DRIVERS REQUIRED

We provide a service for elderly people in YOUR community. Particularly for those who find it difficult to use public transport or lack the confidence to go out on their own. We provide a driving service to pick them up from home, take them to their appointment and bring them home again, using our volunteers own car. We also take clients shopping, to social events such as lunch clubs, helping them remain part of their community.

You could be the first person they see that week who has time just for them! You will gain great satisfaction and help them to relieve their loneliness. We try to find you someone who lives near to you so that if you do not have your own transport you can walk to them. But if you have to use your car or public transport we will reimburse your costs.

We need people who have time and patience and like talking to elderly people. You need to have good listening skills and be able to show empathy. We will provide you with training and support and match you with one of our clients. Our befriending co-ordinator will take you to your first meeting with our client and support you as necessary.

Councillors' Page: I am now on the committee in Hampshire County Council for Health and Adult Social Services and had my first meeting in June, There was a presentation on the future of adult care and the pressures by the present government to "save" £56 million. In truth it will hit those in most need the hardest. Then followed a presentation on "Introduction to the NHS Landscape" mostly on some of the steps and how they will shape the changes. I was adamant that their steps had missed the very root of many problems and that was just getting to see a doctor. The waiting times in most doctors surgeries is two to three weeks for "non" urgent cases. While you wait to see the doctor, often the conditions worsen. I met a veteran on Armed Forces Day who was clearly unwell and despite trying, his wait was over two weeks to see a doctor, no wonder A&E gets so busy and overloaded. I was backed by some other councillors of all parties that we need to know more so we will be looking at that later this year. The final presentation was on Stroke services in West Surrey that takes in part of Hampshire. They have 40% vacancies for senior staff here in North Hampshire at least facilities are much better. Popley West: Residents of Marnel Park are contacting me about the parking issues there. I have spoken to Police Chief Inspector Matt Reeves and said that there needs to be action from the police as paths are blocked and parking on corners and opposite T junctions are causing a hazard. I also spoke to the portfolio holder Simon. Bound and acknowledged what I have been saying and contacting him and previous cabinet members about for some time. "Yes there is a problem," he agreed "and there will be a review". "Creating about 30 to 40 parking spaces a year for the whole borough is not going to be an answer". The council needs to allocate more funds and at least start addressing a problem that is getting worse. In the meantime if residents parked in their allocated spaces and gave some thought for pedestrians it would help. It is made a lot worse by a few people who just don't seem to care about the chaos they cause for the many. When the lines at the bottom part of Appleton Drive were suggested there was an outcry and 170 objections. Residents are now saying that it does work. I am meeting officers on 23rd June about extending the scheme. I will of course report back in the August Popley Matters.

The HCC will make the decision on its own application. We are being consulted on the proposal.

Currently around 90 children use the Nursery and are housed in the Sure Start building and rooms in the closed school.

It is argued that running the nursery in two separate buildings is inefficient and it will be better to house the children in one extended building.

There are 24 parking spaces on site and the capacity of the nursery is not being expanded.

Clearly once the former school building is vacated it makes it easier for the HCC to consider other uses for the site. Other users will also have an interest in this.

We will be monitoring developments closely.

Update on the Planning Application for the Pub/Restaurant off Carpenters Down.

The applicant has indicated that they will be revising the scheme and relocating the pub building to the North West of the site with the car parking to the South East of the site. Amended plans will be submitted in due course.

Our position has been and remains that this is not a suitable location for a Pub/Restaurant and therefore the siting of buildings etc. is probably irrelevant.

Firstly, I would like to address the issue of parking. As we all know it is an issue and will unfortunately continue to be. As Police we have limited powers to deal with parking but we are, however, able to deal with obstructions. If you think a vehicle is parked in a manner in which it is causing an obstruction – call 101 and they are likely to deploy if units are available.

You are also not allowed to park within 10 metres of junction.

We lack powers to deal with the circumstance in which a vehicle is parked on a footpath but please do take the time to think about how your parking is affecting others. It may not be illegal, you may be forcing someone with a pram or a wheelchair to have to use the road and this could have extremely dangerous consequences.

We regularly attend Youth Club at Popley Fields Community Centre on both Mondays and Wednesdays and I am pleased to say that the behaviour during these the last couple of weeks has been great and we have thoroughly enjoyed attending!

Anti-social behaviour tends to increase with the improvement of weather and so don't be surprised if you see us around more than usual. Feel free to stop and say hi. Please do call us if you see anything relating to ASB as we do not tolerate this behaviour and want to keep our residents happy!

A few weeks ago, myself and a colleague visited the Gurkha Museum and Sir Harold Hillier Gardens in Romsey on a day out with our Gurkha community. We had a thoroughly fantastic time, learnt lots and even had a little dance.



Social Media – Beware – Don't Lose Your Job!

Social media can help you keep in touch with family and friends, but beware there are significant boundaries between home and work.

Gill Brown, Head of Employment Law at Phillips Solicitors is warning all social media users that these boundaries can be easily blurred and could

lead you into trouble and even dismissal from your employment.

Misuse of the internet and social media is thought to cost our economy billions of pounds every year through theft of time used engaging in social media instead of working, defamation of businesses and their products and cyber bullying of other people often leading to absenteeism. Your employer has the right to protect itself and although you do have certain rights to freedom of speech and protection from invasion of your privacy, these rights have to be exercised with caution.

The first thing to do is to check your employer's Social Media Policy. These vary as some companies allow and even embrace it as part of a working day. More commonly, however, there are strict rules on its use during working hours or even a complete ban on its use. These rules are separate of course to your legal duty not to make defamatory remarks about the company or work colleagues, or to make comments, that even unintentionally, might bring your employer into disrepute. Most company policies make it clear that breach of their Social Media Policy will lead to disciplinary action and even dismissal.

You must remember that it is not safe to rely on social media privacy settings because comments can and often are copied, shared or forwarded on and quickly get into the public domain.

Just be aware that in a recent case the Employment Tribunal upheld a company's right to dismiss an employee, who made derogatory remarks about her company.

The employee's defence was that she did not know that her Facebook page could be seen at work and she denied that she was talking about her employer. She also said that the company should have taken into account that she had been with the company for many years and had a previously clean disciplinary record.

In spite of all of this, the Employment Tribunal found that it had been within the band of reasonable responses for the company to dismiss her given the derogatory nature of the comment, which was clearly aimed at the company.

Following these simple but crucial steps means that there is a framework in place to ensure that, if standards ever fall short with poor practice or unacceptable behaviour, they can be addressed.

Anyone who has a concern about the welfare of a child or the behaviour of an adult towards a child or young person under 18 years of age in football, is required to refer it to The FA Safeguarding team. The team is staffed by professionals who are experienced in dealing with these concerns.

Referring a concern can be done via your club - (cwo@mfcpopleyyouth. co.uk), league or County FA - all will have a designated safeguarding officer (DSO).


