

KILN FARM FIELDS UPDATE

September 19th 6-30pm at the Civic Offices is the time and date for the David Wilson Homes (DWH) planning application for 200 dwellings in the Kiln Farm Fields. The question on most peoples lips is if the full outline application was rejected unanimously by the Development Control Committee on 17th July why is this part of the plan still going ahead? That is a good question and it has baffled us all, but there is nothing stopping DWH from submitting the plans and they will have to be heard. There were 276 bullet points of objections and the vast majority apply again in this application, plus a few more.

We need the scores of residents who came to the meeting to come to the September meeting too, We clearly need to show the developer that we as a community are objecting alongside Sherborne St John Parish Council, that this is a wrong application at the wrong time. There is outline planning permission for around 1,000 more homes in Popley still to be built and our schools and doctors can't cope with the needs of the population in Popley already. There is no provision in this phase of the application for the 200 dwellings for ANY amenities like a school, doctors or community facilities. The roads are already too busy and that's without the 1,000 already to come.

The area they want to build over is agricultural land that has had crops in it for as many years as I can remember and I have lived here in Popley for 42 years. Technically it is in the parish of Sherborne St John and therefore open countryside but we all know the impact of an increase of 200 more dwellings will affect us in Popley.

Residents in Marnel Park told us it was shameful that they had been assured that there were no plans to build on the fields. Many told us they would not have bought their homes if they had known this was not so.

The track around the field has hosted a sponsored bike ride for the Boys Brigade and dog walkers take their strolls there, pre-schools and school children have enjoyed the open countryside and learnt about the seasons. The great crested newt is a protected species and would be completely surrounded by buildings and roads.

There are other sites available in the borough of Basingstoke and Deane so why are we expected to cram even more in the North of the borough? The proposal to build on the allotments in Oakridge is another example of developers greed to build for profit no matter what impact on the local communities.

Please come along and support your fellow residents and your Labour Councillors on 19th September, 6-30pm at the Council Civic Offices.

Natasha's Impressions of England

Introduction by Terry Jones:

Natasha is 23 years old and teaches English at a university in Minsk. I've known her for nearly four years, from when she was a student at the prestigious Linguistic University in Minsk. When, during my visit to Minsk last spring, she asked if she could come and stay with me, I was delighted to give her the chance to see England with me.

Despite the vast differences in our ages, we get on very well with each other. Due to her English being excellent I would take her places and then leave her to explore on her own, when she would ask people if she needed any information.

My Impressions of England, Basingstoke and Abbey Road: by Natasha Suruntovich from Orsha, Belarus

I've been to England before, as a child, but couldn't form a conscious opinion of the country and the people.

However, as an adult I've had a wonderful opportunity to achieve one of my dreams; to visit this country again and to see the way of life of British people in reality compared with the information I learned about as a student of English.

From my previous experience as a child, I found English people friendly, hospitable and polite. This time I started to admire their warmth, generosity, patience and extreme politeness to each other.

Being given a pleasant smile and a courteous explanation by the people in the streets gave me a feeling of joy, comfort and self content.

I even didn't mind getting lost as I felt 100% confident that I would find a way out relying on the kind assistance of the people around me; this applies to Basingstoke town centre, Abbey Road, Oxford, Whitchurch Silk Mill, Windsor Castle, London, Basing House, Vyne House, Silchester, Bath, Salisbury, Old Sarum and Winchester.

I find the atmosphere in English surroundings the most relaxing, stress free, exciting - exactly how you want it to enjoy yourself at all times.

I admire the preservation of the national heritage, culture and traditions, which is feature of English people, in such places as Bath, Salisbury and Winchester, which gave me the feeling of being in a fairy tale.

I believe in reincarnation and I'm convinced that in my next life I will join the English society, customs and traditions I appreciate greatly.

Despite only spending two weeks in England ,I feel absolutely at ease both in the country and the community and it seems to me I've been living here for many years.

From my studies I'm aware of the hardships the British people have come through. Nevertheless, I suppose they must be quite appreciative of the policies of successive governments that, in my opinion, have shaped the people as very well bred, well mannered, kind and very helpful to one another.

Councillors Page: This month we have been walking around the ward in the sunshine and have noted quite a few more walls badly damaged, the worst one in the garage area of Glastonbury Close. The broken parts of the wall were removed and we did a site visit with a Sentinel surveyor and again suggested it be replaced with railings. There were some very overgrown hedges in Fountains Close that were cutting right across the pathways and these were trimmed back, and the litter removed. We also pointed out the parking area in Tintern Close that the concrete has broken and is so loose it moves. Some of the hedges in Selby Walk are growing across the path and those that are the responsibility of the council have been cut. Some walls in Abbey Road have been repaired or replaced with railings. If you have any issues you can contact us by phone or email.

