**Councillors' Page:** After the power cut in November, the traffic lights in Popley were out of synchronisation, I called in the engineers for Highways and they were re timed. However I was still concerned on the timings in particular for the turn into the A340 towards the hospital, so they will be looking for solutions. There are also major works planned to improve the layout from Popley Way towards Reading including the slip road as you exit Popley Way.

I have been heavily involved in the Community Plan for Popley East and am very impressed with the commitment of the residents to improve the environment. In addition, the Popley Councillors have been working with groups to improve the community centres with the Local Environment Fund and are supporting the bids so far, for extensions and improvements to all our community centres in Popley. I also had a meeting in Winchester in regard to Marnel Schools extension and improvements and will attend the public consultation meeting on 11th December the details are on page 1. *Cllr Jane Frankum 01256 819924* 

**Popley West:** You may have noticed one of the tree officers around Abbey Road in the last few weeks-he is mapping and inspecting the state of all of the trees. This is after many years of lobbying by your Popley Councillors about the many trees that are too big, inappropriate, diseased or too close to houses causing damage to paths, walls, and gardens. There will eventually be a report and you will be able to check on all the trees near your home on the Basingstoke and Deane website. There will be further inspections in other roads in the future. Phone 844844 for more information.

In Marnel Park you may see someone late at night by the DWH site office buildings near the allotments; it is the security staff that David Wilson Homes have installed.

I am pleased to say that after asking that the leaf clearing and clearing of the drains will start this year in Popley. Last year the street clearing and maintenance department were overrun with work and Popley seemed to be at the bottom of the list. We have now been assured that the clearing of the drains and other general maintenance work will start here in Popley over the next few weeks.

The construction traffic entrance is through Marl's Lane which impacts greatly on the residents of Guernsey and Jersey Closes. Their early experiences have not been good and we have been contacting DWH to comply with the planning conditions covering this development; mud on the roads, no warning construction signs; inconsiderate parking by sub-contractor groundwork employees; and the severance of the electricity cable supplying the street lights have all meant that residents remain critical of the attitude displayed so far by DWH.

We are determined as your Councillors to make sure that DWH understand their responsibilities to local residents and we are working with Planning Enforcement officers to make sure that planning conditions are complied with. We intend to involve local residents in discussions with DWH where possible so that confidence can be restored.

Congratulations to all those who have contributed to the Popley East draft Community Plan, soon to be turned into the final agreed plan. Lots of time and hard work were put in by volunteers so that the views of the community are represented.

Lots of positive things can be said about Popley, but in particular we believe it to be people friendly and a place of opportunity. We hope you agree.



# A Remarkable Project Fifty Years On

A remarkable local project – and fundraiser – has just achieved a fiftieth anniversary. What became part one of The Story of Basingstoke DVD sponsored by the Friends of the Willis Museum was launched as a tape/slide presentation before a packed audience at Queen Mary's Grammar School on 11 November, 1964.




Made for the WEA by architect and staunch Willis Museum supporter Derek Wren, it covered the whole history of Basingstoke up to the plan to make it a London overspill town. Success was instant, resounding and lasting, thanks to Derek's authoritative but easily followed script, to the high quality slides, mostly photographed by Derek himself, and


because the script was read by Basingstoke's famous broadcaster, John Arlott.

In 1991 the presentation was turned into a VHS video, and in 2008 it was digitally re-mastered as a DVD by David Mann. Derek enhanced the story to 1964 with re-drawn maps and additional archive illustrations, and David Mann added a second part to bring it up to date, using more of Derek's photos, this time with captions and music but without spoken narrative, for who could compete with the voice of John Arlott in part one? Part two powerfully evokes the "before", "during" and "after" of the re-development period, and finishes on a positive note about the Basingstoke of today, whilst Derek's photos of a much changed town in part one now comprise a valuable archive in themselves.

Hundreds of copies have been sold so far at the Willis Museum, at Waterstone's,

Basingstoke and other local outlets, raising funds that the Friends of the Willis, a registered charity, use to improve the museum; these have helped with enhancements to the fabric, and with the purchase of exhibits and equipment, and will help with major improvements yet to come.

Hello Folks,

On 15th October 2014, the Popley Safer Neighbourhood Panel met for the quarterly meeting. Drug issues continue to be a problem in Popley. There is a lot of work going on in relation to this. Popley East is the worst affected area. This area includes Shakespeare Road and the surrounding roads.

For a number of reasons, the Abbey Road shops area is a hot spot for anti-social behaviour. We receive many calls about youths playing football in the area. The reports also include drug misuse and other general anti-social behaviour.

The current Popley priorities until Jan 2015:

looked amazing!


The children went into different classes and worked alongside their friends and also made new friends as we had mixed all of the year groups together.

Different learning

experiences happened throughout the school and the focus was World War One.

Some children learned about the Remembrance Poppy and the relevance that it has to us all. They reflected on why we all wear

a poppy during November and one group



At eleven o'clock we collected as a whole school, along with many parents who had chosen to join us, to observe the nation's two

minute silence. You could have heard a pin drop and everyone in the hall spent the time reflecting on what the silence meant for them.

We had a visitor, Mr Fairbank, who arrived at school dressed as a soldier from the First World War. The children were completed

enthralled at what he had to say about what life would have been like for a soldier during the war.

