

Some have been repaired and I am continuing to report potholes but you can report them too on https://www.hants.gov. uk/transport/roadmaintenance/roadproblems The government has given Hampshire County Council three million towards the repairs and it may help a little but they have been left so long and have got worse I fear there will still be more to do than they think. There is a lot of information on all departments on the Hampshire County Council web site www.hants.gov.uk.

We have moved up the list for parking issues including double yellow lines, though I still have not been given an indication of when it will start. The lines would be on corners and opposite T junctions where it is impossible to see around. I have heard that there is a possibility the law for parking on pavements as enforced in London will become an offence with a £70 fine. **Popley West:** The travellers returned and created a really massive mess with all sorts of rubbish, rubble and human mess. They were on private land that belonged to the developers, David Wilson Homes. Residents of Marnel Park were very angry, and rightly so. With the cooperation of David Wilson Homes and the local police the travellers were moved on and a massive clearance began. We asked that environmental services would check that a thorough job of clearing was done and they confirmed there was no contaminated waste left. However after they left, more pallets, branches and rubble were dumped. David Wilson Homes have cleared the second lot and are working on a permanent solution to prevent the same happening again.

We are looking forward to the new walking route that will go across the two wards Popley East and West and be accessable to all including disabled buggies and pushchairs. We are also working on getting Green Gym equipment for the park areas in Popley West with developer grant money. It may take a little while but think that it will be well worth the wait!

Popley East: Shakespeare improvements to the highway are due to start in June/July. They include traffic calming measures, a new footpath connecting with Popley Way, crossing points, parking lay bys and a new bus shelter opposite Browning Close. We hope this first phase will be followed by further works as we know this road needs continuous improvements.

Look out for improvements to small areas of landscaping in and around Lundy and Cayman Closes. Together with the changes to the play area in Sark Way, these represent a changing environment for local residents.

We hope we will enjoy a good spring and summer and the Splash Pad will once again prove to be a popular facility for young children and their parents/carers. We have secured improved parking for visitors and we hope this will be used effectively so that local residents are not inconvenienced in their daily activities.

Marstons are appealing the decision to refuse their application to build a pub/restaurant on land at Carpenters Down. We will keep residents informed about the arrangements which will apply to this appeal so that there is good public participation in the process.

Dear readers,

I have previously written about theft from motor vehicles and how the figures have risen in Popley. Unfortunately, this has risen again but in the Basingstoke area in general.

These are from both cars and vans. The majority of these incidents have occurred through the person involved gaining access to the vehicle because

it has been left unlocked.

I was walking through Popley a few weeks ago and spotted a vehicle that did not have its door shut properly. I then shut the door, knocked on the property to inform the owner but the owner was not in. We are patrolling and trying to identify vulnerable vehicles as much as possible, but simply ensuring your vehicle is locked could save you a lot of money. I am in the habit of trying the door handle every time I leave my vehicle, just to check it is locked. Especially if your hands are full with shopping, it can be very easy to forget.

Other security devices are available:

**Electronic Immobilisers** – These do have to be fitted by main dealers or installers accredited by the vehicle Security Installation Board. (Cars since 1998 are fitted with these).

**Mechanical Immobilisers** – Such as steering wheel locks. These are not expensive and are easy to fit yourself.



# Support for Stroke Survivors in Basingstoke Grows with Launch of New Support Group

The Stroke Association is launching a new venue for a local support group to help more people affected by stroke in Basingstoke.

The Basingstoke Area Stroke Support group meets every Wednesday from 2pm. The group, which has been running for over ten years now, is moving to Hill Rise Hall on Bach Close, on Wednesday 25 April 2018. The charity is inviting anyone affected by stroke in Basingstoke to come along and get involved.

One stroke survivor who has been attending the group since it opened its doors in 2008, is mother of three, Pat Sweetingham. Pat, 55, from Oakley, had a stroke in 2003 when she was just 40 years old. The stroke left Pat with severe weakness in the right side of her body, and with a communication difficulty called aphasia.

Pat said: "The group has helped me to talk and I have gained long term friends here. It's a special place, and has made a huge difference to me and many other stroke survivors. After coming to the group for two years, I became a volunteer for the Stroke Association to help them run the group. Volunteering is great because whilst you help others, you feel good and help yourself to improve."

Samantha Malkin, Stroke Association Support Coordinator at the Stroke Association, said: "The Basingstoke Area Stroke Support group is a much-needed place for local stroke survivors and their families to come together and support each other.