The Popley East and West Councillors met with the Hampshire County Council officer that is working on the access improvements for Popley Islands pathways that should start soon this year. They were held up to divert some water pipes to reduce the flooding risk in Bermuda Close. More details as to timescales will follow in next month's issue. *Jane 01256 819924*

Popley West: The meeting that David Wilson Homes (DWH) and the police were invited to was to try to progress the adoption of Marnel Park so that a solution on the long awaited traffic issues, lighting etc. can start to be looked at. Unfortunately the DWH rep had a problem with his car and no one from DWH turned up. The meeting then changed to solely looking at parking problems. Five years ago we were promised that as soon as the area is adopted, a plan to manage the problems would start! The measures include yellow lines, better lighting in the car parking areas and better marking of spaces. It is frustrating that this is dragging on for so long. Another meeting is being arranged. We had a few phone calls about the smell that was all over Popley. We found out it was from the Manydown Farm area and they were doing their annual "muck spreading". It reminded me that we are on the edge of the beautiful countryside in Hampshire and though this one day was not pleasant it is preferable to having hundreds more houses squashing us in! Popley East: The North Popley Accessibility Improvements programme is currently underway. With the third phase hopefully due to start in autumn 2012.

It will provide improvements to the footways and cycle ways in Popley East and is currently undergoing detailed design. Plans will include gateway features to provide a boundary and alert drivers to reduce their speed as they enter into the Popley Community.

On 19th September David Wilson Homes will be putting their detailed full planning application to build 200 new dwellings on Kiln Farm before the Development Control committee. Although a victory was won in July with the outline planning application being rejected, the battle continues. Please join fellow residents and your Labour Councillors on 19th September 6.30pm at the Council Civic Offices, to show the strength of feeling against this development. Parking continues to be a problem in Popley East, and one that there never seems to be an easy solution for. David and I have pledged to continue to push for improvements at every opportunity, and we will continue to keep you informed through our leaflets and Popley Matters.

Marnel Park Parking Issues (Beat Blog 11)

Since Marnel Park was built there have been parking issues. There are 1.5. car spaces, per address, with many residents owning 2 or more cars. Unfortunately this means that there will be residents forced to park on the streets... Except, the residents are choosing to park on the pavements rather than the streets.

At times in the evenings, I have counted up to 50 vehicles parked on pavements and near to junctions and parallel parked, etc. In my opinion, due to the design of the estate and lack of parking provisions, residents are forced to park on pavements. I am told that having fewer parking spaces is meant to encourage people to lift-share, catch a bus or have fewer cars. I will leave it for you to decide if that is a good move.

We have received many complaints about Marnel Park and the parking situation via twitter, email and word of mouth. In-fact, a disproportionate amount of complaints. I say this as when compared to what is going on in other areas of Popley, Marnel Park enjoys less crime and less issues.

Last year, after many complaints, I delivered letters to residents requesting cooperation in sensible parking. This year I have done the same. This year however, I have issued a number of £30 fixed penalty tickets to residents, who in my opinion have parked dangerously. I have also conducted several call-ons to car owners addresses, to ask them to park more considerately. I have had a number of emails from residents asking why I can't just issue tickets to all residents parked on pavements etc. This is not possible for a number of reasons. I will highlight a few: 1) The residents are parking on the pavements to keep the road clear, and to allow access to other vehicles, including fire engines and other emergency vehicles. If all the residents that park on the pavements suddenly decided to park on the road, the estate would be in chaos. 2) Although Popley has a Safer Neighbourhood Team, I am the only officer within the team with the power to issue parking tickets at present. Police Community Support Officers, and Community Safety Patrolling Officers, cannot. I simply cannot afford to spend large amounts of time issuing tickets and calling on residents to park more sensibly. Popley is one of the busiest beat areas in Basingstoke, and crime, and ASB issues must take priority.

On 16th August 2012, I attended a multi agency meeting along with representatives of Traffic Management, Road Adoptions and the highways team from Hampshire County Council. We met at the roundabout off Barrington Drive, then did a walkabout around the estate. It is possible that from this meeting, measures will be drawn up for yellow lines at some point in the future but that is not a definite. Also mentioned was a possible survey to see who owns what driveway and if the driveway is used appropriately. I will update you further when I receive further information. During the walkabout I pointed out the areas of concern from a police perspective. A representative of David Wilson Homes was invited to the meeting but didn't turn up.

What can you do as a resident to help? Please be more considerate with your parking. I would encourage neighbours to talk to each other. Perhaps you have a neighbour that in your opinion parks in an inconsiderate manner!? Have you spoken to them? It could be that they are unaware that this causes you issues.

When possible, I will continue to patrol Marnel Park, and when I deem it is necessary, and proportionate, I will issue £30 fixed penalty notices. As mentioned, I will not issue tickets to residents simply for parking on

pavements. There would need to be a dangerous or a persistent element to my strategy. I know some of you will not like reading that, but I cannot please all of the people all of the time. Just like in the movie 'Hot Fuzz', I must work for the 'greater good' in Popley. I have always been honest and transparent in the way I work. 

