POPLEY HISTORY – ARTHUR ATTWOOD

There are more people living in the vast Popley area than were in the whole of Basingstoke when I was a schoolboy. Then, Basingstoke's population was a mere 12,000. As a boy chorister, I was chosen by Mrs Boustead, wife of the Vicar, Canon H W Boustead to run errands for her. At the time, I was one of the choristers who received threepence and was offered one shilling if I would help Mrs Boustead indeed I felt very Rich. What has this got to do with Popley, you might rightly ask? A lot, for one of my tasks was to deliver Mother's Union magazines for Mrs Boustead, who was Central President. One call was at Chineham House, then the home of Colonel Eastwood, who was Commandant of the Royal Military Academy Sandhurst, When Mrs Boustead was told I arrived by pushbike, I had a severe telling off for cycling so far, as I had a weak heart and was recovering from a serious illness. When Colonel Eastwood left Chineham House he was followed for a time by a Mr Charles, who had been put into Thornycrofts as a kind of receiver when the firm was not doing well. Within months, with rearmament and then wartime. the firm became very profitable.

Another place I cycled to was the farmhouse near Chineham House, afterwards a farm shop, to deliver Scout Badges to Mr Snook, the farmer's son. Later, I was to know his father very well. I was then to see industry spread to the area with Douglas Rownson's Engineering factory on the opposite side of the road to Chineham House.

My other memories of Popley are very personal, for it was where I spent some of my courting days with Nellie, my wife to be, a very good walker. It was a lovely walk to and from Basingstoke along the footpath, the side of which was to see the tower block of flats rise above the trees. This was originally the Basingstoke Golf Course and after the Club moved to Kempshott, the field was used as a landing ground for aircraft, including Sir Alan Cobham's airliner used for pleasure flights over Basingstoke. In the 1920's it was thought that the site could become an Airport, such ideas were squashed when Heathrow was chosen as London's Airport. Had that area between Oakridge and Popley been chosen, planes would have ascended and descended over Popley!

Next issue I will talk about Popley and it's connection with Sherborne St John and Old Basing in very early days.



North of Popley Development, Public Consultation Meetings

All rumours about the people of Popley being apathetic were proved wrong in September, when the community turned out in force to take part in the new development North of Popley, Approximately 130 people attended the planning consultations at John of Everest School, where they were given an opportunity to take part in expressing their ideas and concerns over the planning in the area. In fact 99% of those who attended said that they felt they had been listened to.

It seems that Local Government all over the country are beginning to realise that those who live in the area are best qualified to say how to best serve that area.

The Borough Council employed an independent Consultant (Mark Luken of Luken Beck Partnership) to liaise with local residents and plan events to research local opinions. Mark began by meeting local associations here and in Sherborne St John forging gateways into the community, and through these was able to identify some burning issues among residents. These included traffic, local transport both during construction and afterwards, layout and environmental concerns.

Thanks to all who participated you have made a valuable contribution to the future of the area.

Merton Infant School-Ofsted Inspection

Popley Forum 8th October 1998

It was a wet and windy October night as the people of Popley settled down to another session of information, free speech and putting the world (or at least Popley) to rights.

October's Forum was held in Maderia Hall, which provided me with my first visit to the Hall and very nice it is too! Speakers were myself (Tori Gosling – Community Development Worker), Stephen Bryers (Play Area Officer for Basingstoke & Deane Borough Council) and Roger Tustain (Planning Development Officer Basingstoke & Deane Borough Council).

To ease people into the serious business ahead, I started with a few words on my role as a Community Development Worker. This included the funding, management structures and my main objectives (to research the social, educational and recreational needs of the people of Popley and meet as many needs in as much as available resources allow). Most people there had heard it before, so I quickly moved on to what I had actually done so far. In my first three months I have designed and begun conducting a door to door survey researching local opinions on community facilities. Already strong trends are emerging from the research, including grave concerns with parking problems as perhaps the most pertinent point. Alongside my research I have been giving "hands on" support to existing groups in Popley, including the excellent Popley Matters!

Following this Stephen Bryers gave the future outline plans for all the play areas in Popley, this included the only future new play area in Maldive Road. He stated that the information they were using for upgrading and demolishing existing sites, was based on a survey done in 1995. Some people felt that this information would be obsolete by the time work was carried out but as he pointed out there was a limited budget and this had to cover all of the Borough.

The third speaker was Roger Tustain who spoke on the 1000+ housing development for North of Popley. While we have no final say on whether the building will take place or not, residents of Popley and Sherborne St John were given the opportunity to contribute ideas on the development at the

"Planning for real" meetings. Over 130 people attended (which impressed the Council no end) giving input on subjects such as traffic, transport, site design and layout, community facilities etc. Roger felt that this would be of assistance when the planning brief is put forward for the next stage, which he assured us would come back for community consultation. While the construction is unlikely to take place before 2000 all involved should congratulate themselves for taking part an issue which effects us all.

In the general discussion afterwards 2 major issues come to light i.e. Bus Services & Parking and they will be discussed at the next Forum. (Tori Gosling – Community Development Worker)
