Message from the Editor: What a great community, as usual Popley residents pulled out all the stops in a crisis. There were numerous thefts from cars and a few from gardens. Marnel, Merton and Spiers Meadow have had a Facebook page for some time now and it has been a great way of keeping people informed or for advice among the residents. More and more reports were coming in and CCTV coverage recording the activities of a group of possibly three people going along the road and trying car doors and taking items from them. In the main it seems that people either forgot to lock their doors securely, though it was suggested there may be a device that enables false entry to some cars. The police did extra patrols but the thefts continued,

mostly around 3 and 4 am. One resident designed a leaflet to warn residents to keep a look out and make sure the doors were locked. Paul and I offered to print the leaflets and around 1000 were printed with some of the residents printing some themselves. An appeal for deliverers resulted in a large part of the estate getting a leaflet. The Chief Inspector was impressed with the community spirit when we contacted him. Then as the thefts continued Neighbourhood Watch was suggested and, though it has been tried on several occasions, there did not ever seem to be enough people interested. Things have changed with technology and you don't need 50% in each road to "sign up". Well done to Clare Wilkins who stepped forward and offered to be a coordinator. We printed 2000 yellow leaflets to invite residents of the area to a meeting in Everest Community Academy and some wonderful people stepped forward to deliver them. At the meeting over 40 residents came and spoke to police, the Neighbourhood Chair and other guests. There are now over 60 people who have registered and nearly every road is part of that Watch. By now you will have noticed loads of

signs going up in the roads there. Anyone can start a scheme in their road or area all the information you need is on their website or contact clarewilkins@gmail.com. Clare will be happy to explain and help you. Clare will be writing a report in Popley Matters; see the first one on page 1. Well done to all the community that came together to make it happen.

Neighbourhood Watch has come to Marnel Park, Merton Rise and Spiers Meadow



There is now a fully active Neighbourhood Watch scheme set up for the areas above due to sheer determination and community spirit! This was inadvertently started by a spate of what appeared to be opportunistic thieves trying car doors and sometimes getting lucky, stealing whatever was inside. This became a topic of discussion on the Facebook group for these areas and people got together and delivered hundreds of leaflets warning others on the estate to double check their car doors. It became a joke that we were a virtual Neighbourhood Watch group which got me thinking that it couldn't be that hard to set up an actual group. With the help of Jane and Paul Frankum and lots of willing volunteers we again delivered hundreds of leaflets, this time about a meeting to start a NHW group with police, NHW officials and residents at Everest Community Academy one evening. This was a great success and residents decided that they would like to meet with the police every three months regularly. There are now over sixty members of our scheme and signs are up all over the estates.

NHW schemes help to...

- reduce opportunities for crime
- build a community spirit, with neighbours working together for everybody's benefit

However as the Basingstoke County Labour Councillors, we have fought for the proposed cuts among them the lollipop services, cuts in some vital bus routes and Hampshire Youth Music Hub where many of the children who would not otherwise be able to play an instrument or sing should not be withdrawn, and we are hopeful that they will see sense!

You may have noticed several pot holes have paint round them - this is to mark that they will be repaired. The cuts have made it that priority potholes are done first though I think we all know the longer you leave it the more damaged all of them become. I have reported the flooding again along the path in Popley Community Park to the developers and to the council. The area is on next year's budget to start new drains and to tarmac the uneven slabs. It will be done over two phases as it will be quite costly. *Clir Jane Frankum 01256 819924 email jane.frankum@hants.gov.uk*

Popley West: The officer has confirmed that the double yellow lines on corners and on T junctions in some roads in Marnel Park are in the budget for the next political year. There is also some more parking being created in other roads in Popley East then Popley West. It is amazing that this vital safety issue in Marnel Park has not been treated with the urgency that we all feel it needs, especially where it is the main thoroughfare for schools.

We are delighted that at last they have started with the long asked for safe walking/ running routes in and around Popley- see page 9 for the first "Way Marked Route". It was back in the times of the Neighbourhood Panel that used to meet in Popley Fields that residents said they wanted safe walking routes that could double up for exercise and even be used for sponsored charity walks. We well remember using the fields that are now Spiers Meadow and part of Marnel Park that were used by Boys Brigade, Scouts and residents for raising funds. We continue to fight for Green Gym equipment in the Popley Community Park using S106 money from the developers.

We have recently been involved with the design of additional disability bays being created in a number of local closes including Tobago Trinidad and in due course Burns, together with Shetland Road. All are or will be the subject of local consultation and sometimes we receive mixed responses especially where there is pressure on the general parking provision. Clearly our approach is that where we can we support additional parking provision for those with disabilities which is the right thing to do and in most cases this frees up a compensating space/s for other drivers. Overall the position should be improved for all car users albeit we know that there is a general shortfall of parking spaces throughout the Poplev East area.

We are pleased to confirm that the Bermuda Marlowe Practice is appointing a new practice Manager who will support the group in providing a range of patient services for the local community. We ask again for local residents to come forward and take part as a member of the PPG (Patients Participation Group) This group meets on a regular basis with the Practice and helps to influence the practice in its services provided for local people."



