

Popley Forum meeting 16th February

The committee of the Popley Forum would like to thank all the 120 residents and visitors that attended the Forum. Stagecoach was made to take the problem of bus cuts seriously. The Forum began with Councillor Jane Frankum handing Mr Dyer Managing Director Stagecoach South a petition of over 1100 signatures. Francis Collier a local resident also handed in 150 signatures. Mr Dyer was told that the existing service does not keep to the timetable (substantiated with proof) he suggested that problems were due to rush hour traffic but he was firmly told that this occurred all day long. Numbers using the service had fallen since the scheduling of a very long and erratic route. he assured us that this would be looked into!

Mr Dyer was then asked why, when the service is a major circular route (their words not ours) it was cut without any consultation, he replied that this service lost money and he had an obligation to his shareholders. Mr Moore pointed out that businesses usually ran on a profit and loss basis where one offset the other especially when Stagecoach made a half-yearly profit of 96.1 Million. Local residents informed Mr Dyer that a public service needs to be run for the convenience of the public not the operator or shareholders. Dave Phillips asked why, when minibuses covered the route a few years back this route was successful but since Stagecoach (who sometimes used double-decker buses) the route did not pay? Mr Dyer was then asked why a vital route serving a hospital could not be subsidised, again he stated his commitment to his shareholders. County Councillor Joan Carnell said she had received neither co-operation nor communication on this service.

Both Borough and County Councillors told Stagecoach that they needed to improve their commitment to the public and consult with all concerned. Councillor Phil Heath said that all were willing to talk to Stagecoach to improve the situation, but if this failed, action might be taken at both Borough and County level and possibly in joint co-operation, run a subsidised service. Mr Dyer said that it was encouraging news to hear that the council was willing to liase to improve on Stagecoach's quality and performance. The Chair, Iris King then said to Mr Dyer that answers were still needed and that this issue would not go away as far as the General Public, the Forum, local Borough and County Councillor's were concerned. The way forward for all was for Stagecoach to work in partnership, to ensure Stagecoach served the community to the advantage of everybody. Iris King then requested confirmation by letter from Stagecoach and Hampshire County Council with

answers to the many questions that had been raised. Popley will be extended by up to 1400 homes in the near future and all parties were asked to take this into consideration.

PARKING: Mr R Tustain and Mr R Archer-Reeves represented the Transportation Department of the Council. A petition of 353 signatures had previously been received resulting in a meeting with Iris King and Jane Frankum who walked about some parts of Popley to show the officers the scale of the problem. They said the main problem occurred from the Radburn

layout, in which Popley was built, this left a legacy of too many cars for too few places. A survey throughout the Borough will be carried out and maybe re-designing existing areas could find more spaces. Concern was expressed on badly parked cars, causing problems of access for all emergency vehicles. A local resident asked about illegal businesses being run from garages which should house cars. Mr Archer-Reeves said measures were in place so this could be stopped if reported. Iris King then asked about the T junction at Abbey Road shops, which is an accident waiting to happen, Mr Archer-Reeves replied nothing could be done at the moment as there was no history of this being an accident black spot. Abandoned cars were another problem but shortly a policy will be in place that would deter the owners from abandoning old/broken down cars. It was agreed part of the problem is ours, for parking in lay-by's, bus stop's etc. There is also a need for safer parking, perhaps yellow lines or similar measures.

Popley Profile 1998 - 1999 Public Consultation Draft

A Survey of Leisure needs in Popley

Brief summary of key findings:

During the months of October to December 1998, many of you kindly let me pick your brains about what you wanted to see going on in Popley. Here is a brief report to keep you up to date with what was discovered and how.

The survey aimed to identify recreational needs, important issues in the community and how to increase use of existing facilities. The main goal of the survey was to give local residents the opportunity to decide what leisure facilities they wanted. While a Community Development Worker was employed to carry out the profile, the project was managed and guided by local residents.

Methods of research included interviews with people working in Popley, survey research, talking to residents, observational research, and reading other reports. 274 homes were visited, and 144 questionnaires were completed (4.4 % of households in Popley).

The burning issues among the local community tended to revolve around transport (public and private), maintenance of the area, problems with health care and fears about petty crime.

Things people wanted to do socially included informal, drop in style use of community buildings for young and old. There was clear enthusiasm by many wishing to do voluntary work in the community. We recognised a need to overcome the sense of division between areas of Popley. Most people felt recreational needs were: much more community activities for young people, more sporting facilities/activities, more art and craft activities, more community facilities in Popley Poets and more stimulating activities for older people.

Many felt the key educational needs were expansion of crowded primary schools, more community links with John Hunt Community School to raise its profile, reasonably priced adult education classes in basic office skills, and more facilities for pre school age children.

People felt community centres were not fully used at the moment because of poor publicity, difficulties getting to them, too small a range of different activities, and lack of community spirit.

Further research will be carried out on leisure among 12 -18 year olds and the 50 plus age group, leisure among residents of Popley Poets, education for adults, education for pre-school age children, and sporting needs of Popley.
