Kiln Farm Fields

I have received an email from the company dealing with David Wilson Homes to say that they have presented the application to Basingstoke and Deane Planning Department with a planning application for 450 more units on the fields by the side of Jersey and Guernsey and behind the new Marnel Park development. As we go to print the application still has to be officially registered and assigned to a planning officer to deal with. It will then be given an official number and the official consultation will begin. We will be asking for a public meeting where residents can see the plans for the outline, and one later when the more detailed application of the content on the site to give residents the chance to see what they think about the plan when they can see what David Wilson Homes propose.

This site is on the border but is actually in the ward of Sherborne St John but the impact is mainly to Popley and stretches to all parts of Popley affecting the roads, schools and health services. I feel we have taken just about enough of the house building for this borough. Its too big an area, too many units and we need to be able to breathe some good clean countryside air.

I am not against development if it's the right type of housing like some bungalows for the elderly or disabled, and starter homes to give our younger residents a chance to get on the first ladder of owning their own homes, or social housing for families who are in overcrowded conditions, but we do not need 450 more in the open countryside and green fields that our residents enjoy with walking, taking their dogs for walks or, in the case of the Boys Brigade, doing a sponsored cycle ride around the outside of the field to get money to buy expensive equipment that otherwise they would not be able to afford, like Kayaks.

On these fields we can enjoy the peaceful quiet of the countryside and even watch the deer and skylarks. I have been told there is the last small family of badgers there too. There are rare butterflies and other species so why shouldn't our children enjoy all the enchantment of the open countryside?

At the end of the day it is about the council having to achieve the Government's house building numbers over the next five/six years, but if you look at all the sites proposed they don't need to build on this site. People keep asking me why aren't we building on the other side of the town on Manydown if we have to build to order? We the taxpayer paid ten million pounds to buy this land to build good quality housing on, and it was taken out of the list. If we started

to build on this land or more out in the villages we would not need to see this cramming on the north side of Basingstoke. Young couples have said they want to stay in their villages but there are not enough affordable houses there so they are forced to move to the urban area. Councillors Page: The fight to get the hospital loop and a bus service returned to the former service especially for after 9pm goes on. I have had such a strong support from across the borough as it affects so many people, from staff getting to and from work from the hospital that used the bus number 5, and night time workers in and around town. This is a large vibrant town but with people having transport issues the evening trade in town has been described as a ghost town. To date 23 businesses have sign the guestionnaire to say it has had a bad effect on their trade and staff recruitment. That is incredible and I fail to see how Stagecoach can say the services do not pay when they made £153 million in profits last year in the UK alone! There are petitions at Fastfare Shop and the Pharmacy in Abbey Road and all the community centres. They are also in St Gabriels Church and if you want to contact me the details are below. I have also brought up my objection to the increase in taxi fares being put up at the beginning of the journey so that residents nearest to town would have the biggest impact with minimum fares going from £4.20p to £4.80p. I do realise that fuel and expenses have gone up but I believe it should be an inflation rise across all journeys and not a 17% rise to our residents. Popley West: At the request of Sherborne St John Parish Council and after consultation, Marnel Park, Merton Rise and Oxford Way will no longer be a part of the parish. In effect the 830 new homes will remain as part of Popley West, the impact is that the residents will not pay the precept and added pound a month used to pay off the village hall. The village will now consist of 541 instead of 1.371.

Kiln Farm, the site that David Wilson Homes want to build 450 dwellings on, is within the Sherborne St John ward, but the major impact will be on Popley as it is behind the new development and to the side of Jersey and Guernsey Closes. I met with council officers and two residents who came to represent the views of the vast majority of residents. I am sad to say it looks at this stage that the officers are keen to meet their housing number targets. We are opposed to building there as Popley has got enough to deal with already with the Merton Rise 784 dwellings to start later this year and a possible 40 starter homes on the Fire Authority land by Popley Fields. We know we need homes for our young families but feel that other areas both urban and rural should take a share of building. As soon as we hear any more news we will let you know.

Popley East: This week I attended the first meeting regarding the creation of a new residents association for the islands. The new residents association would be tasked with creating a community plan for the area. The community plan is a vision for the community developed by everyone in the community. It would set out short term goals and long term aspirations. The group would also be a good social forum and provide an opportunity for residents to come together. It's your chance to have your say on what happens in your area. If you would like to be involved then please contact me.

In other news, I was pleased to see that the council have begun building 23 new car parking spaces in Falkland Road. Although getting these new spaces is only a drop in the ocean in terms of how many new car parking spaces are needed across the ward, it is a positive step in the right direction and something I have been campaigning on since I was elected.

At the end of last month I met with council officers regarding the future of Chineham House. The building has been out of use for some time now and the council are considering the options for what to do with it in the future. Chineham House is a beautiful and valued landmark in the area and I certainly do not want to see it sold off. I have informed the council that the community must be consulted about possible future uses and that I want it used for the good of the local community. I will keep you informed of developments on this matter.