Popley Island Access Improvements

In 2008 we met with officers about making Popley a safer place for pedestrians and cyclists. Cllr Paul Frankum and I, Cllr Jane Frankum had been concerned about the speeds and accidents in Popley especially after witnessing a serious accident with an 11 year old child. With the closing of Chineham Park School and children expected to cross the busy Popley Way, we met with a series of officers and cabinet members in the County to get some action. The North Popley Accessibility Improvements programme is currently underway. The first phase in the summer of 2010, was a series of informal pedestrian crossings on Popley Way and Carpenters Down. It was brought forward to ensure that students could safely cross to the enlarged Marnel School following the closure of Chineham Park.

The second phase was in the summer 2011, mostly an improved shared use foot and cycle-way on Popley Way and Carpenters Down. It also included more improved crossing points for pedestrians and at last a permanent change in the speed limit to 30mph for the whole of Popley Way and Carpenters Down in tune with the rest of the town areas.

The third phase is hopefully due to come forward in autumn 2012. It will provide improvements to the footways and cycleways mostly in Popley Islands and it is currently undergoing detailed design. This is due to start soon (pending two outstanding issues, related to drainage).

After many requests for gateway features to provide a boundary into the residential area of the Popley community, with 30mph signs on as you come in from all three main entrances. With the brick structures at the junctions of Popley Way with the A340 roundabout and the A33, as well as Carpenters Down with the A33. Because of the speeds coming from the A33, the structures need lighting, which goes outside the norm. An innovative solution has been arrived at and is being used for the first time in Popley to allow the structures to be put in place.

The drainage issue needs the pathway to be resurfaced with an easier-to-maintain and better-looking tarmac. WSome areas will be returned back to grass to allow the water to drain naturally and hopefully we will see an end to the flooding in the play area and homes around. County officers have been liaising with colleagues in Development Control, at both Basingstoke and Deane and HCC, to ensure that our North Popley Improvements fit in with what is to be delivered by developers.

There is also a further study underway called "Popley Futures". This is to look at the wider links to other key destinations and is being used to ensure all planned future development tie together and the whole picture is considered, rather than just specific sites on an ad hoc basis.

We need to provide wider links into the countryside, e.g. Sherborne St John, and provide improved connections to Everest Academy College and the hospital.

We will keep you informed in Popley Matters when there's more to show you. Given the fast growth in Popley, we want to make sure it was all being tied together.




How the year has flown by, even many trees are turning to autumn colours soon the summer will end and back to the dark winter nights.

Among earlier plaques is that marking the Basingstoke & Alton Light Railway; this has moved from its original position on the exterior wall of the station ticket office: the renovations to the frontage of the station have resulted in a new position at the Information Point on platforms 1 - 2.

Next plaque up will pay tribute to the town's connection with Major R J Howard, Ox & Bucks Light Infantry, who planned and led the D-Day attack by glider-borne troops to seize the bridges over the Caen Canal and the River Orne.

Phillips Legal Corner



Some timely advice in case you split

'Breaking up doesn't have to be hard to do - if you put romance to one side briefly when you move in together' says Sheila Glyn-Owen, solicitor at Phillips. 'You may be one of the 3-4 million couples who are choosing to live together without getting married. Many cohabit successfully all their lives without ever feeling the need to marry, but many couples break up - and only then discover how few rights they have.

"Common law" wife or husband is a myth. The reality is that if you split up, you have no automatic right to the property if it is in your partner's name; if you rent your home, you have no automatic right to stay; and if your partner dies without making a will, you won't automatically inherit anything from him or her. If you have children together the situation is even more complex.

So what practical steps can you take? If you're renting, put both names on the tenancy. If you are buying a new place together, or moving into a home your partner already owns, then think carefully about getting a "Declaration of Trust" drawn up.

This is a legally binding document that spells out the proportion of the property each unmarried partner will receive if you break up. If you are contributing more financially than your partner towards the property it will protect your investment in the event that the property is eventually sold.

The Trust can be as simple or as complex as you require and if your circumstances change it can be re-written. It should include:

- The percentage of the property each of you will own
- The percentage of the deposit each will pay and how much each will contribute to mortgage payments
- Who pays for purchase expenses, utilities and other outgoings
- The provisions for buying each other out
- An agreed mechanism for valuing the property
- Provisions for children, such as enabling the child to stay in the property until he or she reaches maturity

No-one knows what the future holds,' concludes Sheila 'so my advice is take some practical steps to protect yourself. Investing in a Declaration of Trust and ensuring you both have Wills could save you a lot of stress, time and expense in the event that you separate or if one of you dies.'


