

Councillors' Page: Sadly there are even more cuts and changes to many of the services with Hampshire County Council. The vulnerable and the elderly taking the brunt of the cuts within the Adult services. Many people will be asked to pay for services that up to now have been free. I and our Labour Councillors will fight these cuts.

I am working with the three Labour Councillors for Norden to get safer road crossing by Oakridge Infant and Junior School, especially with the proposed expansion. We have brought to the attention of the Education Department that when the new houses are built on the old Eli Lily site that is ludicrous to make the Winklebury schools their catchment area. Norden Councillors have walked the route and it could take up to an hour to walk for the little ones. We want a safe crossing from Popley along Upper Sherborne Road that some Popley children use and also those that go to the Vyne. These two issues are vital and need solutions.

Popley West: Work has started in Melrose Hall kitchen and we hope that there will be a lot more happening soon. The committee have been working hard with the council to improve and expand the hall and of course offer bigger, more varied and better facilities.

With the warm (we hope) weather for summer; we tend to leave our windows and doors open. Please remember that not all people like the same type of music or TV programme so be aware and don't have things too loud. But by the same token, children do love to play outside and will sometimes be noisy. Children need to let off steam but try to compromise and live happily together.

We have contacted Sentinel about the broken walls and steps in Fountains and Tintern Close. The broken wall bricks will be removed and steps made safe. We have asked for railings where the constant broken brick walls keep on crumbling. The older part of Popley needs, and should get, attention and we will be campaigning to get the area improved.

We've had several issues reported to us including pavements that require repair, potholes and fly tipping to name just a few. The Borough Council have responded promptly and ensured that incidents of fly tipping have been quickly dealt with. Hampshire County Council have agreed that the road and path repairs that we have highlighted do need rectification, however they are working through a list and it may take a little time. We will continue to monitor progress. We are pleased to report that work is progressing well on the Chineham Park Splash Pad on Shakespeare Road and there is an official opening planned for 21st June which will be great timing with the summer holidays approaching.

It is also good to see that Popley Fields Community Centre building has now had the solar panels fitted to the roof using the grant monies provided by BDBC. It has taken a while but by working together we have got there!

Watching the match I was struck by the how many of the supporters were dressed in the most ridiculous outfits, how many of them had painted their faces or dyed their hair in their team's colours and how they competed with each to sing their national anthem the loudest with their hands placed on their chests over their hearts. It was a display of real passion, repeated over many games.

It's the same over the build up to the Queen's 90th Birthday celebration weekend. People all dressed up, dancing around and generally celebrating the magnificent achievement of 90 years of Her Majesty's life and service to the country – and rightly so.



Adults too – we join clubs or buy particular things because of their association with belonging, being included rather excluded.

Where does this urge to belong come from? I suppose if I was a supporter of Darwin's theories I might say it's an inherited pack or herd instinct! But I'm not! I believe that God created us to be in community with one another. The Bible tells us that when God created the Garden of Eden and placed Adam in it, even though Adam had all he could need he was still lonely and so God created a companion for him in Eve. God created us to be in community but that also brings with it responsibility. The Bible also tells us we are to look out for, and care for each other.

One of things I love about Popley is the strong sense of community and common identity, reflected in last month's Popley Festival – it makes us who we are!

When we fail to care for the frail, the weak or the vulnerable in our community or when we ignore the needs of others and put ourselves first the truth is that we gain nothing and diminish the whole community. You may not feel that you are a Christian or a churchgoer but we still all have a God given responsibility to care. The Bible says 'Love the Lord your God with all your heart and love your neighbour as yourself' Food for thought in these uncertain times.

Wow what a busy couple of months the Cubs have had with loads of activities that have put the out into Sc**OUT**ing.

The 2nd May Bank Holiday saw fourteen Cubs head off to Youlbury Scout Activity Centre near Oxford, to join fifty

other Cubs from Basingstoke East Scout District for the annual District Cub Camp on the theme of 'Jungle Fever'. Activities over the weekend included going on an African Photo Safari, where the Cubs had to undertake a different tasks for each country visited to earn a "photo" of wild animal to colour in. Tasks included getting the whole team through a "Spiders Web" without touching the sides of the web and building a mini-hide to hold mini versions of themselves to enable them to photograph a springbok.





Cubs took part in a "Bush Tucker Trial" where they attempted to eat dried insects as well sweet insects and face painting.

They also challenged themselves on Jacob's Ladder and Aerial Trek with some of them overcoming a fear of height.

Camp also had the usual campfire where we were joined by a Guide unit from Swindon.

The Crime Reading Group will meet as normal in August, but CHIPPS are taking a break. Colour and Create is also meeting on 6th July, at 2-4pm, and then taking a break for the summer. You are very welcome to attend any of these meetings, and to obtain further information from staff.
