We all agreed it must have been a rich eccentric, who had allowed their vast garden to become a park for the people nearby to use.

I later found out that Chineham House was once the home of Colonel Eastwood, who was Commandant of the Royal Military Academy, Sandhurst in 1930s. He was Given the Grand Cross, Ordre de Mérite Civil et Militaire d'Adolphe de Nassau, Luxembourg 25th July 1944. For conspicuous gallantry and ability during operations on 6th - 7th August, 1915, in the Gallipoli Peninsula. He guided the night advance of his brigade with skill and resource, especially when the head of the column came under the enemy's fire. Owing to the severity of the opposition the advance came gradually to a standstill, and at this point Captain Eastwood rendered very valuable service in reorganising the 1 column, thus enabling it to continue the advance.

Many years later Chineham House was bought by the council, and various different groups have used it for meetings and events.

One of those groups was the Southern FM Radio group. My dad was and still is, a keen radio ham, and it was through him we were able to have a much anticipated look inside Chineham House. One weekend the group held a radio equipment junk sale. My dad attended and took me and my sister. I remember a large hall, high ceilings and feeling very pleased to be there with my dad. It seemed very big to us, but maybe not quite as grand as we children had imagined in our games in the park and gardens.

A lengthy discussion took place regards the above area. A cabinet meeting of the BDBC will be held on 17th October to determine where future development will take place. Syd Abraham and Carole Stanley are attending in order to lobby the members and speak at the meeting about our dis-satisfaction with the proposal to build a further 450 houses in Marnel Park.

Council feels that there are plenty of other sites that are already in the pipeline and should be used instead, for example completing Merton Rise and Manydown estate.

The Council resolved:

- Lobby BDBC to ensure greenfield sites are not developed until 2020/2021 earliest.
- Set up a Marnel Park development sub-committee.
- Track, attend and speak whenever possible at all relevant planning meetings.
- Explore mutual interests with other Parish Councils.
- Explore and allocate funds to use in retaining a Planning Consultant.

Lych gate for the Cemetery.

Work will only commence after 11th November (Remembrance Day). It is planned to begin the work on 14th November, which should take 3 weeks to complete.

2012 Diamond Jubilee Celebrations.

The Council would welcome ideas from residents as to how they would like to celebrate this occasion. Please let us have your suggestions and ideas.

Chute Pavilion-Solar Panels Proposals.

The Council has received quotations for installing solar panels at the Chute.

Before any decision can be made, further technical information is required and a split in the financial contribution needs to be agreed between SSJPC and the Chute committee.

A final decision will be made at the next PC meeting in October.

How to avoid rogue doorstep traders

Rogue traders knock on people's doors, offering to do work. They often target older people. They may say they've been doing work in your area and have spotted your house needs work doing. This could be to do with your roof, paving, general building work, or offering to do insulation or install burglar alarms. They often end up running off with your money without ever doing the work, doing a very poor job, or doing work that never actually needed doing. Here are some top tips to help you avoid getting involved with a dodgy trader:

- don't ever agree to work or sign anything on the spot take their full details and say
 you'll get back to them
- check their details they should give you their business name and address and not just a
 mobile phone number. Then check these to see if they are real
- ask them for details of other customers they did work for and contact them to check this
 out
- don't get taken in by their sales banter they might claim there is a special offer on only
 for that day or that they'll get sacked if you don't employ them. This kind of talk is likely to
 be a sales pitch and you shouldn't take it seriously
- always get more than one quote before employing someone it's usually best to contact
 other traders your friends or family have recommended
- don't ever make a cash payment upfront a reliable trader won't ask for money before
 doing the job not even if they need materials. If they run a business, they should have
 enough money to cover these costs themselves and only ask for payment once they've
 completed the job, or done a reasonable amount of work
- if you think a trader is trying to con you speak to Consumer Direct on 08454 040506.
 They can report anything suspicious to your local Trading Standards Department
- if the trader becomes aggressive or threatens you, this is criminal behaviour and you should call the police straight away.

