

I showed him all the photos and videos that I had been sent by residents and he has arranged for a site visit on the rights of way routes between Popley and Sherborne St John. I have asked that notices of the routes are posted so people can see the right route and that there should be some pruning of the hedgerows that are overgrowing. The officer will be talking to the farmer about the style and access. I will report back to you in the next Popley Matters.

I met with Hampshire County Council's Suicides Prevention Officer and the group "Out of the Darkness" they have been supporting people via social media (Facebook) for four years and been recognised in many other countries too. When they read about another area putting hand written notes on bridges to help to deter suicide (sadly one of the amazing ladies lost her daughter to suicide a few years ago.), we had the assurance from the officer that they would not remove the notices while research is done to other schemes where permanent notices have been put. Popley West: At last the rusty old damaged and often unreadable street signs and numbering are being replaced all the roads in the older part of Popley West should be upgraded. However it looks like because of budget cuts it may take some time to complete so it's the worst ones first.

After complaints from residents about bonfires at the Abbey Road allotments we met with a resident and an allotment officer and explained the problem of the smoke and smell. As a result a new notice has now been erected at the entrance and an internal monitor of one of the allotment holders was appointed. The responsible holders were thanked for their cooperation and we had the assurance that the plots that clearly were not being tended to will be returned and two people on the top of the 500 on the waiting list will be offered the plots. The hedgerows surrounding the allotments were in need of cutting back as they were making it impossible to walk past without getting caught by brambles, and that has now been done too.

All these works were due to start in the summer but some problems had to be overcome and, as things stand, work is now planned to start at the end of January 2019. We will keep you up to date on the progress of this scheme.

Again after some delay the legal agreement between the parties relating to Chineham House has been completed and the planning approval has been confirmed for the conversion of the building into living accommodation. The proposed conversion also includes the creation of a small community room together with access for those with disabilities.

The Splash Pad enjoyed another successful operation over the summer months following its delayed opening. Generally speaking the problems with parking were overcome by the use of the overflow car park and this will continue for 2019.

We are pleased to report that the Council has responded to the problems experienced, reported to us by residents, involving a homeless person living under the skateboard ramp in Chineham Park. All those involved will seek to continue to work with the individual concerned to achieve positive outcomes so there is no need for the homeless person to sleep outside in the conditions experienced under the skateboard ramp in the park.

Popley Matters 200 Celebration Party

What a wonderful occasion when we celebrated the 200th issue of the community magazine Popley Matters on 6th October. The story started in 1991 when Popley residents met at the old John Hunt School and came up with the idea of a newsletter and the name Popley Matters was chosen. There were only 4 issues between then and 1997. When a report in the Basingstoke Gazette and a TV program gave a really negative view of Popley in 1997 residents got together and said they were happy and loved living in Popley and it was not a fair reflection of Popley as we know it. "Why not revive Popley Matters?" they suggested. Paul Frankum said "I will do one just to show how it can be done", famous last words as Paul still lays out Popley Matters. The next change was when residents were saying they enjoyed reading it but it needed to be monthly. So in June 2005 it became the monthly magazine it is today. Jane and Paul Frankum still edit it and have edited it since 1997.

We wanted to say thank you to the wonderful people who have helped in so many ways, impossible to name them all and we don't want to miss anyone out. We set about tracing and found people living in Hong Kong, Scotland, and all over the country. We didn't realise just how many hundreds of people had been involved. Invitations went out and in true community spirit St Gabriel's newly extended church hall and kitchen were offered. Bring a Plate and Share turned out to be more of a banquet. 70 plus people came. Stories of people's involvement and memories meant the two hour drop in party went too fast. I think Popley can be very proud of its community and the 27 year history of Popley Matters.





The Man Who Made Meccano, Hornby Trains and Dinky Toys)

Everyone in the room put their hands up to the question - who had played with some of the brand names in this heading?

The man behind such world famous products, Frank Hornby, was the subject of a talk given by John Hollands to the Probus Club of

Basingstoke. Born in 1863, Frank Hornby was the 7th child of 8 children. Liverpool was his lifelong home ending up as Conservative MP for Everton. He started as a cashier and ,having realised that perseverance was the key to success, founded a branch of the Band of Hope around 1900. This was a temperance organisation with several million members throughout the country.

He wanted boys to take up useful trades and started to develop a construction kit which he patented in 1901. Initially called Mechanics Made Easy the name changed to Meccano in 1907 and by around this time it was exported to over 40 countries. It had initially been plain metal then painted red and green then blue and yellow. Instructional monthly Meccano magazines became required reading.

The famous Binns Road factory in Liverpool was opened in 1914 employing up to 2000, mainly women. After WW1 Hornby introduced model trains to compete against resurgent German toy manufacturers. The engines were driven by clockwork motors and then by 1925 mains electricity. Export markets had decals on the trucks and passenger coaches pertinent to their own countries.

The factory started to make model figures and equipment to complement the train sets. They were called Dinky Toys. Road vehicles were added to add authenticity to the layouts and thus began the third string of this toy manufacturer which continued up to the closure of the company in 1978.

Today Dinky Toys, especially with original boxes, command extraordinary prices at





Age Discrimination

The talents of more than a million over 50s are being wasted because of age discrimination!

That is according MPs who sit on the Women and Equalities Committee, chaired by Basingstoke MP Maria Miller.

The select committee found that discrimination, bias and outdated practices are prevalent across the business world even though they have been explicitly outlawed under regulations introduced in 2006.

It heard evidence from older workers that they were regularly discriminated against in the job market and were disproportionately likely to be selected for redundancy.

Following the committee's recently published report, called Older People and Employment, Maria Miller said: "Despite age discrimination being unlawful for more than a decade, the scale and lack of enforcement uncovered by our inquiry is both alarming and totally unacceptable."

The report was critical of both the Equality and Human Rights Commission (EHRC) and the Government for failing to enforce the law on age discrimination.

It called for it to be made clearer that prejudice, unconscious bias and casual ageism in the workplace were all unlawful under the Equality Act 2010, which replaced the Employment Equality (Age) Regulations 2006.

At Phillips our Employment Law team, headed by Gill Brown, can advise you on all aspects of age discrimination which Gill reminds us can be directed at young employees as well as the over 50s.

The age discrimination laws under the Equality Act 2010 are in place to prevent you from being discriminated against by reason of your age, whatever that might be, which could hinder or even prevent you from getting a job, accessing relevant training, being promoted or having your employment terminated.