Hello Folks,

I hope you are all prepared for the cold weather to come. I note many shops are now selling rock salt and snow shovels. Last year the shops ran out in town!

On 12th January, the Popley Safer Neighbourhoods Panel met to vote on the three new core priorities. They are:- 1) Arson in Popley 2) ASB in Sark Way and Tortuga Walk 3) Drug misuse in Pitcairn Close.

There have been a number of arsons in Popley in recent months and the team have been working with various agencies to end this. PC

Chris Brindley has arrested a suspect, and the suspect has been bailed for further enquiries. The second priority is in Sark Way and Tortuga Walk. Residents had reported ASB and criminal damage in this area. Sentinel Housing also raised the area for more patrols. The drugs misuse issues in Pitcairn Close have continued. The local team know who is involved, it is just a case of catching the people in the act and working with the partner agencies to keep everyone in the loop.

If you live in Marnel Park you may be aware of the new community group: The "Marnel & Merton Community Group". The PSNP have now formed a good bond with the group, and are exchanging information on a regular basis.

On the 11th of January, I attended a meeting with the group behind the Popley Fields Community Centre. It is evident that there are some great residents in the group, passionate about keeping people safe, and improving the community. On 16th January I was invited to another more informal meeting with cakes! You can now find the group on twitter and Facebook. There is also a website being updated with relevant content.

If you follow the PSNP on twitter, or read my regular blogs, you may be aware of several issues in Marnel Park in relation to ASB. On-going work is being conducted to resolve the issues including issuing one youth with an ABC (Acceptable Behaviour Contract) and robust intervention work for others.

Last year was probably my busiest, and the best year I can remember. I made over 60 arrests, mostly drug related. I also attended many community events and have engaged with hundreds of residents. We are really trying hard to find ways to communicate with the whole community. We regularly contribute to the Popley Matters, update twitter, complete a daily blog, attend community events/coffee mornings, liaise with the schools and get involved in community projects. 



This was the conclusion of my reflections and, I hope, the determination to effect some change in my life pattern that will allow me the space to do that.

Jesus said "I have come that they may have life, and life in all its abundance" (John 10 verse 10). I pray that 2012 will bring times when you too can just "stand and stare"

Hello everyone

I hope you have all recovered from the excesses of Christmas and are starting the new year with a spring in your step! We have had our first committee meeting in January and agreed the date for our first Annual General Meeting. This will be held at Base 2000 (Air Scouts building) behind Popley Fields Community Centre on Wednesday 15th February at 7.30pm. Anyone who lives in Marnel Park, Orchard Grove and Merton Rise is very welcome to come along and join us and find out more about our plans for the year.

We were fortunate to have PC Dan Carter attend our January meeting. He gave us some really useful information about reporting incidence of Anti Social Behaviour (ASB) and reinforced that we must all report any incidence of ASB via the 101 (non emergency) police number. It is only through reporting of incidence via 101 that an incident is officially recorded and as the reported incidents grow in number Police will then be able to use this as evidence to bid for additional resources. This will in turn enable them to provide a higher level of service around the hot spots in the area which will lead to a reduction in ASB. However it is our responsibility as residents to report any incident witnessed through the 101 number.

There have also been a number of burglaries and recent incidence of arson in the area. People are being advised to keep their wheelie bins in a secure area (i.e. locked back garden or secure bin store. There is currently a spate of "vamoose" crimes in Basingstoke - this is where thieves steal car keys and then your car. Do not leave your car or front door keys in view of people outside your home or in your door locks - thieves can easily put wires through letter boxes and hook keys out! The basic message is that everyone needs to be vigilant around the security of their homes.

Well as we get stuck into the New Year, I feel our world is not going to get better as people have to pull in their belts.

Many years ago I can remember my grandfather saying just that. He was a great forager and grew practically all his veg in his garden. We had an old air raid shelter. He covered the top of it with cabbages, leaks, parsnips and all down one side of the garden veg sprang up

each year. Many people nowadays want nice lawns and have no interest in growing their own veg. They could save so much money even old buckets can be used to grow spuds, strawberries and raspberries as they do not take up much room. But it is so much easier to go to the supermarkets to buy your veg, no messing around. Do you know what veg grew in or where it came from I wonder? Not a lot of families have the time to tend their veg patches if they want to try and grow things. My grandchildren love to have their own little patch in the garden at home and tend their patch with pride, telling me all the things they are growing, A flower bed can also be used and still have your flowers growing alongside the vegetables.

As you know I was in hospital last year, but what I have not said is "Can I cope at home?" The answer is it is very hard, not only to me but Her Indoors. Yes, you get offered help but it comes at a cost. I am waiting, I hope, to get a special wheelchair so I can go out with the family. They are coming today as I sit and write this. However I expect as usual it will end up us having to buy one. If you go via means testing it is a mine field. I need my bathroom re-done so we can have a wet room. We went via the testing only to be told we can pay for it ourself. What a waste of time! They want people to be looked after in the community rather than a burden on our over stretched hospitals. Yet at the same time to get this kind of help seems to me we are not wanted in society. Means testing I agree with to an extent but there should be a line drawn. Disabled and senior citizens should get the help they need without the worry of finding money to do this.

