

## **Big Help Music**

The current Miss Basingstoke, Nicola Ascroft, a finalist in this year's Miss England, is featured in fellow finalist Rheo Parnell's forthcoming music video for an internationally distributed Charity Christmas single called "Our World".

The music video for the track was directed by award-winning director Jack Van Spall from Mountain Pictures and was filmed in a variety of diverse locations across the country. One of the locations featured 55 Miss England Finalists sporting shiny gold catsuits, made all the more sparkly on the hottest day of the year in July.

The song "Our World" was produced by Big Help Music which is the leading Artist Development, Management and Recording Company in the UK, and was written by professional songwriter and former "That's Life" crew member, Michael Groth. The song was originally written for internationally acclaimed band U2, but it was never used on their album. "Our World" tells the extremely pertinent story of growing environmental breakdown, of the increasing extremes in weather and climate, and of social and political unrest on the planet. The song calls for the human race to work together in these difficult times.

The proceeds from "Our World" will raise money for the Miss England and Miss World affiliated charity "Beauty With A Purpose". The charity works to improve the lives of sick, disabled and disadvantaged children throughout the UK and worldwide. Funds raised through "Beauty With A Purpose" are re-invested in the towns and communities who raised them. The star of the song Rheo Elyse, who holds the title of Miss Coventry and Warwickshire, has been performing the song, at Miss England events throughout the UK and "Our World" will also be promoted at the Miss World Finals this December in Washington DC (USA).

Big Help record company boss, Dutch Van Spall said, "This is by far one of the most ambitious videos we have ever made. Having access to all 55 Miss England finalists added some spectacular images and all of the girls have been incredibly supportive throughout the production process, which has had its challenges. We are very proud of the finished product and we hope it is well received by the British public. We have yet to see how successful we will be in the charts and we are realistic enough to realize we are up against some of the fiercest competition of the year. However, that is not our main aim. Raising awareness and funds for Beauty With A Purpose is the present we are hoping for this Christmas!"

**Councillors' Page:** I had the Highways Officer look at the flooding problems in the Popley Community Park and she has agreed that one small drain is not enough to cope with all the new continuing development; the issue is on the list for funding. St Bede's had a flood in the church and they are dealing with that.

I have asked for a no U-turn at the Chineham end of Popley. It is dangerous to turn here and has had some near misses; all this to save just a few seconds. Is it worth injuries or risking a fatality?

With the winter comes the snow and ice. Can I remind the few people that take the salt and grit from the bins provided to do your own paths that you are using it inappropriately as it is for the roads and highways that are owned by Highways and is there to make it safer to drive and get to work. **Popley West:** A very happy Christmas and a happy and propurous New Year to all our residents in Popley.

Thank you to everyone who came to the Remembrance service. Merton School Choir sang Peace, Perfect Peace beautifully. They will sing again at the Mayor's Carol Concert and we have readings by the Head Girl and Boy at Everest Community Academy and a solo by Carla from Everest. All are welcome on 10th December from 7 pm at St Michael's Church.

The parking in all parts of Popley is about as bad as we have seen in the 45 years we have lived here. There are many more cars to a lot of the houses so you need to think safe. My main concern is the safety, especially when cars park across dropped kerbs and when they almost block the paths so residents have to walk on a busy road. Please think of other people when you park. Marnel Park is being looked at to extend the yellow lines. It is at the courtesy of the Police that you can park on the highway. I have been told that this government is going to extend the law from outside London where it is illegal to park on paths and there is a traffic order to enforce it. So far most of Popley, and indeed Basingstoke and Deane, does not have traffic orders.

We believe it will go forward for decision in January/ February 2017. We oppose the application but do not know as yet whether it will be recommended for approval or not. We will encourage public opposition against the application and will notify the public of the Development Control Committee meeting when we know it. You will be able to speak about the application at the meeting if you wish to but you will have to be registered to do so. Please look out for information and we will use social media as necessary.

The elevated play areas at Sark Way have been the cause of many problems for residents and we are working with Council officers to design some improvements. Some of the anti-social behaviour problems relate to ball games and the like but it has to be recognised that the area was provided to allow children to play safely in a central area.

We intend to consult with residents on a range of issues to see if there is any common agreement on preferred solutions. Please look out for this.





#### **Basingstoke Volunteer Recruitment Fair**

On Wednesday 2nd November Basingstoke Volunteer Centre organised a Volunteer Recruitment Fair inside the Discovery Centre: 18 organisations took Voluntary Action part and showcased their voluntary roles to visitors to the event. Although a short day (10am - 2pm) this was a bonus to organisations running tables

with volunteers, making it easier to staff a table, and with some good marketing via social media beforehand, there were people turning up early trying to find out about volunteering! The event was busy, especially in the first couple of hours and initial feedback indicates that most organisations had between 6 and 20 visitors to their tables and all registered the details of some potential volunteers, with 25% expecting to recruit between 6 and 10 new volunteers. Feedback from organisations included, "It had a relaxed feel and it was good to have it in a public setting" and "The quality of people that came to the event was good".

Sarah Robinson from Basingstoke Volunteer Centre was delighted with how the event went: "The Mayor of Basingstoke and Deane, Cllr Jane Frankum, attended with the Deputy Mayor, Cllr Paul Frankum, and met the organisations, discussing their needs for new volunteers, and Cllr Simon Bound, Cabinet member for Communities and Community Safety also came to the fair, discussing partnership working between organisations. The event was a great opportunity to network and find ways of working together. This was our first recruitment event for some time - previously we have held events in more public areas but this incurred a huge cost, or required a lot of time commitment from organisations; partnering with the Discovery Centre to run this event has been an exciting new development for us and we hope to run similar events more frequently in future."

Changes to how volunteering opportunities are advertised in Basingstoke and Deane Until recently, the Volunteer Centre would advertise voluntary opportunities via various media, including the Do-it website – a national volunteering site, but we have recently developed a new local website that covers opportunities in North Hampshire only. We are now working in partnership with Hart and Rushmoor Volunteer centres and we intend to provide an improved service for both organisations and volunteers through the partnership working, and better volunteer data information for organisations. Therefore, we will no longer be using Do-it to promote volunteering and instead use our new Volunteer North Hampshire website.

I have been working at St. Michael's Home Care for a year now but I have worked in care for 17 years in total. The children, who were all dressed for extremely chilly weather, sang the hymn 'Peace, Perfect Peace' beautifully and were as always a true reflection of Merton


Junior School. They also laid a wreath of hand-made poppies that had been created by some of the pupils as a fitting tribute to our
