

On your side against ASB

Sentinel takes incidences of anti-social behaviour (ASB) very seriously and is continually striving to improve the quality of lives for our residents. ASB includes: rowdy, noisy behaviour, vandalism, graffiti, dealing or buying drugs on the street and fly-tipping.

As part of our commitment to tackling ASB we are working in partnership with the national charity, Victim Support, to provide free and confidential support to those people affected by ASB. Specially trained caseworkers will listen, understand and give you support. Most people feel better after talking to someone independent.

Victim Support is the independent national charity that helps people find their strength again after crime and anti-social behaviour. Victim Support offers help to over 1.5 million people affected by crime each year across England and Wales.

The benefits of the service include: direct emotional support through phone calls and face to face meetings, reassurance that issues are being listened to and appropriate action is being taken, information and updates on the progress of your case, practical help with personal safety and home security and one to one support and information to help you prepare for being a witness should an ASB incident you report go to court.

**Councillors Page:** Negotiations are still going on to improve the bus service for Popley. The number 4 (funded by Hampshire County Council) could run hourly, though, I was hoping for a half hourly service. It may do a new route taking in part of Marnel Park and through to the hospital. I will let you know as soon as I hear anything.

The road repairs that were overdue in Tintern, Buckfast, Romsey and Fountains are appalling and I have taken it up with the Highways and cabinet holder Cllr Mel Kendal. The standard of repair is far below anything we would expect. Hopefully by the time this magazine is delivered the mess will be sorted! I will be monitoring it very closely.

Thank you to Father Dominic for opening up the overflow car parking area at St Bede's and for asking the visitors to be more thoughtful to the residents of Popley when they park.

I am expecting the full planning application for Merton Rise to be presented within the next few weeks. I will keep you as up to date as possible. The development I understand would include the social rented, starter homes and bungalows, shops, allotments and community facilities I have been fighting for, for the last eight years! The original plans had 40% flats and I will be fighting for a big reduction on that figure. Cllr Jane Frankum 01256 819924 jane. frankum@hants.gov.uk

Popley West: David Wilson Homes have given notice that they are going to appeal against the decision of refusal for the development on Kiln Farm Fields. Your Labour Councillors will be working once again alongside Sherborne St John Parish Council to defend the unanimous decision by the planning committee. I believe the basis of their appeal is that planning officers of Basingstoke and Deane recommended approval. Bizarre when they were told right at the very beginning that members of the planning committee make the decision for approval or refusal. There were ten reasons for refusal and, in my opinion, their case is not only weak but not defensable.

We have requested more picnic benches for the Popley Community Park with some of the 106 developer money. All the Popley Labour Councillors are working together to ensure that the play areas and greens will have some substantial improvements across Popley East and West for next year.

Paul and I have met officers to press that they insist that the developers of Marnel Park get the work needed to be done so we can progress the adoption of the area. There are still issues with landscape, lighting and highway repairs.

We hope to make sure that the Council resists the appeal vigorously and that the best possible legal representation is employed to represent the local communities of Popley and Sherborne St John.

We have secured 106 funding for significant improvements to the Dryden Close play area and proposals for these will be circulated to residents as soon as possible.

We are continuing to seek improvements to the parking problems throughout the area against a backdrop of restricted budgets and lack of political will demonstrated by the current Tory administration. Working with Sentinel we hope to provide a small number of extra car park spaces adjacent to a garage forecourt to benefit residents in Tasmania Close and we are reviewing the current parking restrictions on roads to see if any more flexible arrangements can be introduced.

## **Celebrate Safely**

## Hampshire Fire and Rescue Service urges everyone to celebrate safely this Christmas

People often get distracted by the hustle and bustle of Christmas and are unaware of the potential fire hazards and toxic threats that can lurk in fairy lights, candles and flammable decorations.

Latest figures from the government fire safety campaigns show a rise in the number of accidental fire deaths and injuries over the festive period. In recent years there were 33,000 accidental house fires, 10% of which occurred in the run up to Christmas Day.

Hampshire Fire and Rescue Service wants everyone to have a happy and safe Christmas this year and is urging the public to take fire safety seriously - plan escape routes, install smoke alarms, and test them weekly.

Assistant Chief Officer Bob Rattcliffe, Head of Community Safety at Hampshire Fire and Rescue Service, says:

"The risk of fire in the home is an all year round issue - however people are particularly vulnerable at Christmas for many reasons ranging from unsafe electrical decorations, unattended candles, through to cooking whilst drunk.

"People also vastly underestimate the deadly strength of toxic smoke and overestimate how long they have to escape should a fire break out. The reality is that just two to three breaths of smoke in a fire can render a person unconscious. Christmas should be a time for celebration rather than tragedy and for this reason we're urging people to be fire aware and stay fire safe."