As some of the children had spent the morning thinking about 'The Christmas Truce', where peace was found through a football match in December of 1914, we thought that they may appreciate the act more if they could recreate it! So, the whole school played football. Onlookers braved the wind and rain to support the

children and cheer them on, for that, we thank them very much, and the children appreciated it!



Writing was also a great part of the day; after the football the children wrote letters and diaries, thinking about how soldiers would have felt after they had been told to return to the trenches, the written work that they have produced was very emotive.

War poetry was another area that some children worked on. They listened and focussed on several poems written by Rupert Brook, Wilfred Owen and many others. During our assembly, these poems were acted out, which saw many adults become quite emotional!

The remaining group of children had decided that they would like to recreate the art

installation at the Tower of London, 'Blood Swept Lands and Seas of Red'. They did not quite manage to add 888,246 poppies, but they gave it a really good go!

The main part of our MSSC Day was that the children develop a better and more in-depth understanding of why we wear a poppy.

They also understand that the money that we have raised for the Royal British Legion supports the work that they do and that

encouraged them to cover our poppy; all monies will be with the RBL shortly.

Thank you to all who helped us to commemorate Remembrance Day 2014 as we thought deeply about those who had given so much from 1914 onwards.



# **Our Story**

# The History – How The Silver Line was Born

In August 2011, Esther Rantzen CBE (who founded the children's helpline ChildLine in 1986) wrote an article about the loneliness she has experienced since being bereaved, and living alone. She was overwhelmed by the huge response from older people who shared her experience. In November 2011 she was invited to make a key-note speech at a conference at which she came up with the idea of creating a helpline in order to support vulnerable older people, sign-post them to projects and services, break through the stigma of loneliness and isolation, and tackle the problems of abuse and neglect.

As a result, Paul Burstow (then Minister of State for Care Services) hosted a round-table seminar on 1st February 2012, chaired by Esther Rantzen, at which many of the major voluntary organisations working with older people were represented, together with other members of the statutory sector. The enthusiasm and support of all the attendees lead to an initial grant of £50,000 pledge as "seed money" by the Department of Health. A pilot was launched in November 2012, funded by Comic Relief covering the North East, North West, Isle of Man and Jersey.

Following a successful pilot The Silver Line was awarded a £5 million grant from the Big Lottery Fund in September 2013 to support part the first two years operation. This grant has allowed the Silver Line to launch in time for Christmas – often the loneliest time of year for older people.

The Silver Line Helpline provides three functions to support older people:

- a sign-posting service to link them into the many, varied services that exist around the country;
  - a befriending service to combat loneliness;
- a means of empowering those who may be suffering abuse and neglect, if appropriate to transfer them to specialist services to protect them from harm.

# **Changes to Library Opening Times.**

As you are aware we are located in Potters Walk in Festival Place and on Sundays this part of the shopping centre does not attract the shoppers from the busier areas because the neighbouring retail units are closed.

We have reviewed the lower visitor numbers and recommended that we discontinue opening for 4 hours on Sundays. The benefits from the closure will be a saving on both the cost of utilities and cleaning. Most importantly the Sunday team will be able to transfer the number of hours they work into weekdays instead.

We hope that customers will take advantage of the excellent opening hours still available Monday – Friday 8.30am – 6.30pm and on Saturday 8.30am – 4.30pm. Even with a reduction from 62 to 58 opening hours a week, Basingstoke Discovery Centre has the 2nd highest number of opening hours for a library site in Hampshire.

After refurbishment by the library service Basingstoke Discovery Centre opened in 2010. It is one of the top performing venues in the library service and in 2013/14 it attracted more than 310,000 visitors and issued 305,000 items. The venue includes a café, computers, free WiFi and rooms for hire including a community space.

The last Sunday opening will be 21st December 2014.



IS YOUR HOLIDAY PAY BEING CALCULATED CORRECTLY?

Gill Brown, Head of the Employment Team at Phillips Solicitors tells us that it is now official that in calculating the amount an employee is entitled to be paid for holiday pay, employers must include in their calculation not only basic pay but all remuneration including commission and overtime pay.

A recent ruling confirmed that for the purpose of calculating holiday pay, commissions earned by an employee had to be taken into account when working out holiday pay. The issue that was left outstanding related to whether or not non-guaranteed overtime also formed part of an employee's remuneration for the purposes of calculating the amount of holiday pay they should receive. This decision was left to the Employment Appeals Tribunal (EAT) to decide and they have ruled that, "Yes it does."

Employers have traditionally only based holiday pay calculations on basic pay. Some employers even employ staff on a part-time basis and get them to make up their hours with overtime specifically to keep down their holiday pay liability to part-time pay only. Well no more – employers will now have to include both commission and over-time when calculating holiday on the basis of "a week's pay" under the provisions of the Working Time Regulations.

The other matter that was considered in this landmark case by the EAT related to claims for back dated holiday pay. Clearly there is potential for these to arise thick and fast. There has been some effort to limit such claims by suggesting that where there has been more than a 3 month gap between underpayments of holiday pay, then the right to claim back payment of arrears of holiday pay will be lost. This would limit any claim for arrears of holiday pay to holiday that was

taken within the last 3 months plus any other holiday that fell within the 3 months preceding that. Watch this space, however, as this will no doubt be appealed.
