Hello...

From your Community Safety Patrol Officers

We hope you enjoyed the festive period and would like to wish you a happy new year.

As Community Safety Patrol Officers (CSPO) we identify and tackle local issues, reduce crime, prevent antisocial behaviour and deal with environmental crimes, to make residents feel safer and happier about their neighbourhood.

An environmental crime we frequently deal with, particularly following the Christmas break and run-up to spring, is incidents of fly-tipping.

Fly-tipping is the 'illegal deposit of any waste onto land or a highway that has no licence to accept it'. Illegal dumps of waste can vary in scale and the type of waste involved.

Tipping a mattress, electrical items or a bin bag full of rubbish in the street causes a local nuisance, and tipping household items and small-scale building or garden waste in open spaces is unsightly and costs the borough a substantial amount to clear away.

If you have bulky household items these can either be taken to the household waste recycling centre on Wade Road, or you can arrange with Basingstoke and Deane Borough Council to collect these items for you (an applicable fee will be charged based on your collection requirements). Basingstoke and Deane can be contacted on 01256 844 844 or via the website www.basingstoke.gov.uk

If you know someone who regularly dumps rubbish illegally, we would be pleased to hear from you so we can investigate further.

We hope to see as many of you as possible whilst on patrol around Popley. If you don't manage to see us and would like to talk to us about any issues you may have, please contact us on **01256 845 700** or by email;

Minsk Trip

I've just returned from my autumn visit to Minsk and I'm exhausted! We think we've got problems?

Well, when I was in Minsk just over two years ago the rate of exchange was just over 3,000 Belarusian roubles to the US dollar. Everything from abroad, with the possible exception of imports from Russia, is paid for in US dollars. The rate of exchange is now just over 9,000 Belarusian roubles to the US dollar so anything from the rest of Europe has increased by 300%! The wages haven't increased by anywhere near this 300%!

Despite this everyone is still optimistic that things will improve!

Anyway, I'm exhausted as I now visit 6 universities plus Radio Belarus!

One of the universities I went to at least 7 times is where Natasha teaches, and she sends her love to all her friends in Basingstoke.

Natasha graduated from the prestigious Linguistic University, where I spend most of my time meeting students, helping post-graduate students and making recordings for them, and she wanted to go to the phonetics department to meet her teachers and professors so I took her along on one of my visits.



In this picture, Natasha and I are helping Professor Inna with some text she was working on! They all seem to think I'm some kind of expert! It may be of interest to the readers that in Minsk the staff who clean the Universities earn more than the University teachers! Despite all the problems, I still enjoy visiting Minsk and hope to

spring. During one of my numerous visits to the Linguistic University I weast asked to talk to some first year students who, in the opinion of Katya their teacher, weren't very good and didn't deserve me! However, after a few minutes well over half the students were asking endless questions and having fun!

At the conclusion of the 1 hour 20 minute lesson, one of the girls wanted to shake hands with me and she said: 'Thank you so much; I feel so much more confident now!' I replied that her English was very good, whereupon she threw her arms around me and kissed me! That's why I go to Minsk!

Councillors Page: We wish you all a healthy and prosperous New Year. Again "Popley" looks like there will be yet more changes.

As you can see on page 9 the Popley Islands access routes through the estate to the Marnel schools is near completion. The next phase to upgrade the paths will be in Popley Abbeys and Popley Poets, hopefully starting next year.

You may have noticed at the entrances to Popley, after a lot of campaigning by Cllr Paul Frankum and myself, that there is a gateway feature that will display a 30MPH speed limit. The intention is to remind drivers that this is a residential area and not a rat run through the estate. Developer money has enabled this as we have had many residents contact us about the confusion on the speed limit and their concerns over the speeding and volume of traffic that travel through the estate instead of using the dual carriageway.

We continue to monitor and meet with Borough and County officers to try to get Marnel Park and Merton Rise adopted. It was so near then faults were found in the roadways so the developer has to address these first. Cllr Jane Frankum 819924 jane. frankum@hants.gov.uk

In this coming year work will start on the expansion of Merton Infant and Junior schools and we want to thank all the residents who came to the exhibitions and gave their opinions and suggestions on how to improve on the plans. They helped to shape it to work better with the community than it would have done otherwise.

Cllr Paul Frankum 01256 819924 Cllr Jane Frankum 01256 819924 Popley East: We have been working with colleague Popley Councillors and County Highways to secure a number of improvements to roads and footpaths throughout the area. In Popley East, terms schemes are being worked up which should see positive improvements to the areas listed below. This isn't a complete list but gives a flavour of the proposals and all are subject to limits in spending within agreed budgets.

- Remaining section of paved footway on western side of Shakespeare Road north of the shops;
- Footways within Keates and Byron Closes, together with landscaping work;
- Improvements to the crossing provision to bus stop on western side of Shakespeare Road opposite Lawrence Close and provision of bus shelter;

 Improvements to the subway approach path north of the shops in Shakespeare Road;

- Provision of off road parking on the south east corner of Shakespeare Road;
- Parking provision to improve pedestrian sight lines along Shakespeare Road between Milton Close and Keats Close; and
- Improvements to the uncontrolled crossing between Milton Close and Keats Close to Chineham Park Court to provide easier access to the park.

Work is continuing on finalising schemes and we will keep you informed of developments within our own leaflets as appropriate.

We hope you had a nice break leading up to the New year and hope 2014 is a good year for the people of Popley.