Councillors Page: Kiln Farm has been included in the list as suitable for development by the Conservative run council. We did achieve that it should be recommended not be built on till the end of 15 years, but the cabinet (despite some excellent points made by councillors from Popley parish councillors from Sherborne St John and residents), said they could not stop any developer from putting in a planning application, and David Wilson Homes have already indicated that they will put in an application for 450 dwellings. We will fight this as we all believe that they should finish the Merton Rise, Everest Park and the regeneration on Popley Islands first. The patience of the residents is amazing but everyone has their limit and that I truly believe has been reached now.

As I write this report I am still fighting to keep the "Hospital Loop" on the number 5 route due to cease on October 30th. 754 residents signed the petition. I received letters and emails from Popley, Oakridge and some other areas from hospital staff and patients alike who will be badly affected. I also had the copy from the hospital to Stagecoach and Hampshire County Council from the management at Basingstoke Hospital. For some passengers it means a price rise of over 385%!



Disabled Access Guide

A NEW online guide for disabled people will provide information about accessibility at venues across the town and borough.

DisabledGo offers detailed and up-to-date information on more than 500 venues in the area. It has been funded by Basingstoke and Deane Borough Council.

Free to use and without any need for registration, the guide has been produced by Disabled-Go – a national charity which creates personally-surveyed access guides in the UK.

Representatives from the charity visited all the venues to survey them, with help from local residents, including Pamela Heyfron, from Marlborough Gardens in Oakley.

The 69-year-old grandmother suffers from severe arthritis and uses crutches or a mobility scooter to get around.

She said: "We are very lucky in Basingstoke because most places are accessible. But if I am going out anywhere I have to make arrangements and talk to someone about getting into the venue.

"They say you can get in but you arrive and you can't because there are two steps down.

"This guide means people can check for themselves beforehand and trust the information because it has been put together by people with disabilities."

The guide uses 20 symbols that represent important information that disabled people have told the charity would be good to find out at a glance, including whether Braille is available, or if there toilets adapted for wheelchair users.

The Basingstoke and Deane version of the guide was launched at the Civic Offices by Mayor of Basingstoke and Deane, Councillor David Leeks, who uses a wheelchair himself.

He said: "The guide represents a really positive development for disabled people in the borough."

Diaries from The Old Codger

Well, as you can gather, I made it back home from our holiday. So very pleased that we had great weather, except the day my son and Her Indoors went for a walk along St Catherine's Point. She nearly got blown away, the wind was that strong. I should have given my son a bigger bribe! Holidays are great, but to get home and sit in your own armchair with the best cup of tea in the world is heaven.

I have just finished reading a great book on the war years and just after. It surprised me how much crime occurred in the six years of war. It was put it down to absent fathers and children not getting the discipline at home as they would have normally got. It pointed out that due to the war all the children's social i.e. youth clubs, closed down leaving children to wander the streets. How much of this rings bells today. It is a sad fact that many youngsters miss that spirit of the good old fashioned youth clubs. I know when I was a young lad I went to Cubs and Scouts, three different youth clubs and plenty of times I would to go to the pictures. Is it just me or has this country of ours changed so much? If so why? Who do we ask questions about this, and what can be done to bring back youth clubs so boys and girls can go and enjoy a good evening out instead of being on the streets. I read Arthur's column in last month's Popley Matters and how true the words are that he wrote. There are far to many bigwigs, as I call them, getting extremely high wages when the real workers are doing the hands on work that is done by their work force. Yet the workers are paid a pittance in comparison

Sadly this is the same the world over. However we also see the other side. There is so much poverty and so much death. I would say that the time it takes me to write this column another 20 children will have died because of the lack of water, food and medicine.

