

Football Scheme Scores High with Borough's Teenagers

A new free football scheme to develop the potential of young people in the borough has kicked off in Popley.

Working with Reading Football Club and Hampshire Constabulary, Basingstoke and Deane Borough Council has officially launched Kicks – a new and exciting initiative for 11 to 19 year olds.

The free weekly sessions take place at Everest Community Academy and use the appeal of football and a professional football club to work with teenagers to promote safer, strong and more respectful communities.

And the sessions are already proving popular with around 25 young people regularly attending.

The Mayor Cllr Jane Frankum said: "This is a fantastic opportunity for young people in the borough to attend a regular after school or college session and be taught by top coaches for free, while meeting new people and taking part in an activity that is both healthy and enjoyable."

Reading Football Club's Social Inclusion Officer Paul Brown said: "It is great to be able to expand the successful Kicks project into Basingstoke. The project provides young people, aged 11 to 19 years old, with a safe and structured opportunity to engage with free football sessions. The project helps to being young people from all backgrounds and cultures together and this will only help the communities we work in both short and long term. The project has had great success in engaging with huge numbers of young people over the years and we are looking forward to providing these opportunities to young people living in the Basingstoke area."

Teenagers wishing to take part can simply turn up and play on the artificial pitch at Everest Community Academy in Oxford Way from 4.30pm to 6pm every Tuesday.

Councillors' Page: The responsibility for the safe disposal of redundant fridges and freezers rests with the manufacturers who have been required to set up a scheme to collect and deal with them. Hampshire County Council has continued to accept appliances at their waste centres for collection and disposal through this scheme. The national scheme has ground to a halt because of inadequate re-processing capacity, a machinery failure at one plant, and very limited storage organised by the manufacturers scheme so has left the county with hundreds of fridges and freezers, Until the Manufacturers act to resolve this, HCC have already 2,500 fridges, and the scheme's 'emergency' collections have not happened. They continue build up and HCC are asking people to call in advance to make sure they can accept the fridge/freezer to avoid being turned away. I am disappointed that HCC let it get so late before warning residents!

After the flooding again in Popley Park, I had Highways look at finding a long term solution. There is only one gully and it is agreed that it cannot cope, especially with all the new housing. Popley West: The new Community Transport bus, Popley 55, started in October. We tried for many years to get a service that will link the Popleys to make it possible to get directly to the doctors from the Abbeys and to the hospital from Poets. The new route timetable will be in next month's issue as some negotiations are still in progress. We hope the route is a success and that residents use the service. A resident called and asked if we thought that other residents in Popley would be interested in forming a group that could do clean ups on the estate. I believe Kempshott do this once a month. If anyone is interested could they contact me and I will pass on your details to him. It could be useful when we have snow and ice as some residents are not able to clear it from their paths.

We had a report of massive amounts of rubbish and waste around the recycling bins in the car park by the Abbey Road shops. Most of it was not recycling but waste. We had it cleared within hours but we hope that most people will not abuse the facility and dispose of waste properly.

As a result we have been pressurising the Borough for some time to undertake extra works in addition to their normal programme and are pleased to say that agreement was reached.

These works started on 10th October and continued for the week during which time the Grounds Maintenance team trimmed up hedges, particularly those that are situated alongside footpaths, cleared weeds from within the planting beds and pruned back the shrubs. They also undertook a programme of litter picking and general street cleaning with residents invited to get involved. Thank you to everyone who helped.

We have also arranged for works to be undertaken to the trees that are overhanging the footpath along Shakespeare Road and expect this to be done in the next week or so.

Finally just a reminder that the splashpad has now closed for the winter. We are working closely with the Borough Council to review what improvements can be made in terms of parking and toilet facilities before it reopens next Easter. We will keep you updated.





Haiti Hurricane Relief

As you will all have seen through the news channels, Hurricane Matthew, the most powerful Caribbean storm in a decade has had a devastating effect upon Haiti.

According to the UN Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs, there are an estimated 350,000 people in need of assistance.

80% of buildings have been destroyed and sadly the death toll is already over 900 and expected to rise. The already very poor sanitation system has been totally overwhelmed by flooding. A cholera epidemic spread by contaminated water has already killed 6,000 people since the earthquake hit Haiti in 2010 and will kill many more now.

Members of Lions Clubs of the British Isles and Ireland are coordinating with our Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF) and it has been agreed to supply water treatment equipment directly to help the people of Haiti. Clean water is one of their greatest needs.

The Basingstoke Lions Club will be making an initial donation of £500 and I'm sure that our friends in the other 65 local Clubs will be doing their bit too.

Dear Friends

It may well be that by the time you read this the ashes of Bonfire Night will have cooled and all the fireworks will have been set off, except maybe for that big one you're saving for New Year's Eve! I remember Bonfire Night as a boy in Manchester as a time of wonderful community. For weeks beforehand, the boys in the neighbourhood would all be out every spare moment gathering bits of wood (or anything else that would burn) and piling it onto the bonfire in the field near where we lived. Competition for "penny for the guy" would be fierce among the children as we scrabbled for the best pitch – usually outside the pub!

On Bonfire Night we'd rush home from school to get changed and gather around the pile of wood and stuff. As it was lit and the flames reached hungrily into the cool of the November evening air, fireworks of every colour shape and size would crackle and flare, lighting the faces of adults and children alike with their bright, eerie colours. We'd share 'hard as rock' treacle toffee, toffee apples and potatoes baked to charcoal in the intense heat at the edge of the bonfire. As the bonfire died down, we children would wander home to bed and the grown ups would sit around the glowing red embers swapping tall stories and drinking warm, flat beer! The next day the air would be thick with bonfire and firework smoke and the lingering smell of expended gunpowder. For me Bonfire Night conjures up very pleasant, powerful and evocative memories.

Community is a vital part of what it is to be human. I'm not talking just about the social gatherings like Bonfire Night which are usually such great fun! It's the sense of community that takes pride in its surroundings, which cares for the vulnerable individual whether old or young, rich or poor, which takes the time to smile, to greet, to look in on someone. In fact it's the community that God created us to be a part of, and to take part in! Unless we all buy in to this idea of community it will never be as it should and that diminishes all of us!

As a Christian I firmly believe that we at St Gabriel's are called to be a people that reflect the nature and character of Jesus to our community. Jesus was the Master of caring and sharing, listening and talking with those among whom he lived and worked each day. I hope that His example and desire today for true community is what forms the heart of our vision for our church and for Popley. If this is what you are looking for in a community we would love to welcome you any time you want to drop in.

I hope and pray that you have a funtastic and safe bonfire night, shared with family and friends and one that in future years will evoke pleasant and powerful memories for you.




They have also challenged themselves to think about what it would be like to be an animal in the zoo by asking themselves "What would animals in the zoo dream about?"
