

Basingstoke Community Transport has been providing passenger transport services to the Community of Basingstoke and Deane since 1984.

It originally started with just one minibus but it soon became apparent that there was a need for a transport service to support local community groups and their members to be able to get out and about. It was during this time that the early seeds of the Community Transport Sector were being sown.

Today we have a fleet of 16 passenger vehicles of which 3 of them are cars and are fully accessible to provide for passengers with boarding difficulties and the carriage of wheel chair passengers.

During this time we have transported more the 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ million people to activities, meetings, outings and places of interest bringing joy and a smile to many faces.

From those early days we (BCT) and the Community Transport Sector have come a long way, in service delivery, accessible minibus design, quality and understanding our members and passengers needs.

We hope and plan to be about for some time yet delivering good quality services to our community. And now, back by popular demand, we have our car scheme in operation which offers the more mobile citizens of the community to travel to their desired destinations.

Councillors' Page: I have again reported that the traffic lights at bottom of Don Allen Drive are not in sequence and constantly causing cars to stop there when there is no need. The work to make it a safer crossing should start soon, if all the yellow, blue and white markings are anything to go by?

Roadworks continue and seem never ending. I, like many other residents and motorists, will be glad when they are completed, but I fear it is a few months yet

before all the work is done.

The works on the expansion of Marnel Infant and Junior schools are progressing well. The staff, children, parents and governors are really pleased with the finished parts of Merton Infant and Junior schools

Popley West: We met residents of Magnolia Court, Abbey Court and users of The Community Transport, Sentinel and a Basingstoke and Deane transport officer to talk about issues with The Community Transport. It was so good to be able to help and get satisfactory outcomes. We also talked about trying to get a service that could get residents from one end of Popley to the other. It is really hard for people to get to the doctors and back again. Stagecoach refuse to provide a route. It could take time to set up but as we have been trying for many years to, wait a few months to get a service will be worth it!

We have asked that the Popley Community Park get repairs to the paths, hedge cutting and the blocked drain that is causing flooding repaired. We have also asked that the tree near Don Allen Drive be cut back as it overhangs the path and it means people have to walk in the road. We will bring this problem to the Community Neighbourhood Group at the next meeting to get regular maintenance there.

A wet play facility or splash pad will replace the paddling pool. All being well the work should be completed by the end of March/early April 2016, which will mean this facility will be available for children during the summer period. Likewise the works proposed to the entrance at Chineham Park and Tewkesbury Close open space, with landscaping, improved signage and cycling facilities across both sites, should be completed by the end of March.

We have experienced a spate of low level vandalism throughout Popley East recently including damage to bus shelters and fencing. We all care about the area and the motives of those who destroy things are difficult to understand.

In the end the community pays for the repairs which are carried out so anything we can do to discourage this vandalism and make reports where possible will be a good thing.

We hope to find out by the end of January who will be running the Bermuda and Marlowe Surgery over the years ahead.

The tenders for the new contract are being assessed and David has been involved in some parts of this evaluation.

Dear Friends

Ever heard of a place in Wales called EGLWYSWRW? (I may need some help with pronunciation!) Anyhow, this small town in Pembrokeshire has had 82 days of continuous rainfall. Not a dry day since 25th October but yet the record is held by Islay in Scotland – 89 days of continuous rainfall. As poor as the weather has been over the last month or so you have to say 'that's wet!' It's certainly reminiscent of the story of Noah and the Great Flood!

We had a fab time in Messy Church just last Friday (15th Jan) with lots of children and families. Our theme just happened to be the story of Noah and the Great Flood. The children had a marvelous time making animal masks, Noah's Ark and some very colourful rainbows. We then moved onto the story itself and I tried to draw, with some very willing young helpers a picture of what Noah may have looked like. After several restarts it became clear that my attempts were quite comical – but then I'm no cartoonist – in the end we settled on one produced by the children themselves.

