

Councillors' Page: It has been a busy time again as your County Councillor; lots of road improvements and lots more to come. Like everyone else I hate all the inconvenience and what seems miles of cones with no one in sight!

I attended a Good Neighbour award ceremony in Winchester Great Hall. There were some people from Basingstoke that received the award for being "Good Neighbours", from helping to help groups to individual neighbours. But it struck me that it is a daily occurrence with so many residents in Popley, I was surprised there was no one there. I have met so many people that truly deserve to be nominated. When the time for nominations comes up for next year I will ask if we can put the details in Popley Matters. I also serve on the Hampshire Fire and Rescue Service and was very proud of our Fire Fighters that went out to help the people of Nepal. My heart goes out to all the families who suffered in the terrible earthquake.

The next phase of development in Merton Rise is moving fast and we have pressed for and won more bungalows, more parking and are still asking the developers to do more work on broadband and the drainage system. Popley West: It has been my privilege to be elected Deputy Mayor of Basingstoke and Deane for the next year; it gives me the opportunity to go around the borough and meet lots of groups and people doing charity work. I also hope to help our groups in Popley.

After so many complaints about a private ambulance company setting up an ambulance station in the centre of Popley West with at least 5 vehicles and even more cars, we have at last got a solution and they are now using their base and are not in a residential area totally not suitable to use.

We are still waiting for a decision of the cabinet on the parking in Marnel Park. We are also working for the residents that changed an overgrown piece of council land full of brambles to a lovely garden. The council want £285 to formalise it. Red tape gone mad!

The Everest Park Fibre Campaign is still being hindered in its efforts to get high speed broadband operating in the Everest Park area. The lack of a clear response from BT has proved frustrating for the campaign group who have been resolute in their attempts to get BT to comply with their promises. BT/Openreach are now seven weeks beyond their committed delivery date.

Once again we have experienced the problems of Travellers taking over land in Popley with the resultant mess having to be cleared by the Council after they left. Residents are understandably distressed by this repeated nuisance but we have to follow a legal process to serve notice on the Traveller groups and there is always a clear up required after they leave. Sometimes the land occupied is not BDBC land which further complicates the eviction process. We ask for your support in dealing with these situations.

There is an increasing number of potential appeals against rejections of applications for tree pruning or felling. We are supporting these where appropriate.

Spring Visit to Minsk

As arranged during my autumn visit to Minsk, I stayed with Olga and her giant son, Nazar, who is now just 17 years old, for six weeks. This suits me as the room Nazar has been ejected from for my stay, has a door that leads out onto the balcony so I can have a cigarette when I feel like it!

When I arrived at the end of March it was warm and sunny; this was soon to change! Within a few days it had become colder (+ 1 to + 3 degrees), very windy, which made it feel even colder and changeable. On several occasions I left the flat in bright sunshine, a few hours later when I went out for a cigarette it poured down and then when I met Ira later, it was hurling large hailstones down! I've told the students they're never again allowed to criticise our weather!

I met students at 5 different universities (most of the classes I saw at least twice) and I'd written a mock Employment Tribunal case for all the students at Ira's university where they study law. Ira selected 5 students, who spoke good English, to perform in this performance, and I was the Employment Judge. I was under strict instructions, from Ira, to learn my lines, speak clearly and keep it simple! She insisted on 3 rehearsals before she was satisfied! Despite Ira's constant nagging, mainly at me, it all went well on the day!

I'd arranged to meet a class, but the teacher was taken ill the evening before. She 'phoned me to say I was to start the class and she'd arrive later! On 2 other occasions the teachers vanished and left me to take their classes! This only happened with students I knew.

Before I forget, Ira and Natasha have told me to give their love to everyone they know in Abbey Road.

In Minsk; Inflation is 30% and several of the large factories are only working 3 days a week!

On the last Saturday of my visit Sergei, his girlfriend Larisa, Ira and I all went out for my 'farewell' party at a swish restaurant and I returned home just before 10 pm.

I sat on the bench for a cigarette and a man sat beside me and spoke to me in Russian, which I don't understand. When I went to enter the flats he stood in my way, grabbed my right arm and felt for my wallet! I pushed him away and a young girl neighbour came out and rushed me inside! Fancy being rescued by a young girl? This is the first time, in 20 years, that anything unpleasant has happened to me in Minsk! *Terry Jones*.

Here are some hints, tips and ideas about how to better look after yourself and your family.

Walk To Health

May is National Walking Month, encouraging us all to focus on going for a walk to increase our fitness and improve health. In addition, the month sees Get Walking Week (4-11 May), Walk to Work Week (11-15 May), and Walk to School Week (18-22 May) – so it's a serious topic for May!



Walking is very personal – you can do it as often as you wish, at your own pace, with company or by yourself. And very often it's completely free.

Walking is underrated as a form of exercise, but it's one of the easiest ways to get more activity into your day, lose weight and become healthier.

Research shows that people who fit moderate activity such as walking into their daily life burn more energy

than those who make weekly visits to the gym.

Regular walking has been shown to reduce the risk of chronic illnesses, such as heart disease, type 2 diabetes, asthma, stroke and some cancers.

Try to fit walking into your routine by ditching the car for short journeys, walking all or part of your journey to work, getting off the bus or train one stop early and planning longer walks at the weekends. To reap the health benefits, aim to walk 10,000 steps a day, which can burn up to 400 calories. To keep track of your walking, use a pedometer.

A pair of shoes is all the equipment you really need. Any shoes or trainers that are comfortable, provide adequate support and don't cause blisters will do. Wear loose-fitting clothing that allows you to move freely. Choose thin layers rather than heavy, chunky clothing.

What will be your Digital Legacy? By Michael Le Fort, Head of Wills & Probate

We live in an electronic age and increasingly you are likely to hear or read the phrase 'digital assets'. This phrase is now as assets stored in a digital format, for example, information contained on your computer hard drive or in an online form such as social media profiles, email and online storage facilities ("The Cloud"). As the digital age moves on so more of the population lead paperless lives; this results in an increased need for us Will writers to consider the digital assets of any testator.

Clearly your social media entries are unlikely to have great value save sentimental value. However, other digital assets may be of more worth. Things such as domain names, PayPal and eBay accounts. Without proper thought being applied to such assets there is a real risk of significant financial loss simply because having left no paper trial the executors of any estate would have little idea of the existence of the digital assets.

This is a developing area and as such there are currently limited rules on how such assets are dealt with. Moreover, digital companies can be truly international which makes it almost impossible for authorities here to legislate and control them.

Like everything it is important to make sure that you understand the terms and conditions of the arrangements you enter into with such companies. For example most email accounts are only licensed to you as a user and therefore revert to the service provider after your death.

On a practical level what are the problems that face executors:

- The first is how to identify such assets. Unless the testator has taken the time to bring such assets to the
 attention of their executor it is likely that they may be missed.
- If the existence of such assets is known to the executor how does he or she realise them? Such things as the
 absence of usernames, passwords and pin codes etc. can exclude the executor from the account.
- The international element of such assets means that there can be issues with jurisdictional questions. So for
 example PayPal is registered as a Luxembourg bank and as such the rights of executors may be limited by the
 laws of that country.

There are ways in which to ameliorate these practical issues. A testator can make out a digital assets list and make a note of how to access their various accounts. Such a document can then be placed with the Will and updated from time to time as necessary. However, as a Will is a public document it is not advised to incorporate such information into the Will itself.

This is a rapidly changing aspect of our lives and it is increasingly important when drafting a Will to consider your Digital Legacy.




