



I know there is a particular concern in Marnel Park and work is ongoing to get the pilot scheme together to start putting yellow lines in some roads. The first

wave of markings will concentrate on the most dangerous areas of parking. Once the scheme is installed there will be a further assessment and the next stage will commence. It is a fine line to try to satisfy everyone and will be nigh impossible, but we have to try, as it would be just tragic if someone got badly hurt. Just when you think you have it cracked, and the officer has sent four drawings clearly showing all the highways and paths we found that the sand/gravel paths were part of the agreement with the Parish of Sherborne St John (now de-parished from Marnel Park) and Basingstoke and Deane. The path from the allotments to the pond is now B&DBC but as I write this I am waiting to get an answer on the one in Appleton Drive. A resident had a nasty fall and hurt her ankle, and all we wanted to do was to find out the ownership so it could be repaired! The building of the homes in Merton Rise are ongoing, and fifteen have already been finished and residents moved in. This part though Popley West ward, is also. Rooksdown Parish as well. Oh dear here we go again! Parking is still the number one issue in all of Popley and the four Labour Councillors continue to seek some solutions. We continue to seek improvements for the Merton School expansion. Clir Jane Frankum 819924 jane.frankum@hants.gov.uk

**Popley West:** We have been meeting with the community groups and working with them on the community plan. There have been some amazing ideas for the areas from these meetings. We also have the advantage that there is some money in different pots to enable some of the suggestions to be progressed.

We continue to seek improvements for the Merton School expansion. We have met yet again with officers and secured another £300,000 to improve parking and drop off arrangements, plus some landscaping. As the officer said when we pointed out the huge trees that take out the light to the residents whos homes directly look onto them, that "we want to be good neighbours". When I went to look I noticed on a bright sunny afternoon they had to have their lights on.

As a Labour group we still continue to lobby for a better bus service as it is ludicrous to have the last bus home at shortly after 9pm and the possible cutting of Sunday services.

I noted there was the start of tree felling to open up the gap to start the building on Kiln Farm fields. We will monitor this and if you have any problems please get in touch with any of your local Councillor team.

CIIr Paul Frankum 01256 819924 CIIr Jane Frankum 01256 819924 **Popley East:** On 18th February B&DBC and Chapter 1 held a drop in session at Chineham House to give residents an opportunity to discuss and view the proposal to transform Chineham House into 10 flats providing affordable accommodation for the borough.

We have continued to push for community facilities in Chineham House and after considerable discussion with B&DBC it was agreed that there will be a community room. The room will have toilet and sink/tea making facilities and will be open for daytime and evening bookings by community groups or agencies. It will also be a facility for assisting with digital inclusion and welfare reform issues for the community.

Around 40 people came along and the feedback was mainly positive. Residents did express some concerns, which echoed issues we had raised as councillors, specifically wheelchair access to the community room.

We are happy to see good use of Chineham House, but feel disabled provision as a pre requisite is a must to enable accessibility for all the community. We will continue to push for this as we feel it is not a huge obstacle to solve.

