

Route 55

Hospital - Popley - Chineham - Old Basing

Popley Matters has carried regular articles about the Route 55 bus service since the pilot was first launched.

All the Councillors for Popley had argued for the route to be introduced following many requests from residents.

Despite this, passenger numbers have generally been low on the Popley section of the route so earlier in the year we arranged for flyers to be produced in an effort to raise awareness.

Unfortunately passenger numbers have not improved and as the service is run on an entirely commercial basis by BCT it is not sustainable unless this can be turned around.

If numbers do not improve by January we cannot guarantee the service will continue.

The service runs five days a week, Monday to Friday between Old Basing and Chineham, then around Shakespeare Road, Abbey Road and on to the Hospital. It is a 'hail to stop' service and copies of the full route and operating times are detailed in the timetable below. Fares are fixed at £1.00 and concessionary passes can be used.

Councillors' Page: I have requested more repairs for two more potholes outside 604 Abbey Road and two more pothole repairs outside Abbey Road shops, plus a carriageway pothole repair in Tintern Close. All have been marked for repair and should be done soon. The Highways Officer is also going to check all roads and pathways and I will let you know where there may be more repairs.

The salt carts have been busy and all priority roads will be done when needed. Can I remind our residents that the salt bins around the estate are for public areas and not personal use on your garage driveways. The roads are a priority so people can get to work or appointments. It is just a very few people that do help themselves to the salt/grit but it could mean when salting is needed the bins are empty. Please also do not use cat litter as it refreezes very quickly and is very slippery. Also the clay content in cat litter stains and can also rot your carpet! Yearly I get people saying that they won't clear any areas as they would be liable if anyone slipped on pathways you clear and there is guidance on the Government websites that cover this subject. All fall under the responsibility of County Highways. They will be adding signage and kerbs on Popley Way to stop U turns being performed by drivers who, in the main, appear to have been shopping at Lidls or Dunelms and want to turn back towards Chineham.

We have had complaints about speeding in Carpenters Down and Shakespeare Road and would like to see proper calming measures in Shakespeare Road coupled with speed restrictions and further measures in Carpenters Down to reduce the dangers of excessive speed in that road. Residents' petitions may help in getting across to County Highways and the Police the strength of feeling from the local community. We have been successful in places in getting the agencies and others to take responsibility for tidying up the estate for residents and others. This involves getting landscaping cut back and the issue of overgrown landscaping linked to overgrown weeds is high on the agenda. Where possible we work closely with our landscaping maintenance staff, Housing Association representatives and others for the joint benefit of the Popley residents.

COFFEE MORNING DAY CHANGE

STARTING FROM 17TH JANUARY 2018

IT WILL BE ON WEDNESDAY MORNINGS 11.00AM-1.00PM Dear readers.

I have been asked by several residents about setting up Neighbourhood Watch Schemes in their roads, and so this is what I will be discussing today.

Neighbourhood Watch Schemes are fantastic when used properly, it can improve home security and encourage greater vigilance amongst people living and passing through their areas. It fosters a great community

spirit and allows everyone to meet and get to know each other.

Schemes are run by members through a co-ordinator and supported but not run by Police. A volunteer co-ordinator (a resident) will liaise with Police. The co-ordinator is acting for a voice of the community.

It is a common misconception that 50% of the road is needed to create a scheme. I have however found out that this is not true and that only two residents are needed (although I would encourage co-ordinators to still try and recruit as many as they can as this is a lot to take on)!

What does a co-ordinator's role include?

- Contact households to arrange a meeting to discuss setting up a scheme;
- Communicating with Police;
- Stickers for doors;
- Fear of crime surveys;
- Circulating newsletters and leaflets;
- Encouraging members to report and explaining what to report;
- Identifying vulnerable households and speaking to newcomers; and
- Identifying environmental problems and reporting them to the correct agencies.

If you are interested, the first step is to arrange a meeting in your street with residents who may be interested in order to ascertain who will become a member, what your expectations are and what you want to achieve.

There were visits to a flea market and a museum that displays Roman artefacts, including reference to the Emperor Probus, before the brewery tour commenced. These handsome beasts go on display at several shows in the south western region during the summer. All then adjourned to the Harness bar for a free tasting of the ales on display. Clear Snow from a Road, Path or Cycleway

You can clear snow and ice from pavements yourself. It's unlikely that you'll be sued or held responsible if someone is injured on a path or pavement if you've cleared it carefully. How to clear snow and ice

When you clear snow and ice:

- do it early in the day it's easier to move fresh, loose snow;
- don't use water it might refreeze and turn to black ice;
- use salt if possible it will melt the ice or snow and stop it from refreezing overnight (but don't use the salt from salting bins as this is used to keep roads clear);
- you can use ash and sand if you don't have enough salt it will provide grip underfoot; and
- pay extra attention when clearing steps and steep pathways-using more salt may help.

WHEN it is cold and dark it may well be tempting to stay curled up under your duvet and 'pull a sickie.'

If you are an employee considering calling in sick, or an employer dealing with this issue, it is important to understand the potential consequences.

If an employee makes up or exaggerates an illness or injury in order to pull a sickie, they can be dismissed by their employer for misconduct. This is because it breaches an implied term of their employment contract called mutual trust and confidence. An employer will usually be able to fairly dismiss an employee if there were reasonable grounds for belief in the misconduct, following a reasonable investigation, and the misconduct in question was sufficiently serious to merit dismissal

Employees may take a sick day for a genuine reason and in some cases there is added employment protection for such employees. For example, where their mental and or physical condition amounts to a legal disability, relates to a pregnancy, an accident at work or is due to the unreasonable conduct of their employer. Employees should note that there are very short time limits that apply to employment claims, in most cases three months, so they should not delay in seeking advice.

On the other hand, some employers are left with malingering employees either constantly pulling sickies or on long term sick leave, which can have a crippling effect on their business. If employers do not follow a fair process they could find themselves pulled into lengthy and sometimes costly employment tribunal litigation.