We then went on to talk about New Year's Resolutions; what they are and why we make them. They are, as many of the children knew, promises to ourselves to change something in our lives in a positive way for the coming year. So we may promise to give up smoking, get fit, watch less TV, work harder at our relationships, be better stewards of our finances and so on. Sadly they don't often last too long!

The point I was making to them was that with drawing a picture there's always the opportunity to begin again, to start over and so it is with God! With Him there is always the opportunity for a new beginning no matter where, or in what situation we may find ourselves.

What about the story of Noah? When God saw the selfishness and self-centeredness of his people, when He saw the violence and the lack of care that dominated their lives; when He saw their lack of respect and understanding for one another and for Him He decided enough was enough and sent the flood, saving only Noah and his family and each pair of animal species. At the end of the flood He made a promise to himself and to Noah that never again would He destroy what He had made and a sign of this promise set a rainbow in the sky. They are a constant reminder of His faithfulness to His promise.



Are you doing enough to plan for the future? By Zoë McManus Solicitor, Wills & Probate team

Despite the increasingly complicated nature of our modern families and financial situations, over two thirds of people in the UK have still never made a Will. There is a tendency to put this subject to the back of our minds and say "That's not something I need right now". This unfortunately ignores the importance of a Will and the consequences of not having such a document in place.

The law sets out clear rules for what happens to your estate and who your assets pass to if you die without a Will. It is therefore very important that you make a Will so your assets may pass to those you would wish to benefit. The importance of writing a will is even more pressing if you have children or other family members who depend on you financially, or if you wish to leave gifts to people outside your immediate family. A well-structured Will can also help address any potential concerns regarding Inheritance Tax that you may have.

Making a Will gives you the opportunity to make certain your family are aware of your wishes and allows them to handle your estate sensitively during a difficult time. It allows you to appoint specific people, known as your Executors, to administer your estate and ensure the terms of your Will are followed.

When considering your wishes for later life, it can also be a good time to think about what would happen if you were to lose mental capacity. One in three over-65s now suffer from dementia and this can pose a real issue for loved ones who may be helpless to assist you. Currently, if you lose capacity and are unable to deal with your finances or make decisions then your friends or relatives have no choice but to make a costly and time consuming application to the Courts in order to be able to deal with matters on your behalf. To avoid this, you can make a choice to create a Lasting Power of Attorney (LPA) nominating a family member or trusted friend to look after your affairs if you lose capacity.

There are two types of LPA. The Property and Affairs LPA allows your Attorney to deal with your finances, including paying household bills, managing bank accounts and collecting any income or benefits. The second type focuses on your health and welfare and gives your Attorney the authority to make decisions about your person such as where you might live and your day to day care.

Superfast Broadband Update

The two new Superfast Fibre Broadband cabinets serving Everest and Marnel Parks went live at the beginning of December as forecast in the last update. Each are capable of serving just under 300 properties but BT Openreach initially provide them with circuitry for around a sixth of that, 48 lines, and add further blocks as demand dictates. Unfortunately this initial capacity at Everest Park sold out in just over two days, highlighting built up demand, and at Marnel Park in around 10 days. When this happens most broadband providers such asBT, Sky and TalkTalk simply say fibre is not available, which is not strictly true and may be confusing.

BT Openreach have since added extra capacity for Everest Park so residents there are able to order again through their preferred service provider; at the time of writing Marnel Park was still waiting for extra capacity to be added. Properties elsewhere in Popley may also experience the same issue from time to time as BT follow the same procedures with all cabinets. If you're told by your supplier that fibre is not available, visit dslchecker.bt.com to confirm the status.

These two cabinets were only enabled as a result of campaigning, so thank you to everyone who assisted and supported the campaign including our local councillors, and County Councillor, Jane Frankum.

Whilst much of Popley also has the option of Virgin Media, there are a number of properties which haven't been cabled in previous rollouts. It's therefore worth pointing out that households who currently don't have the option of cable may benefit from the £3bn Project Lightning expansion over the next few years which aims to infill many areas. This rollout is demand-led so if interested, search for Virgin Media Cable My Street, and fill in their registration form to significantly improve the chance of being covered.