### The 11 Most Controversial Food Additives

- **1. Acesulfame Potassium** (**Acesulfame-K**) Is a calorie free artificial sweetener which is 200 times sweeter than sugar. It is found in more than 5,000 food products worldwide, including diet soft drinks.
- **2. Artificial Flavouring** This denotes to any of hundreds of allowable chemicals such as butyl alcohol, isobutyric acid, and phenylacetaldehyde dimethyl acetal. They are used to imitate specific fruits, butter, spices, and so on. Found in thousands of highly processed foods such as cereals, fruit snacks, beverages, and cookies.
- **3. Aspartame** Is a near zero calorie artificial sweetener made by combining two amino acids with methanol. Most commonly used in diet soft drinks, aspartame is 180 times sweeter than sugar. It is found in more than 6,000 grocery items including diet drinks, yoghurts, and table-top sweeteners.
- **4. BHA and BHT** AKA, Butylated HydroxyAnisole and Butylated Hydroxytoluene are petroleum-derived antioxidants used to preserve fats and oils. Found in beer, crackers, cereals, butter, and most foods with added fats.
- **5. High Fructose Corn Syrup (HFCS)** A corn derived sweetener representing more than 40 percent of all caloric sweeteners in the supermarket. It can be found in every grocery aisle in products such as ice cream, chips, cookies, cereal, bread, ketchup, jam, canned fruits, yoghurt, barbecue sauce, frozen dinners, and many more products. Since around 1980, the global obesity rate has risen proportionately to the increase in HFCS.
- **6. Interesterified Fat** A semi-soft fat created by chemically blending fully hydrogenated and non-hydrogenated oils. It was developed in response to the public demand for an alternative to trans fats. Found in pastries, pies, margarine, frozen dinners, and canned soups.
- **7. Monosodium Glutamate (MSG)** The salt of the amino acid glutamic acid, used to enhance the savoury quality of foods, MSG alone has little flavour, and exactly how it enhances other foods is unknown. Found in chilli, soup, and foods with chicken or beef flavouring.
- **8. Partially Hydrogenated Vegetable Oil** A manufactured fat created by forcing hydrogen gas into vegetable fats under extremely high pressure, an unintended effect of which is the creation of trans fatty acids. Processed food manufacturers like this fat because of its low cost and long shelf life. It is found in margarine, pastries, frozen foods, cakes, cookies, crackers, soups, and non-dairy creamers. A loophole in labelling requirements allows processors to add as much as 0.49 grams per serving and still claim **zero** in their nutrition facts.
- **9.** Red #3 (Erythrosine) and Red #40 (Allura Red) These are food dyes that are orange red and cherry red. Red #40 is the most widely used food dye in most countries. Found in fruit cocktail, sweets, chocolate cake, cereal, beverages, pastries, maraschino cherries, and fruit snacks.
- **10. Saccharin** Is an artificial sweetener 300 to 500 times sweeter than sugar. Found in diet foods, chewing gum, toothpaste, beverages and sugar free sweets. Recent studies show that rats on a saccharin rich diet gain more weight than those on high sugar diets.
- 11. Yellow #5 (Tartrazine) and Yellow #6 (Sunset Yellow) These are the second and third most common food colourings, respectively. Found in cereal, pudding, bread mix, beverages, chips, cookies, and condiments. Several studies have linked both dyes to learning and concentration disorders in children.

#### **Dear Friends**

By the time you read this the season of Lent will be drawing to its conclusion in the celebration of Easter - the Passion and Resurrection of Jesus Christ. So how was Lent for you? Did you manage to give something up and will you take that something up again once Lent is finished or has it changed you forever? I never cease to be amazed at how God can be at work in the smallest of changes in our lives and how those changes seem to transform us more and more into his likeness. But sometimes those changes can have a massive impact too!

In the late 1980s not too long after I had become a Christian I was invited by a local church to attend a conference day at the NEC in Birmingham praying for the youth of the day. We arrived at the conference hall by 9.30am and I was amazed to find myself part of a crowd of 20,000 people of all ages and backgrounds gathered in this one place to sing, to pray and then to listen to some passionate speakers declare their commitment to the young people of our country.

During the closing worship a young man came up to me out of the crowd and pressed a piece of paper into my hand with the words "this is for you from The Lord!" And with that he disappeared back into the crowd. On the piece of paper was written 'Zechariah chapter 3' that was it! I had to look up who Zechariah was - an Old Testament prophet who lived around 587BC - and the first seven verses of that chapter blew me away! More than that they changed my life forever. It was the starting point of a journey that has brought me to where I am today.

The journey has not been an easy one! At the time I was working in the IT industry and enjoying all the material benefits a career in that industry can bring and to give it all up, go to theological college and become an ordained priest was just not on; not for me, my family or my future as I perceived it.