Well, the wheelchair people have come to see me and I am to get a chair so I can get out of the house. Great news but I may need to use taxis. It depends on what they can find. Most of the tilt in space or reclining chairs are difficult to fold, but they are going to try and find one that is suitable for me and also suitable for Her Indoors to get into a car.

I have a chauffeur in Her Indoors. That's fine as long as I keep my eyes closed! As usual I will still keep putting up a fight. I will not give in to this affliction that I and many others have. This is what a stroke can do and the limitations of what lays ahead of

you in life. Still, I always say some poor person can be a lot worse off than me and some may never get out and about, but I am determined not to give up. I hope any person in the same boat remembers that we come up to obstacles in life like this and they should not stand in your way.

Phillips Legal Corner Why should you make a Will?

'Making a Will is something many people put off doing, yet we spend our lives building up our wealth – buying properties, investing in



shares, working hard, saving for the future. Why don't we make provision for when we die?' asks Sheila Glyn-Owen, solicitor specialising in Wills and Probate. 'Well, no-one likes thinking about dying but making a Will certainly does not hasten death and the very best reason for making one is that it will leave no doubt as to your wishes. But if you die without making a Will, the Government decides who inherits your estate – not you!'

Should **YOU** make a Will? Yes, of course, it's the only way to make sure that your wishes are carried out, so do make a Will if you've experienced any life-changes such as getting married, owning a property, moving in with a partner, having a baby, separating, divorcing or marrying again. Don't assume, if you are in a marriage or civil partnership, that your money and assets will automatically pass to your surviving partner when you die – it's much more complicated than that and couples living together have no automatic rights at all.

So how do you go about writing your Will? You can prepare a 'do-it-yourself' Will but if you get it wrong, your beneficiaries could be in for a lot of delays and difficulties, not to mention potentially costly legal battles. If your affairs are at all complicated it's better to use a solicitor who can guide you through the process and raise matters you might not have even thought - if you have children there will be issues of guardianship and trustees to sort out and you need your instructions to be clear. There are other things to consider too, like your choice of executors, who should benefit under your Will, any preferences for your funeral and of course the best ways to mitigate inheritance tax liability and protect your assets.

'If you want your wishes interpreted correctly,' says Sheila 'call me and I'll help you draft the very best Will for your circumstances. If you already have a Will and your circumstances change, make sure you update it. We see lots of unhappy relatives of people who prepared a DIY Will but whose instructions are unworkable, resulting in further distress. Make a resolution now to make a Will and put your affairs in order.'

Sherborne St John Parish Council

Merton Rise and Marnel Park. The Parish Council has been advised that the meeting of full BDBC Council on 15th December resolved that the Popley Fields ward including Merton Rise and Marnel Park areas of the Parish will split from Sherborne St John on the 1st April 2012. BDBC legal section is in the process of completing the official order; when this is signed we will receive formal notification. This will reduce the number of dwellings in the Parish from 1,371 to 541.

Elm Road verge repairs. Due to increased volume of traffic along Elm Road from the Village to Elm Bottom the verges have disintegrated and potholes are beginning to appear. Hampshire Highways will make temporary repairs shortly and include this stretch of road in their Resilience Program for re-surfacing later this year. Any potential winter road problems should be reported to Hampshire Highways.

Marnel Park. Construction on the existing site is now complete. David Wilson Homes is pursuing planning permission for further housing as an extension to Marnel Park, although no formal application has yet been made. We are endeavouring to safeguard the rural nature of the remaining open land between the Village and Marnel Park.

Lych Gate to the Cemetery. The project to construct the new Lych Gate to the New Cemetery has been almost completed. I'm sure that you will all agree this is an improvement to the New Cemetery and surroundings.

AGENCY WORKERS NEW RIGHTS

Currently, all agency workers have certain rights including the right

- to be paid the minimum wage
- not to have unlawful deductions made from their wages
- to be paid equal pay for equal work
- not to be discriminated against because of age, disability, gender reassignment, marriage and civil partnership, pregnancy and maternity, race, religion or belief, sex, or sexual orientation
- to work in a workplace which meets health and safety requirements
- to have a limit on the hours of their working week (with some exceptions), right to rest breaks and limit on night working hours.

In addition to the rights in the list above, under the Agency Workers Regulations which came into force on 1 October 2011 in England certain agency workers have the following rights:-

- from the first day of an assignment an agency worker has the right of access to facilities such as a canteen and childcare facilities. They also have the right to information about job vacancies
- after working 12 weeks in the same job for the same end user, they
 have the right to equal treatment in relation to certain pay and other
 basic working conditions
- after working 12 weeks in the same job for the same end user, pregnant agency workers have additional rights.

These rights are not retrospective and for agency workers who started an assignment before 1 October 2011, the 12- week qualifying period will not start to run until 1 October 2011. This means that the earliest an agency worker will be entitled to equal treatment is 24 December 2011 in England.


