

Clearing snow and ice from pavements yourself

Anyone can clear snow and ice from the pavement outside their home or public spaces to prevent slips and falls. Follow the snow code to clear snow and ice safely.



The snow code - tips on clearing snow and ice from pavements or public spaces

Don't be put off clearing paths because you're afraid someone will get injured. Remember, people walking on snow and ice have a responsibility to be careful themselves.

Follow the advice below to make sure you clear the pathway safely and effectively.

And don't believe the myths - it's unlikely you'll be sued or held legally responsible for any injuries if you have cleared the path carefully.

Clear the snow and ice early in the day

It's easier to move fresh, loose snow rather than hard snow that has packed together from people walking on it. So if possible, start removing the snow and ice in the

morning. If you remove the top layer of snow in the morning, any sunshine during the day will help melt any ice beneath. You can then cover the path with salt before nightfall to stop it refreezing overnight.

Preventing slips



Pay extra attention to clearing snow and ice from steps and steep pathways - you might need to use more salt on these areas

Use salt or sand - not water

Don't make the pathways more dangerous by causing them to refreeze. If you use water to melt the snow, it may refreeze and turn to black ice. Black ice increases the risk of injuries as it is invisible and very slippery.

You can melt snow or prevent black ice by spreading some salt on the area you have cleared. You can use ordinary table or dishwasher salt - a tablespoon for each square metre you clear should work. Don't use the salt found in salting bins - this will be needed to keep the roads clear.

Be careful not to spread salt on plants or grass as it may damage them.

If you don't have enough salt, you can also use sand or ash. These won't stop the path icing over as effectively as salt, but will provide good grip underfoot.

Take care where you move the snow

When you're shovelling snow, take care where you put it so it doesn't block people's paths or drains. Make sure you make a path down the middle of the area to be cleared first, so you have a clear surface to walk on. Then shovel the snow from the centre of the path to the sides.

Offer to clear your neighbours' paths

If your neighbour will have difficulty getting in and out of their home, offer to clear snow and ice around their property as well. Check that any elderly or disabled neighbours are alright in the cold weather. If you're worried about them, try contacting their relatives or friends, or if necessary the local council.

Councillors' Page: At the the full council meeting in Winchester I spoke forcefully in support of the need for faster broadband for all, and that on new developments it should be installed by the developers at the building stage. I am pleased to say it was agreed across all parties this should be pursued. Basingstoke and Deane have included it in the future Local Development Plan and we hope other areas will follow.

I met with a representative of Charles Church to discuss a safer opening from Merton Rise through to the Popley Community Park, it is used a lot by school children getting to school and hospital workers going to work, also cyclists and pedestrians.

I met with County and Borough officers to discuss extra parking for the Merton school drop off area and I am pleased to say that there may be a planning application that will give up to twelve extra spaces. It will still leave the play area and ball courts (to be enhanced in the future) and a small area of the school field would be used. This could be great news for the safety of the children and also gives extra parking for residents. 
Popley West: The tree survey in Abbey Road and nearby to look at trees that are either in poor condition, or because they have grown to such an extent that they are now touching or significantly properties, overshadowing been completed. A map (showing which trees) will be in Melrose Hall and on the Basingstoke and Deane website as soon as it is ready. As it appears that there are a significant amount, the budget to do the work and in some cases replace with more appropriate treesmay mean the work would have to be over the next couple of years.

We have not been contacted yet about the proposal to put double yellow lines in Barrington and Appleton Drive. There were a significant amount of replies from residents to the council and they will be coordinating them in the new year. As soon as we have any firm news we will of course let you know.

In early December, after months of trying, we were very happy to see bus shelters finally erected in Shakespeare Road opposite Lawrence Close and one on Popley Way just before John Hunt Drive. Both very welcome additions as the winter months draw in. As it gets colder we all want to keep our homes warm and our energy bills down. Loft insulation can slice about £150 off energy bills each year, and energy firms are offering it free to certain groups. This is funded by money from the big energy companies who are obliged by the government to contribute to energy efficiency. British Gas is currently the only energy provider with no restrictions on your income or the number of benefits you're receiving for free insulation. The others require you to get Child Tax Credit and have an income of £15,860 or under, or to be receiving certain benefits such as pension credit. A quick way to check if you qualify is to call the Energy Saving Trust on 0300 123 1234.

NHS 111 Service

Available 24 hours a day, 365 days a year across Hampshire, the NHS 111 service makes it easier for people to access local NHS healthcare services in England.



You should use the NHS 111 service, which is free from landlines and mobiles, if you urgently need medical help or advice but it's not a life-threatening situation. The service is staffed by a team of fully trained advisers, supported by experienced nurses and paramedics. They will ask you questions to assess your symptoms, then give you the healthcare advice you need or direct you straightaway to the local service that can help you best. That could be the Emergency Department at your local hospital, an out of hours doctor, an urgent care centre, a community nurse, an emergency dentist or a late-opening chemist.

Where possible, the NHS 111 team will book you an appointment or transfer you directly to the people you need to speak to. If the advisers think you need an ambulance they will immediately arrange for one to be sent to you.

For immediate, life-threatening emergencies, continue to call 999.

Road Safety.

Wet Roads and Icy Roads: Be extra vigilant during the winter months. Beware of black ice, taking extra care in shaded areas as the sun won't have melted it.

Try to use major roads rather than smaller, quieter roads which might not have been gritted. In wet and icy conditions brake gently to avoid skidding and keep a safe distance from the vehicle in front - give yourself time to react.

Don't forget: the braking distance is twice as far on wet roads and increases 10-fold on icy roads!

- Low Sun and Glare: Now the winter is approaching, the sun is lower in the sky and wet roads will reflect glare which can temporarily blind you to potential hazards.
- Dark Mornings and Evenings: Now the clocks have gone back, evenings and mornings are drawing in. Be extra vigilant for pedestrians.
 As a pedestrian always use a pedestrian crossing where possible. Help others to see you by wearing fluorescent or reflective clothing in poor light conditions.
- Motorcyclists: Look out for motorcyclists. They represent less than 1% of road traffic but account for 18% of deaths and serious injuries and are 40 times more likely to be killed than a car driver.

Top Tip:

Don't use water to defrost windows - warm water can crack the glass and cold water will just re-freeze. Ensure you leave plenty of time to fully defrost your car in the morning. A squirt of WD40 in the door locks will prevent them from freezing.

Keep safe and warm this winter

- If you have an outside tap, you can prevent your pipes from freezing by either turning it off at the stop cock or getting a special jacket to fit around it. Make sure you know where your stop cock is.