Year R - Dinosaurs

Our Year R children have had a great half term learning all about Dinosaurs. Last half term the Year 1 children became 'Fire Experts'. As part of the topic, they were challenged by the fire service to learn all about the Great Fire of London and how it changed London to make the City safer. These jobs included:

- Writing a newspaper article about the Great Fire of London
- Finding out about the job of a fireman and writing a job description
- Looking at which materials could be used to make strong water bucket

When the children had finished their challenges, they had a visit from the firemen who showed them around their fire engine.

Year 2 - Antarctica

This half term the children have been learning about the Rainforest. They have discussed the issues the Rainforest is facing and the need to raise awareness about the dangers of deforestation. The children could not believe how many of their favourite animals are being affected and how many food and drink products contain palm oil. They were so shocked that they decided they needed to take immediate action. The children wrote newspaper reports and filmed them. The newspaper reports told their audience what was happening, what effect it was having and how they could help!

But this wasn't enough ... The children wanted to widen their audience and hold a protest on our school playground using banners and signs they had made for their half termly homework.

Dear Friends

Perhaps one of the most familiar parables of Jesus we may know is the story of the wise and foolish builders as told by Luke and Matthew. Just a brief reminder: Two men build their houses, the one builds his house on rock with strong foundations when the storms come and rain lashes the house and the flood rises the house stands firm. The second man builds his house but fails to put down strong foundations and instead builds his house on sand. The storm comes, the rain lashes the house and the floods rise. Sadly, the house collapses because it has no foundation.

God foundations are important - believe me I've come to recognize that fact as the building works have progressed on the community facilities at St Gabriel's and I'm pretty confident that the building will stand for many more years whatever the weather may throw at it! The parable is important because it's all about the foundation we build our life upon.

The storms of life can hit at any time and most frequently without warning! There seems to me a lot of anxiety around there days. Anxiety and uncertainty about relationships, finances, work, children and the wider issues of Brexit and climate change.

How we react when the storms of life come will reveal whether we have built on rock or sand. Sadly, in my role all too often it's the latter rather than the former. Jesus said "whoever hears my words and acts on them is like the man who built his house on the rock" The parable follows on from some of Jesus' most profound teaching: 'Ask, seek, knock!'; 'judging others'; 'the narrow and wide gate'.

Jesus is always ready to be alongside us in all our trials and storms. It matters not to him who or where we are, have been, what is important to him is where we are going. Lent provides an opportunity in the Christian calendar to explore those areas of our lives that cause the storms to erupt and to invite Jesus alongside to calm the storm. So, can I invite you to consider the foundations of your life.

The term Lasting Powers of Attorney (LPA) may sound like an exciting TV series, but it is in fact a very useful legal document that people really ought to consider having in place alongside their Will.

An LPA is a way of giving someone you trust the legal authority to make decisions on your behalf should you lose mental capacity in the future or if you are worried about managing your affairs in the future. This person is called an Attorney.

You can have more than one Attorney and these can be anyone you chose such as family members or close friends. Clearly, they should be people you trust explicitly. One could be a professional adviser, such as a solicitor, who could oversee the activities of the main Attorney.

There are two different types of LPA. One of them covers decisions about your property and finances, and the other covers decisions about your health and welfare. You can choose to have one or both.

You can appoint the same person or persons to be your Attorney for both LPAs or you can choose different Attorneys.

The LPA will only be valid if you have the mental capacity to set it up and have not been put under any pressure to create it.

It must be countersigned to this effect by a trusted third party and registered with the Office of the Public Guardian.

If you are married or in a civil partnership do not assume that your spouse will automatically be able to deal with your finances and make decisions about your healthcare. This is not the case as, without an LPA, they will not have the authority.

We recommend that everybody has an LPA in place as mental capacity can be lost or diminish suddenly, as a result of a serious accident or suffering an illness.

An LPA can certainly provide some peace of mind for all concerned.

Probus visit TAG Aviation Farnborough



Members of the Probus Club of Basingstoke had an informative look behind the scenes of this airfield, perhaps best known for the Farnborough International Air Show.

Samuel Cody made the first sustained powered flight in England here in 1908 and from WW1 Farnborough has been closely

concerned with testing and evaluating aircraft. The Royal Aircraft Establishment (RAE), was established here and resident until 1985.

Increase in housing and lack of airspace hampered military flying and closure loomed. Part of the airfield was released for general and business aviation use, but with poor uptake, closure was inevitable. The company TAG, (Techniques d'Avant Garde), secured the airfield for a multi-million pound purchase. TAG Heuer watches was an earlier investment although is now owned by LVMH luxury brands group. Today they own 25% of the McLaren car group. TAG has similar airfield operations in Switzerland and Spain.

Significant capital expenditure in landscaping and modernising the airfield was needed for bespoke VIP business jet operations and current Civilian Aviation Authority regulations. These included a new control tower, radar unit, spacious aircraft maintenance hangars and an extensive aircraft apron for multi jet parking, servicing and operations. The 2440 metres runway was resurfaced. To attract business users TAG commissioned a luxurious terminal building that provides the very best hospitality for both VIP passengers and Aircraft Crews.

Besides customs, immigration and security facilities passengers may drive directly to their waiting aircraft. No lengthy and tedious waits here inbound or outbound! Their customers demand and receive high quality and discrete service standards.

All are part of a comprehensive bespoke solution encompassing complete aircraft and passenger handling services for business clients on London's doorstep. TAG Farnborough employs over 1,000 people with 28,000 aircraft movements which will be increased to 50,000 over the forthcoming years.