When I was small I can remember all the hand-me-downs and if my shoes got a hole in them my granddad would fix them with cut up car tyres and bone glue. If I had a hole in the back of my shorts mum would patch them, or darn my socks. I wonder how many mothers know how to darn.

When I look back at my life I ask "Was I one of these children that lived in poverty"? The answer is "yes" but we all worked hard in our family and we all pulled in the same direction. We all had to pull up our socks and dig in for a better life. Yes we made it, but we were a big family and everyone wanted a safe and good life for the next generation to come. We do not want children wandering our streets aimlessly around looking for things to do. However the way our country is going at the moment our children do not stand a chance in life. Unless we get our governments to change their attitude to the young and see that at the moment they are going wrong.

I look at things this way, if a person is down pick them up, if a person has no food, feed them, if someone is in need give him or her the help they need. Have your say about changes to the Blue Badge scheme

The Government is changing the Blue Badge scheme to make it fairer and more consistent. We would like to hear what users of the scheme and carers of people who use the scheme, think of our proposals.

What is the Blue Badge scheme?

The Blue Badge scheme allows people with severe mobility problems to park close to where they need to go. Most badges are valid for three years.

You automatically qualify for a Blue Badge if you:

- o are registered blind under the National Assistance Act 1948;
- o receive the higher rate mobility component of the Disability Living Allowance;
- o receive a war pensioner's mobility supplement; or
- have been awarded a benefit under the Armed Forces Compensation Scheme, under tariffs 1-8.

If none of these apply, you may still qualify for a Blue Badge by having an assessment of your mobility.

What is the Department of Transport changing nationally?

From January 2012:

- All new Blue Badges will be printed and supplied centrally in the UK, rather than by each local authority. This will make them harder to forge or alter and enable the Department for Transport to implement a central database of Blue Badge holders.
- Local authorities will have to pay a production fee for each Blue Badge of £4.60 (excluding VAT). In addition to this, the County Council will continue to pay the administrative cost of assessing applications.
- o The Department for Transport plans to increase the maximum fee that local authorities can charge users for their Blue Badge from £2 to £10. This is the first increase since 1983.

From 2012, local authorities may have to use independent mobility assessments (where they would have previously been carried out by doctors) to decide if someone who does not automatically qualify, should receive a Blue Badge.

As a result of these changes, local authorities will have more powers to tackle fraudulent use of Blue Badges.

How much will it cost to apply for a Blue Badge in Hampshire?

From January 2012, Hampshire County Council is proposing to charge the full £10 for a new or renewed Blue Badge. This one-off fee would cover the three-year period for which the Blue Badge is valid.

This fee would cover the production costs for the badge and contribute to our administration costs. It would also help with improvements to the service, such as mobility assessments and reducing fraudulent use of badges.

Around 70,000 people have blue badges in Hampshire and each year the County Council issues around 25,000 for a charge of £2. Each badge currently costs Hampshire County Council £8 on average to produce, but under the new scheme this would increase by an additional £4.60 at least, bringing the total cost to £12.60 per badge. The current £2 charge has been in place since 1983.

What is a mobility assessment?

If you do not automatically qualify for a Blue Badge you may need to have a mobility assessment to fully satisfy the requirements.

From April 2012 doctors will no longer carry out Blue Badge assessments. Instead, we are required to make alternative arrangements for the independent assessment of people, where necessary.

We are currently exploring options for this and will carry a further consultation on proposals for mobility assessments early next year.

What happens next?

What you tell us will help inform the recommendations on the proposed changes.

About the consultation

The consultation will be split into two phases.

- **Phase 1:** Consultation on the proposed changes to the charge for a Blue Badges (this consultation).
- **Phase 2:** Consultation on proposed options for mobility assessments (this part of the consultation will take place in 2012).

The phase one consultation will be eight weeks long rather than the normal 12 weeks. This is because the national changes, around badge production and the cost, apply from January

2012. The shorter consultation will ensure that your views can be fully considered before recommendations are made.