'Stroke is life-changing, but the Basingstoke Area Stroke Support group's work can really make a difference to lives of stroke survivors. It's hugely important that stroke survivors feel supported in their local community throughout their road to recovery."

### **Probus has a Taste of The Vyne**

The history of this local Tudor Palace, situated south of Bramley, and its much publicised roof project were the subject of a talk given by Chris Burrows to the Probus Club of Basingstoke.

Built in 1268 the building was added to over the years. Sir William Sandys, had developed the property into a Tudor palace and had the honour and

great cost of being a recipient of the King Henry VIII and Queen Anne Boleyn's "progress" in 1535.

Baron Sandys endowed the Holy Ghost chapel in Basingstoke and is buried there. The painted glass windows from the chapel were installed at The Vyne, some of which underwent restoration in 2016.

Chaloner Chute bought the Tudor palace in 1653 demolished it in 1665, rebuilding in the Palladium style. In 1767 John Chute began further modernisation and installed the grand staircase that can be seen today. The Vyne was bequeathed by Sir Charles Chute to the National Trust in 1956.

After years of patching up the extensive roof it was decided to completely remove and replace was the best course of action. Started in 2014 a cover was constructed over the whole building including a lift for materials and passengers. Some chimneys were taken down so that a walkway could be constructed around the complex for the use of 150,000 visitors. February

2018 saw the walkway removed so that the original chimneys could be rebuilt.

70,000 handmade tiles have been used of which nearly 13,000 were bought by visitors in the "Tagatile" scheme allowing personal messages to be written raising £64,000 towards the budget of £5,400,000.

It will take three months to remove the roof covering and 41 miles of scaffolding but without the use of a helicopter or aerial photographs no one else will be able to wonder at the skill levels used by the renovation team over the last four years.

# **Landlord's Worst Nightmare**

It is every landlord's worst nightmare – you have let out a property and everything was going fine, but suddenly without notice the rent payments have stopped.

Your calls to your tenant are not returned and you have had no response from your letters, while at the same time the money to pay the mortgage has dried-up – what

do you do?

There are legal steps you can follow to get the tenant out of the property.

However, it is vital that you obtain proper legal advice as if the correct procedure is not followed to the letter, the Court may well adjourn the case, causing delay and even result in your claim being struck out, meaning you have to start the process all over again.

The first step is issue a 'formal notice that must be correctly drafted and properly served. You cannot just take back possession without following the legal process otherwise you could find yourself in trouble with the law.

If the tenant refuses to leave the property once the notice expires then you will need to apply to the Court to obtain a Possession Order.

Unfortunately court cases are not always quick, due to the workload of all courts, so the sooner you issue a notice and deal with matters the better. If the tenant does not leave the property once a possession order is made, then the Court can instruct a bailiff to carry out the eviction.

At the time of writing, the sun is shining gloriously, I have espresso in hand and it finally feels like spring. Wahoo!!

The weather held out long enough for us to clear waste from the edge of pond

closest to the main road and parallel to little Tesco at the end of last month. Bryan was in his element in waders, at the deep end. Luckily, and especially for me in this instance bearing in mind I live with the man, any work we do in or near to the ponds is subject to Gill's unfaltering diligence in terms of safety and risk mitigation. Safety always comes first!!

Speaking of ponds though, we've had some rather dismaying news regarding the balancing pond near Jersey Close in Marnel. Our mate the Ecologist has been round to take a look as we suspected the pond was contaminated. The results of the survey weren't good. With the Great Crested Newt population being of particular interest, we will have to have a team out to mitigate the effects of the contamination and monitor the pond extra closely to ensure the conditions don't deteriorate any further.

There is a positive here though - WE can help!!

Essentially balancing ponds like we have in our conservation area, work by way of providing temporary storage for water when the drainage system is overwhelmed. This includes the collection of excess surface water which runs from our properties when we use hoses or washers.

So my ask for the month is simple and this: please stay aware that your water waste flows directly into a network of ponds within a conservation area.

Ensuring that any chemical products, or debris from household activities such as washing cars doesn't end up in the pond system is hugely important. Ways to mitigate this can be as simple as parking in a different spot to direct any waste water away from pond inlets, and throwing away disposable cleaning cloths into a bin.

I know I must sound like such a nag but think about it: it's not for us, it's for you - you live here and you deserve to live somewhere lovely! :)