Here are Hampshire Fire and Rescue Service's top tips to stay safe from fire this Christmas:

- o Ensure you have a working smoke alarm installed on all levels of your home. Test your smoke alarms weekly and never remove batteries to power presents!
- Never leave cooking unattended and avoid cooking whilst drunk. The majority of fires start in the kitchen so this is a high risk area. Always turn off kitchen appliances when you have finished cooking.
- o Never leave candles unattended. Keep decorations, cards and wrapping paper away from candles, fires, lights and heaters.
- o Ensure you switch off fairy lights and unplug them before you go to bed, or leave the house. Check your Christmas tree lights conform to the British Standard (BS EN 60598).
- o Always use an RCD (residual current device) on outdoor electrical equipment (a safety device that can save lives by instantly switching off the power if there is a fault).
- O Don't overload sockets ensure only one plug per socket. Always turn off plugs when they are not in use, except those that are designed to be left on, like freezers.
- o Make sure cigarettes are extinguished properly and never smoke in bed. Put it out, right out.
- o Check on older relatives and neighbours this Christmas, as they are at greater risk from fire.
- O Ask the experts Fire safety in the home is the primary concern of Hampshire Fire and Rescue's Community Safety department. Visit our website at <a href="www.hantsfire.gov.uk">www.hantsfire.gov.uk</a> for information on how to protect yourself and your home from fire.
- o And finally, in the event of fire: get out, stay out and call 999.

#### Dear friends

## 'Good will to all children'

Christmas is traditionally a time for 'good will to all men' and we hope that this includes you this year. Sadly, however, we probably all know someone who has been affected by a marriage breakdown. It is often the case that when parents divorce and their lives move on, they may remarry and trust their new spouses 'to do right by them' and their children in the event of their death.

A parent will trust that even in the event that their former spouse remarries that they will consider their children even if they have more children from their new relationship.

Many parents, unfortunately, ignore the need to create a Will and therefore their entire estate might pass to their new spouse by the Intestacy Rules. The surviving step-parent is then entrusted to make sure they provide for their own children and their step-children in the event of their own death. However, the second spouse may decide to just leave their estate to their own children; or they may decide not to make a Will, meaning their estate then passes to their own children, again by the Intestacy Rules. This will mean that stepchildren are disinherited completely and receive nothing from their parent's estate.

Children can seek to challenge the validity of their parent's Will if they believe there is evidence of undue influence or lack of testamentary capacity and because of this the parent did not provide for them but left everything to his new family. There is also the option to bring a claim under the Inheritance (Provision for Family and Dependants) Act 1975 – as a minor child of the family who has not received reasonable financial provision from the step-parent's estate. Obviously, these options cause more grief and the costs also have to be considered.

## Tips and Advice on Clearing Snow and Ice

- Start early it's much easier to clear fresh, loose snow compared to compacted ice that has been compressed by people walking on it.
- Don't use hot water this will melt the snow, but may replace it with black ice, increasing the risk of injury.
- Be a good neighbour some people may be unable to clear snow and ice on paths from their property.
- If shovelling snow, think where you are going to put it so that it doesn't block people's paths or drainage channels.
- Make a pathway down the middle of the area to be cleared first, so you have a clear surface to walk on.
  - Spreading some salt on the area you have cleared will help stop ice forming.
- Table salt or dishwasher salt will work, but avoid spreading on plants or grass as they may be damaged by it.
  - Pay particular care and attention to steps and steep gradients.
- Use the sun to your advantage removing the top layer of snow will allow the sun to melt any ice beneath; however you will need to cover any ice with salt to stop it refreezing overnight.
  - If there's no salt available, sand or ash are good alternatives.

**DO NOT USE CAT LITTER** The clay granules in cat litter soften when they absorb moisture and turn into a watery sludge. Although this sludge may freeze at a slightly lower temperature, the clay content acts as a lubricant with the ice, making the ground more slippery and longer to thaw. It also walks into your house and stains and rots your carpets.

## YOU Trust's First Point Floating Support Service

I would like to tell you about YOU Trust's First Point Floating Support Service. First Point is a short term generic floating support service that works across all tenures and households in Basingstoke and Deane. The service is available seven days a week including evenings and weekends and can provide housing-related support for up to two years.

We aim to provide flexible housing related support to vulnerable people aged 16 years plus to meet their needs and aspirations towards living independently, to work in partnership to reduce and prevent homelessness, reduce social exclusion and promote links into the community.

We can help if someone has housing related support needs, or face losing their home or need support to take up housing, to help them to set up and sustain their home or help if they are moving on from supported housing, prison or hospital to independent living.

Our service is free and self-referrals can be made by a telephone call or by completing one of our referral forms. Alternatively a professional can refer on their behalf. Once we receive this, a member of staff will arrange to meet with them to carry out a full assessment of their needs.
