

Last year, Basingstoke Volunteer Centre developed a new website <u>www.</u> <u>volunteernorthhants.org</u> to replace our use of the Do-it website. We also increased our outreach events and were featured by the then Mayor, Cllr Jane Frankum in her Charity Appeal for people to contribute time and money to make a difference. We've found an increasing number of people are starting to use our new site, but it's even more encouraging to see that the numbers of people who are being placed has increased by almost 50%. Last month, we met with the local councillors to discuss issues and share information. This was very interesting as we found out lots of information regarding the community that we were not aware of. We plan to make this a regular occurrence because it was so successful!

Last week was Op Liberal week. This focuses on rogue traders and doorstep crime in which we revisited previous victims to see how they were getting on, and patrolled the streets that have been targeted in the past. These crimes involve people coming to your door and offering you services for an extortionate amount of money. 

Whatever or wherever we find ourselves Jesus knows us and is alongside us ready and waiting to share with us.

The trouble is, left unchecked the weeds can choke the life out of the flowers and so, sadly, I need to take action in order to save the flowers! Maybe we'll leave just a little patch of weeds to serve as a reminder and to help the wildlife! God too acted to prevent the weeds of circumstance and situation choking the life out of you – He sent his son Jesus to live, to die and to be raised again for you. However, this was not going to stop George, instead it led to a renewed motivation to make a comeback and he enjoyed a very lucky 7 years in the English Premiership and the Heineken Cup with London Wasps and London Irish.

My Summer Holiday Application Was Refused! What Are My Options?

Annual leave requests come thick and fast for employers over the summer months. Balancing the needs of the company and those of employees who have to deal with childcare arrangements over the school holidays can be challenging. So what are your rights if you need time off?

Gill Brown, Head of the Employment Team at Phillips Solicitors has the answers.

Can your employer refuse your holiday request?

The simple answer to that is yes it can. Every employee is entitled to a minimum of their statutory holiday of 28 days inclusive of the eight bank/public holidays if they work on a five day per week basis – pro rata for different working patterns. Contrary to the general belief there is no statutory right to actually have any bank/public holidays off work although this is often contractual. Employers are actually entitled to designate when holiday has to be taken.

For example, it is legal for a company to have a shutdown period when holiday must be taken or to designate a busy period when no holiday may be taken at all. Many companies only grant holiday requests on a first come first served basis to ensure cover in every department. If you are refused holiday for one of these reasons you need to check what the provisions are in your contract of employment and check that the company has a clear and transparent holiday usage policy, which it is operating fairly and without discrimination. Simply granting time off on a grace and favour basis is not an acceptable way for an employer to behave.

What other rights might you have for taking time off for childcare in the summer holiday?

Dependant leave – You are entitled to take unpaid dependant leave to deal with emergencies relating to your dependants. This usually means for a maximum of one or two days and would cover the emergency of regular childcare arrangements failing and you needing time to sort out alternative arrangements.

Flexible Working – Whilst the company is not obliged to grant your request, it will be obliged to seriously consider any application that you make formally for flexible working. Traditionally this is to reduce hours or days, but there is nothing to prohibit an application not to work during all or part of the school holidays. Remember, however, that any flexible working request that is approved is permanent (unless agreed otherwise) and you can only make one request in any period of 12 months whether it is refused or granted.

Parental Leave – After one year of employment you are entitled to apply for up to 18 weeks unpaid leave to spend with each of your children before they reach 18. No more than four weeks unpaid parental leave can be taken in any calendar year. The employer can reject the dates proposed and offer alternatives, but cannot completely refuse the request.

As part of The FA's role in aiming to do everything it can to support a safe and enjoyable framework for football, a new film has been made outlining the four key steps to safeguarding.

The film, featuring Wayne Rooney, Steph Houghton, Jack Rutter and Nathaniel Chalobah, explains how both parents and children can raise concerns they have about adults working in football and centered

around how the 8,500 safeguarding officers working across England football take the following four steps: 1) Checked – to ensure adults are suitable to work with youngsters 2) Trained – from coaches to referees, all are given suitable safeguarding training 3) Hear – concerns from both children and adults will be listened to 4) Report – the importance of raising concerns about a child's welfare Link to Film https://thefa.sharefile.com/dsf9b8ae03a0541469 Following these simple but crucial steps means that there is a framework in place to ensure that, if standards ever fall short with poor practice or unacceptable behaviour, they can be addressed.

Anyone who has a concern about the welfare of a child or the behaviour of an adult towards a child or young person under 18 years of age in football, is required to refer it to The FA Safeguarding team. The team is staffed by professionals who are experienced in dealing with these concerns.

Referring a concern can be done via your club – (cwo@mfcpopleyyouth.co.uk), league or County FA – all will have a designated safeguarding officer (DSO).

Founded in 2005, MFC Popley Youth FA Charter Standard Development Club and Nike Partner Club is a Not For Profit (NFP) organisation dedicated to coaching boys and girls of all age groups to play football. We provide the children with encouragement and a fun and friendly environment with the opportunity to play in matches.


