

Councillors' Page: It is a really hard time for so many people and the savage cuts to funding are hitting the most needy, including Children's Centres, NHS and now cuts to funding in pharmacies. Abbey Road Pharmacy is a small independent business that will be hit by this proposal. The pharmacist told me he may not be able to function and it could cause them to close. There is a petition in the shop and there are already nearly 1,000 signatures so if you value this service please go there and sign or sign the one on social media. There is also a petition to stop cuts to closing of ten of the eleven Children's Centres in the shop too.

After years of campaigning, I am happy to say that Hampshire County Council have secured that up to date Broadband facilities will be built into new developments. Thank you to Basingstoke Broadband Campaigners on Facebook for your incredible work and support to make this a reality. **Popley West:** On 18th March we took the new Executive Director on a tour of Popley West and pointed out places where we felt improvements were needed including the state of the area, parking, and including landscaping. We also met with some residents at St Gabriel's, Everest Community Fitness and health and Nick Price Principal of Everest Community Academy.

There have been several contacts made to us about a few people parking on corners and opposite road junctions. This is not only illegal but, more importantly, dangerous as it makes it almost impossible to see oncoming traffic and is a hazard to pedestrians. We have also had complaints about dog fouling and people not picking up the mess. The complaints come mainly from dog owners who are frustrated that just a few people don't clear up the mess when clearly most owners do.

Some replacement trees are being planted around Abbey Road. They will be smaller, not close to houses and much more manageable and appropriate.

Its looks like the gas people will be in the estate for some months while they upgrade the gas supply system.

Cllr Paul Frankum 01256 819924 cllr.paul.frankum@basingstoke.gov.uk Popley East: Currently, we are involved in the campaign to prevent the closure of Pebbles Children's Centre, Shakespeare Road. Hampshire County Council is proposing to shut 10 out of 11 of Basingstoke's Children's Centres including Pebbles which offers a vital lifeline to many parents in Popley and elsewhere. HCC is undertaking a consultation exercise which ends on 3 May 2016 and a final decision about the extent of closures will be taken at a later date. A number of petitions are being organised and we are urging everyone who cares about the wellbeing of young children and their parents to get involved in the campaign to stop the closures.

The impact of closure on the Popley community will be immense.

The range of services provided by Children's Centres is not always known and these services for children under five and their families help them to make the most of life's opportunities, whatever their background or circumstances.

The implications for staff will also be severe with as many as 60 % losing their jobs.

These staff offer social, educational, mental and physical support to parents and children.

The County Council is talking about keeping one centre open in Basingstoke where a much reduced and limited service will be on offer. This centre is likely to be miles away from Popley and inaccessible to most existing users.





#### **Popley Based Girl Power...Boat Racer??**

I am a successful Offshore Powerboat Racer, and am a girl on a mission to get more recognition for female athletes and girl participation in what is commonly thought of as a male dominated sport within the motor sport sphere. As I'm based in Popley it would be great to gather some local support for our upcoming racing campaign and thought it may make a nice story for the Popley Matters publication? Here's a summary of my story:

"Growing up I was a bit of a tearaway, the only thing that kept me on the straight and narrow was horse riding. Then after a family dispute following my GCSEs, I left home (although the truth is my parents threw me out) and I spent a year sofa surfing. It wasn't until I enrolled on a Prince's Trust program and went to a careers day where I came across a British Army Recruitment stand. Being renowned for not one to take well to discipline and authority my friends joked that I wouldn't 'dare' join the Army. This sparked my competitive side and I think, maybe subconsciously, I knew I needed some discipline. Whisked away to Army Training 2 months later, after my 18th birthday, I found myself on the frontline in Iraq. This was followed by subsequent tours of Afghanistan where sadly I was injured which led to my discharge in 2013 and moved to Basingstoke in 2014 for employment reasons.

I was then introduced to P1 Powerboat Racing at a corporate sponsorship day. Having no boating experience (less for a mackerel trip when I was young and the odd ferry journey to the Isle of Wight!) I was then invited to attend mandatory race training with the prospect of being a reserve driver in the P1 150 series for the Mission Motor sport team. On a full course of men with 7 times World Champion Powerboat Racer Neil Holmes, I was heckled by the other students for not knowing my port from my starboard and of course for being stereotyped as a woman



who can't drive nor read a map! The course has a 70% attrition rate with the majority of attendees having to go back for more training. I was shocked and secretly smug when on the final day it was announced I was the only one to pass. Mission Motorsport

had no choice but to sit me in the boat for the series' toughest 35nm offshore race from Cowes on the Isle of Wight to Poole then back to Cowes only a few days later.

Given that our sport relies heavily on teamwork for the two man crew to succeed, my driver and I only met each other on the day of the race so we were not predicted to do well. In fact it would be an achievement if we were to just finish the race. Against the odds, I navigated us to the team's best ever result with a podium finish of 3rd. From this moment I was hooked.

Then the 150 series folded and Mission Motorsport announced they would not be able to step up to the larger 250 class. An amazing experience but I thought that was the end of my

short lived powerboat racing career. Until I was scouted by ex-champion John Wilson to step up and co-pilot for him in the bigger class.

In 2013 we were leading the championship and, unfortunately, suffered disqualification followed by getting thrown out of the boat in one weekend which put us right back down the pack. Relatively unscathed (black eye, chipped tooth and dented pride) we made a comeback at the next event with an outstanding winning weekend achieving top in 4 out of the 5 races. We finished overall 3rd in the season and I was awarded 2013 P1 Sports Personality of the Year.

