

A serious house fire recently occurred in Popley that led to tragedy for one family and the local community. Hampshire Fire and Rescue Service offers its deepest condolences to the family and all who knew Tamazin, who sadly died as a result of the fire.

Although the fire investigation is still ongoing, we would like to use this opportunity to make the local community aware of some

important home safety advice.

You may have seen our firefighters in the local area offering home fire safety visits and general reassurance. Home safety visits are designed to ensure that the most vulnerable in our communities stay as safe as possible in their own homes. These visits help reduce the risks of potential fire hazards, give advice on fire escape plans and show how to look after smoke alarms. An online self-assessment tool can be found on the HFRS website that will show if you are eligible for one of these visits, along with additional fire safety information. Just go to hantsfire.gov.uk/keeping-safe.

Over half of all fatal accidental house fires involve discarded smoking materials. To keep you and your family safe please:

- Don't smoke inside;
- Never smoke in bed:
- Stub it out properly and dispose of all materials carefully, use ashtrays and empty them
 regularly to an outside bin when cool;
- Never leave lit cigarettes unattended
- If using an e-cigarette, only use the supplied charger and never leave it on charge longer than necessary; and
- Best of all would be to try to give up there are lots of people out there who can help.

If you are worried about a vulnerable friend or family member who smokes, we work closely with partner agencies to ensure they are safe whilst smoking. Where appropriate we can provide fire resistant bedding and throws which will help to reduce the risk of a fire occurring if a cigarette is accidentally dropped.

We also recommend that households discuss what they should do in the event of the fire - ultimately you need to **get out, stay out and call the fire service out**. You should talk with your family and discuss escape routes. Does everyone know how to get out the house in the event of a fire – does everyone know where the keys are kept?

As part of the Service's ongoing commitment to community safety, you may see further articles from us in this newsletter with top tips on how to stay safe in your home, on the roads and in your community.

Councillors' Page: I have been a serving county councillor on the Hampshire Fire and Rescue Authority for ten years. I, with other county councillors of all political parties, help to monitor and advise on the fire service. We are like a school governing board and I have learnt so much over the ten years. I have seen so many of the different functions they do: fire fighting, rescues of people and animals, advising shops, businesses and people's homes. They check alarms and do safety checks. With the tragic fire in Popley I saw another side of the service when I was asked if I would visit the scene. The investigation team were there sifting through the masses of burnt and damaged remains of the house. The saddest part was that a young woman died there and it has left the family devastated. The residents were amazing and helped the family and neighbours with chairs and blankets and much needed cups of hot drinks. The advice always given is "Get out, phone 999 and stay out". I understand the smoke alarms did sound and that it probably saved lives. Paul checks ours every Monday and I am thankful I have smoke alarms and basic firefighting equipment in our home. If you want advice, the HFRS will gladly talk to you. *Clir Jane Frankum 01256 819924*

Popley West: The consultation on new allotment sites has concluded and after Councillors and residents responded to the consultation all the proposed Popley sites were rejected.

Merton and Marnel Community Group are looking for just a few willing residents to help with a fantastic opportunity to get grant money to improve facilities and the area. There are thousands of pounds from a government grant in compensation for all the new homes built in Popley. Grants have already been, or about to be granted to Melrose Hall, Popley Fields Community Centre, St Gabriel's Community Church and Popley Poets. In order to qualify residents working with council and councillors need to make applications. There is no Borough council election this year in Popley, however of course there we continue to fight and represent the residents. There is of course the General Election for all in the country.

Cllr Jane Frankum 01256 819924 Cllr Paul Frankum 01256 819924 **Popley East:** As you all know, the Borough Council has been carrying out an extensive consultation exercise with residents regarding the allocation of new sites for allotments. We are grateful to all those who took part in the consultation and, as Local Councillors, we were invited to make our own comments on the sites which were identified as suitable for allotments. We took the view, as did the vast majority of those consulted that the sites in Popley were not suitable for allotments, despite a local demand and would represent an unacceptable loss of public open space.

You may wish to know that the only site the Council will now be pursuing is at Beggarwood Park.

As Local Councillors we have met recently with David Wilson Homes and Planning Enforcement officers to try to improve the way DWH consult with local residents most affected by the development at Kiln Farm (Marnel Park extension). This development is going to take some years to complete and DWH have agreed that they will communicate regularly by newsletter (every 3 months) with residents in the surrounding area. They will provide a site map and details about the phasing of the development and will make available a telephone number for the on-site agent when problems occur, such as mud on roads or the blocking of access roads and the like.

Dear Friends,

Sitting here in my study looking forward to the spring sunshine, the clear skies and warm sunshine that must surely come; I am struck by the marked contrast to the long, seemingly interminable, months of winter that are at last beginning to fade – already its much lighter, longer! It has seemed to be one of the longest winters that I can recall, perhaps because this time last year we had just begun our sabbatical in Cyprus; the memory of which makes spring and the prospect of longer and warmer days all the more welcome.

We especially missed England in the springtime last year. The daffodils just waiting to burst open, buds on the trees and the dreaded weeds starting to make their annual appearance in the jungle that is my garden! All serve as a reminder that once again the seasons have come full circle from the new life of last spring, the flowering of summer to the dying and death of autumn and winter.

By the time you read this Easter will be upon us – it is the most important Christian festival of the year. I hope that you can celebrate Easter with us this year and that the sun shines on all of us as the Son shines on all of us!