Popley Access Improvements draw to a close

December marked the completion of the wider North Popley Access Improvements, which has made it easier for people to walk, cycle and drive more safely, both locally and onwards towards destinations further afield. Around £1.5million has been spent on improving the main access routes and road crossing points, widening them to more safely accommodate cyclists and walkers as part of a push towards more sustainable transport in Popley. This is as well as making them easier to maintain in the future.

All of this work reflects the opinions expressed at the public exhibition and consultation exercise completed in March 2010, at which the ideas presented attained over 90% public support. The proposals were modified following this event and meant that a more sympathetic and appropriate set of improvements could be delivered, allowing the people of Popley to prove they care about where they live. This event allowed the construction to commence in the following few months.

The first phase commenced in summer 2010, completing crossing points and enhancing safe foot access to key destinations, including a new crossing in time for the expansion of the Marnel schools in the autumn of that year. The second phase brought improvements to the two main roads of Popley Way and Carpenters Down during 2011 and 2012, helping people move along the roads more safely and cross more easily, as well as introducing a new speed limit of 30mph. This second phase was the main part of the programme to transform the local environment for residents and visitors, encouraging slower vehicle speeds and people to travel through the estate on foot.

The third phase is approaching completion now and has seen an overhaul of the key routes on the main foot and cycle-network, replacing the old concrete slabs with modern tarmac and widening to more safely accommodate all users. Working with key local stakeholders, the intention was to aid movement towards the key local destinations, including shops, schools and the hospital, as well as the town centre.

Future work will focus on the area to the south of Popley Way, in the Abbey Road and Shakespeare Road residential areas. Feasibility work on this is nearing completion and further details will be available soon, along with a timeline towards implementation. Hampshire County Council will use this opportunity to invest further in the infrastructure of Popley, working closely with the elected councillors of County and Borough to deliver more needed enhancements.

First Switch Hampshire scheme

Following the first Switch Hampshire scheme which ran earlier in 2013, the County Council is again leading a partnership with the Hampshire District and Borough Councils, and Portsmouth and Southampton City Councils to run a collective energy switching scheme which aims to help residents save money on their gas and/or electricity bills.

The scheme offers consumers a hassle free way to switch energy suppliers to take advantage of the best tariffs available to them. It is completely free to take part, people only need to register, and the rest will be done for them.

The scheme opened for registration on 10th December and will close on 17th February 2014. An auction with the energy companies will then take place on 18th February and residents will be contacted during the following weeks with their offer. There is no obligation to switch supplier but if they decide to take up the offer the switching process will be managed for them.



Road Safety.

- Wet Roads and Icy Roads: Be extra vigilant during the winter months. Beware of black ice, taking extra care in shaded areas as the sun won't have melted it.
 - Try to use major roads rather than smaller, quieter roads which might not have been gritted. In wet and icy conditions brake gently to avoid skidding and keep a safe distance from the vehicle in front - give yourself time to react. Don't forget: the braking distance is twice as far on wet roads and increases 10-
 - fold on icy roads!
- Low Sun and Glare: Now the winter is approaching, the sun is lower in the sky and wet roads will reflect glare which can temporarily blind you to potential hazards.
- Dark Mornings and Evenings: Now the clocks have gone back, evenings and mornings are drawing in. Be extra vigilant for pedestrians. As a pedestrian always use a pedestrian crossing where possible. Help others to see you by wearing fluorescent or reflective clothing in poor light conditions.
- MOtorcyclists: Look out for motorcyclists. They represent less than 1% of road traffic but account for 18% of deaths and serious injuries and are 40 times more likely to be killed than a car driver.

Top Tip:

Don't use water to defrost windows - warm water can crack the glass and cold water will just re-freeze. Ensure you leave plenty of time to fully defrost your car in the morning. A squirt of WD40 in the door locks will prevent them from freezing.

DIY Will or DIY Disaster?

When everyone is counting the pennies, it's all too tempting to try some DIY to save a few pounds. That may just work if you are handy around the house but beware if you are thinking about a Do It Yourself Will pack; you need to know the risks to you and your family. You may see initial savings but when you die your DIY Will could become a DIY disaster and a nightmare for your family.

Sheila Glyn-Own, a solicitor specialising in Wills and Probate at Phillips Solicitors, advises 'The errors in DIY Wills can be wide ranging and at worst an error can result in a Will being invalid and your assets passing to someone unexpected – this can even be the case if you are married with children!'

Wills are subject to a wide range of rules and laws, and one of the main problems with the DIY approach is that a badly drafted Will can render it completely invalid. Sheila also warns of the risks of being exposed to unregulated, unqualified and uninsured Will writers having seen examples of shoddy, badly written Wills that are not legally binding and have hidden charges which inflate the advertised price of the Will. In Summary Sheila advises 'DIY is good for the occasional bit of decorating, but when it comes to protecting your loved ones, don't go for a false economy – speak to a professional.'

Turn Your Tree to Compost after Christmas

Once the festivities are over residents can leave their Christmas trees at one of the 21 allocated sites specifically set up by the council across the borough from Friday 3 January 2013 until Sunday 26 January 2013.

Every year, around eight million real Christmas trees are thrown away in the UK, this creates about 160,000 tonnes of additional waste. If the trees are recycled instead they are then transformed into ProGrow soil conditioner and wood chippings, which the council then uses for the borough's parks.

If residents miss the collections at these locations, they can take their tree to the recycling centre on Wade Road. The opening hours at Wade Road are 8am to 4pm (closed 1 Jan 2013).

Cabinet member for The Environment, Cllr Robert Donnell, said: "After all the festivities are over it can be a real pain to dispose of the tree. By taking it to one of the locations across the borough it can then be turned into soil conditioner which will help our gardens to bloom."