In 2014 we were on track to win the Championship with a 7 point lead going into the final round in Gosport. Then in a cruel twist of fate, at the start of the second race our gearbox went and we missed out on precious points due to this DNF (Did Not Finish). This left us with another 3rd place overall in the 2014 Championship.

Last year we had a disappointing first round due to engine failures but by the penultimate round in Cardiff we were back at the top of the Championship until another boat collided into us which resulted in disqualification, despite not being at fault. This incident was critical as due to the tight space in the bay, we were racing in heats and the lack of points meant we could only qualify for the 'Plate Final' where the highest result to be achieved can be 4th. Despite a phenomenal winning final round in Bournemouth, racing in some of the roughest conditions our series has seen to date, we were unable to recover from the tragedy endured in Cardiff and finished 2nd overall.

Following the close of the UK season my former team mate, John Wilson announced his retirement after we were invited to race in the closing round of the US series in Tavares, Florida. In a boat we had never seen and that its previous team deemed to be slow, we went out and shown the Americans how its done and won the weekend. A fantastic close to John and my 3 year partnership.

Since then our Team Manager, Sam Coleman (my brother) has stepped up to the mark and will be racing with me. Already hotlisted as one to watch, he achieved his race training in record time for someone from a non-boating background. With guest drives in the Visit Wales backed boat contributing to their overall 3rd place Championship finish and achieving 2nd place in his second ever race, we're going to be a force to be reckoned with in 2016 with aspirations to race both sides of the pond in the UK and USA so watch this space!"

I thank you for taking the time to read my story. I've attached some pics and a copy of our latest sponsorship proposal for info. Don't worry we're not after money (unless this is an avenue you'd like to explore given our sport is fully televised globally with an excellent

brand reach) but I thought it is a nice summary of our sport and what we have to offer. I look forward to hearing from you and do hope you'd be able to help with my campaign to get more women into sport and some local support behind us!

## Double joy as Charlie finds his forever home and is reunited with his first owner

In July 2015 Cats Protection's Basingstoke & District Branch received a call about two cats that had been left behind after their owners had been evicted. With a bit of detective work, they tracked down their owners and they signed them over to the branch.



Gayna Ballard, Branch Co-ordinator said: "We decided it would be best to home the cats separately. Stella soon found a home but poor Charlie didn't have much luck. Twice we thought we'd found the perfect home but each time it fell through. Then in November, we had a call from a lady called Debbie who was looking for an older cat, and Charlie had caught her eye. They were the perfect match and he settled in straight away.

"When Debbie's sister-in-law, Michelle, met Charlie she couldn't believe her eyes. It turned out Charlie was her cat Sox, who had gone missing five years earlier! They compared photos and he had the same face, eyes, markings and character. When Michelle called his name, he started rubbing himself round her legs. Isn't that incredible?!"

Sox wasn't microchipped by Michelle, so unfortunately she couldn't be traced. He is microchipped now, thankfully, so if he did ever go missing he could be reunited with his new owner, Debbie. It certainly demonstrates the importance of microchipping.

Thousands of cats go missing every year and research conducted by Cats Protection found that almost half never return, so the charity recommends microchipping

as a safe and permanent method of identification. The charity reunites 3,000 cats with their owners every year across the UK.

Microchips contain a unique identification number and are inserted under the cat's skin between their shoulder blades. The number is linked to a database containing details of the pet, as well as the owner's contact details. When a scanner detects the microchip, a simple phone call can ascertain the owner's details and the pet can then be quickly returned home.

"However, it is very important pet owners keep their details up to date, so owners should check their certificate which will tell them how to do this," said Gayna.

#### Collaborative law: a better way to separate

Rob Parker, family solicitor at Phillips, explains 'collaborative law', an alternative approach to sorting out family disputes that is increasingly being taken up around North Hampshire.

#### Why collaborative law now?

The way family law works in England is changing: the legal system is developing from an adversarial approach to a more collaborative approach which brings the separating couples together to agree matters of importance.

#### How does collaborative law work?

The collaborative process deals with family disputes in a non-confrontational way. Both parties instruct

their own specially-trained collaborative lawyers and everyone agrees to abide by the Participation Agreement. This means that:

- Neither party should, where possible, go over past events
- The children and their welfare must be the priority
- · There should be complete transparency in dealings with financial matters
- All discussions are regarded as "privileged", which means they cannot be brought up later in a subsequent court case

Both parties and the lawyers will sign the agreement. Matters are then resolved in a series of 'four-way' meetings involving both parties and their solicitors, all in one room together.

#### Is it suitable for everything?

Not all situations will suit collaborative law, such as where there has been domestic abuse or a party is not willing to be honest and transparent.

#### How does collaborative law differ from mediation or going to court?

Mediation is a voluntary process where both parties sit in the same room as the mediator who is impartial and who is not there to give legal advice. You must both agree on solutions or there is no agreement. During the confidential sessions the mediator will help you and your former partner to identify all the issues that need to be resolved and reach a settlement that is acceptable to both of you.

With collaborative law you each have your own solicitor to represent your interests, important in cases where one party may feel less confident about how to address matters. Your solicitor is also on hand to give you legal advice at all times, including during the face-to-face negotiations.

Whilst in mediation and collaborative law the couple arrives at the agreements themselves if you go through the court process, a judgment will be imposed on you by a third party (ie a judge).

#### Why does collaborative law work?

It works because it's non-confrontational and you will be dealing with competent, trained lawyers who are sympathetic, approachable and understand what you are going through. The priority is to resolve matters your way, not how the lawyers think it should be.

#### What's the best possible outcome?

Resolving matters through collaborative law can be quicker, cheaper and more dignified.

Where there are children matters can be to resolved in a calm way to retain an agreeable, working relationship as co-parents in the future.