Everybody needs good neighbours

Disputes between neighbours can be some of the most acrimonious and emotionally scarring. They take a number of forms but all share one common feature: they directly affect people and families at their homes. An Englishman's home is his castle and it follows that when that is under threat that he will do battle; neighbour disputes are often fearsomely contested. They classically involve the following:

Boundary lines. Sometimes a boundary line between two properties will have been poorly drawn up, sometimes the physical reality of the land has changed over time so that it does not match title deeds. Either way it is possible for there to be ambiguity which over time is likely to lead to conflict.

Boundary maintenance. It might be over who has the right or responsibility the change a boundary feature and if so how, or whether a neighbour has the right to insist on the removal of trees or foliage.

Parking, noisy neighbours, antisocial behaviour. There are a wide range of other common issues that we advise on.

Whilst it remains unresolved any such dispute will directly affect your property. If you wish to sell, you will have to disclose the issue which could have a negative impact on the marketability or even the value of your property. It may seem that by instructing a solicitor you are escalating a dispute but in most cases it is the best way of moving towards a solution quickly and calmly. Dealing with a difficult neighbour directly, perhaps over the back fence can make matters worse.

We advise that the best way to resolve disputes is by focussing solely on the legal issues and practical solutions. In fact our advice is to keep actual litigation through the Courts to a minimum. If entered into prematurely the Court process will be lengthier and more costly and in the vast majority of cases can be avoided altogether. In cases where it is necessary to get technical input we advise clients to instruct a surveyor or other expert at the outset so that the issues can resolved insofar as possible without the Court's involvement.

There has for some time been increasing pressure on litigants to try to resolve their disputes through mediation. That means to meet with an impartial mediator to explore settlement options outside of Court. That is now a requirement and there are potential cost sanctions against parties who refuse to mediate. We have long been proponents of alternative means of resolving disputes and run our own established local mediation service – Town Gate Mediation.

Road Safety Education Programmes

The Road Safety Team at Hampshire County Council run various schemes for primary and secondary aged children to teach them about the dangers of the road as a pedestrian, cyclist or vehicle occupant. See below for more details:

Streets Ahead Pedestrian training - The Streets Ahead Pedestrian Training scheme is aimed at Year 2 children and is lead by volunteers from each school. The course involves three practical sessions, which include using the Green Cross Code, what to wear and how to behave, keeping safe on the pavements as well as finding the safest route. We currently have 2,500 children taking part in the scheme.

Junior Road Safety Officer scheme - The Junior Road Safety Officer (JRSO) scheme involves one Year 5 and one Year 6 pupil becoming JRSOs. They teach their peers about road safety through assemblies, having their own notice board and running competitions. The JRSOs are trained at two annual events lead by the Road Safety Team with the support of various partners. The Road Safety Team has over 350 JRSOs across Hampshire in 171 schools, which means our key messages are being taught to 42,000 children.

Bikeability - Hampshire County Council offers Level 2 Bikeability to primary schools and Level 2 and 3 to secondary schools, giving children the opportunity to develop new skills, improve confidence and gain a sense of pride and achievement. The Road Safety Team currently has funding for and is training 8,750 children across Hampshire.

StreetSense - 'StreetSense' is aimed at secondary school students aged 11-16 and highlights the dangers of being distracted at the roadside. The aim of the programme is to educate both teenagers and pre-teens about keeping safe as they travel on foot or by bike, particularly to and from school, reminding them of the dangers of mp3 players, mobile phones as well as conversations with friends whilst crossing the road. The Road Safety Team is currently working with 31 secondary schools across Hampshire, which means our key messages are being taught to 45,000 students.

Your child's transition to Secondary School - advice to parents

With traffic being the biggest single cause of accidental death for 12-16 year olds, it is essential for teenagers to be aware of the dangers and therefore the Road Safety Team's StreetSense programme highlights the importance of being seen and giving the road your full attention – and not leaving your senses at the roadside. Through Year 7 and 8 assemblies, Theatre in Education and Year 9 workshops, teenagers across Hampshire are being taught how to keep themselves safe and make responsible choices.

As well as learning about the dangers of the road at school, it is essential that you are aware of how to help your child develop good road safety skills. Young people pick up habits from adults and therefore if they see older people taking risks, they are likely to follow the pattern and take risks themselves. This means ensuring you are setting a good safe example as a pedestrian, cyclist and vehicle occupant.

As your child moves onto secondary school, they will be making more independent journeys and possibly using public transport. Ensure you have discussed the risks and they are able to assess the risk of each stage of their journey, making it as safe as possible.

Take time to discuss the safest way to make the journey to school. Encourage them to think about it before they begin their journey and be prepared for unexpected things. Get them to consider the following:

- What route will they take? Where are the road hazards? Could changing the route make it less risky?
 For example, walking to safe crossings rather than taking short cuts.
- What are the times and cost of public transport?
- What would they do if something unusual happened?
- What distractions might there be? How could they avoid being distracted?

Remind your child to give the road their full attention and not to be distracted by their mobile phone, music player or friends. If cycling, they should always wear their cycle helmet as 50% of injuries to cyclists are to their head. If using public transport, remind them to wait safely for the bus and when disembarking, be aware that traffic cannot see them if they cross near the bus – make the responsible choice and either wait for the bus to move or move away from it to cross safely.


Keeping Fit and Losing Weight