But God is gracious and as I worked through all these tensions and some very difficult personal circumstances I increasingly began to sense how God was gently and lovingly guiding my life, how his plan for me was being worked out in spite of all my protestations.

So my life changed! I gave up the career, the salary, the car and surrendered instead to the inevitable. I sometimes meet up with colleagues from my former career and they ask if I miss it; the drive, the energy, the rewards! Truth be told, I sometimes do, but much more rarely these days as the rewards from my ministry far outweighs the gains from that previous way of life.

Easter is the greatest of the Christian celebrations of the year. I hope and pray that yours will be truly blessed and that you might come to know this God who loves every one of us. May you and your family know His power to transform.



#### What happens if I die without a Will? By Sheila Glyn-Owen, Solicitor

Many of us tend to put the subject of making a Will to the back of our minds hoping that the necessity to make a Will will simply go away.

The law sets out clear rules for what happens to your estate – property, personal possessions and cash – if you die without a Will. Therefore, it is very important that you make a Will especially if you want your wishes to be met.

If you die without a Will then you die intestate and the distribution of your estate is governed by very strict rules. Meaning your estate may pass to someone who you do not want to benefit from your estate or someone who is dependant upon you may be left without anything.

For those of you who are married and have children, if you die intestate and you predecease your spouse or civil partner, then they and your children will not automatically receive everything in your estate. Unfortunately, your spouse will be treated harshly because their entitlement will be limited to a sum of £250,000 (plus personal effects), with a limited interest in half of the balance which remains after that. The other half passes to your children.

If you have no children but do have surviving siblings or parents, then your spouse or civil partner takes a sum of £140,000 and one half of the balance, with other relatives taking the other half. Your spouse or civil partner will only receive all of your estate if you have no surviving children, siblings or parents.



Happy New Year! I've just returned from 3 months absence to find that the Club (like my garden) is much more productive when I am away. So it's catch up time.

Let me start by thanking the people of Basingstoke who helped us to our best ever Christmas cash collection - over £3,300. And I must also thank all the superstores who allowed us to collect on their premises and those members of the Club who put in over 200 hours collecting, often in quite miserable conditions, to achieve this remarkable amount. Thank you one and all! Then Barclay's Mercantile stepped in and gave us £,1500. Wonderful! Many thanks!

So what have we done with all that money? You'd have to read the Welfare section of the minutes of our Business Meeting to get a true feel for the many ways in which people have been helped. The best I can do is try to give you a flavour of the sort of things we've been involved with.

Range £0-99: Disability certificate, bicycle, tricycle, doors, food vouchers, electricity top ups, clothing, carpets and paint, a total of 19 donations.

Range £100-499: Garden at old people's home, carpet, Homestart Chineham, Disabled Sports, Joshua Tree, Lymington House School, Saxon Wood School, a total of 7 donations.

£500 and over: The Women's Refuge and Basingstoke Voluntary Services.

With regard to all the above I'd like to thank the retailers who, when they understand what we are doing, give us such generous discounts.

The money spent rarely reflects the amount of effort that goes into ensuring that it is appropriately spent. For instance we were notified of a case where an elderly lady had been advised that she needed a mobility scooter. Normally such a request would be far beyond our means to satisfy. However, Pangbourne Lions Club had been given a mobility scooter for which they had no current candidate and had offered it to local Clubs. Our Welfare Chairman inspected it, accepted it and put in full working order for £170. In the meantime he spent several hours with the elderly lady to ensure that it would be suitable for her. It became clear that it wasn't. It emerged that she had become very anxious because she couldn't keep her house clean because she was unable to use her vacuum cleaner. It was too heavy for her to use. So, we bought her a lightweight cleaner for £40 which solved her problem and put her mind at rest. At the same time we were told of a young lad who had had to stop attending college because of advancing muscular dystrophy. He was able to handle the scooter safely so it was given to him to solve his mobility problem and allow him to return to college. I think it's called serendipity.
