

### **Access Group for Basingstoke and Deane**

The Group was formed in 1989 by a former Councillor, now deceased, who, because of his disabilities understood what was needed by people with disabilities.

Since then a lot of work has been done in the Borough, particularly with regards to access to public buildings.

We are a group of about 15 people, some of whom have some disability or are working within a caring and helping environment. We also have an Architect with us our Access Officer, who attends our meetings and advises us on many matters.

We therefore have a lot of expertise in matters concerning disability and access.

What do we do? Our main concern is that Developers adhere to the building regulations as regards disabled access to public buildings, and toilets and to make sure that a wheelchair is able to enter the building. Amongst other things we try to ensure that there is easy entry to shops and other buildings, disabled parking bays and signs are clear, that life for those with mobility difficulties is made easier.

We also publish a newsletter which contains articles on disability and access matters and with it we enclose a list of those local organisations that are able to help people.

It is my personal wish that we can help and advise people with access difficulties and respond to their queries

### **BASINGSTOKE MENCAP SERVICES**

**Basingstoke Mencap** provides support, advice and information for people with a learning disability, their parents and carers in the Basingstoke & Deane area. We are affiliated to the Royal Mencap Society, and our office is in YMCA House at Eastrop Way, Basingstoke. We are managed by a board of trustees and employ 3 members of staff who are based in the office and about twelve support workers who work mainly in client's homes.

Our services include the Basingstoke Mencap Support Worker Scheme, various social activities, and links to care and support organisations.

#### **Social Activities:**

The **Tuesday Club** meets at the YMCA, Eastrop Way each Tuesday evening from 7.00 to 9.00. Club activities include organised games, arts & crafts, cooking and quizzes. Our autumn programme included the launch of drama and music sessions. Club evenings are very informal and friendly and we are always pleased to see new members. Current entrance charge is only 50p per person. Volunteers are always welcome.

The **Mencap Coffee Morning** is held at the YMCA, Eastrop on the first Tuesday of the month from 10.30 to 12.00. It gives parents, carers and friends the opportunity to meet up for an informal chat to share ideas and problems. Everyone is welcome, please drop in.

**New Projects:** we hope to launch a gardening project in the spring and would be grateful for the donation of any spare tools. Enthusiastic gardeners willing to work as volunteers on this project would be very welcome. Please contact **Samantha Martin on 01256 331199.** 

**Information:** we have a collection of leaflets, books, and information packs on the issues and needs associated with learning disabilities which we are continually extending and updating. If we do not already have the information required we will find it for you or direct you to the relevant organisation.

**Support Worker Scheme:** this consists of a small hard working team of well trained support workers and is run from the Mencap Offices at YMCA House, Eastrop. It is managed by a co-ordinator assisted by a senior support worker. The majority of our clients are referred from Social Services but we also support private clients who have often been recommended to us by people we have supported in the past.

Our main role as support workers is helping clients to stay in their own homes by supporting their everyday needs i.e. shopping, some personal care and with chores around the house. We also support them in education and leisure activities. Most of our clients are adult but we also give support to children living at home with their parents.

We are always keen to recruit new support workers. The hours can be very flexible - we do our best to ensure that you work the hours that suit you - and you will find great job satisfaction. 

Oakfern and Hart Housing Association (based in Fleet) are in the process of harmonising their operations as part of the Sentinel Housing Group

One outcome of the harmonisation is that the traditional housing officer role that was undertaken by Oakfern's staff will change.

The new **Neighbourhood Co-ordinators** will be able to spend alot more time out on the estates sorting out issues with residents. Hopefully this will assist the good works carried out so far by the Popley Partnership which looks to improve residents quality of life in general

The Neighbourhood Coordinator for Popley is Melanie Purves. Many of you will have met the previous Housing Officer Mary Curtis who worked in Popley for about 4 years. Mary is now a neighbourhood Coordinator in the Fleet area. She is enjoying the change of area and feels that Popley will benefit from a new face on the streets

Melanie has worked in housing for a couple of years and is studying for her Housing Qualification. She is a native of Basingstoke so understands some of the issues that face the town today.

### **Play Area Consultation**

After nearly a year, the Borough–wide consultation about the risks associated with play areas is complete. The extensive consultation covered 19 wards within the Borough and affected over 165 play areas. The results of the consultation were discussed with the Councillors from each of the wards and the recommendations were agreed.

### Popley Partnership

As the outgoing Chairperson of Popley Partnership I have been asked to give you an update on what the partnership has achieved to date and the way forward.

The Popley Partnership was formed in 2000 after a petition from members of the community was sent to Basingstoke and Deane Borough Council and Oakfern Housing asking for something to be done to improve the lives of those living on Popley.

The first thing we did was to commission consultants to carry out a consultation involving all residents of Popley to find out what the main concerns were. This was a thorough process involving a mailing to everyone, completion of face to face questionnaires in residents homes and various workshops to gain public opinion. At the end of the consultation an action plan was compiled and this was presented to residents and has been used by the partnership to improve the environment for all on Popley.

Some of the things the partnership have done or had a hand in accomplishing are;

Setting up of the monthly Community Surgery at John Hunt Community School

CCTV cameras at Longfellow Parade to help reduce crime in the area Increased awareness of and the removal of abandoned vehicles

Provision of more dropped kerbs for easier access for the elderly, disabled, nursing mothers and the repair of footpaths

Cleaning up and painting of the subways

Provision of a Cycle Route

Replacement of vandalised dog litter bins and stickers

Provision of a half pipe for the youth

The future for the partnership involves working with the agencies and the community to continue improving the environment on Popley. Matters still to be addressed are parking problems, landscaping (maintenance of the shrubs and trees), ongoing repairs to roads and footpaths, provision of Community Wardens to work on the estate, more CCTV cameras, more facilities/activities for the youth and ongoing action by the various agencies to deal with anti-social behaviour.

The Partnership are also working closely with those involved with the North of Popley Development to ensure that the existing Popley and the new development integrate together as one community.

Due to my job at Oakfern Housing changing I am handing over the role of Chairperson to Karen Ayling, Neighbourhood Services Manager, and wish her, the other members of the partnership and you all in the community my best wishes for the future. I am sure the partnership will continue, as it has up to now, to work with and for all in the community to improve the lives of those working and living in Popley.

<u>Councillors Report</u> More good news for Popley The Shakespeare House Surgery has at last had the deep ruts in the car park filled in. I was appalled at the state the site was left and after much insistence the road was repaired by the council and the developers who should have done it will foot the bill. I also noticed that there was no safe way to approach the surgery from the back, especially for the disabled in electric wheelchairs, and children were having to run-in between cars in the car park. I have also secured funding to have the pathway joined up at the rear and it should be done within the next few weeks, once ownership of the piece of land is established. Glastonbury Close by the bungalows was so uneven I secured the replacement of the slabs with a much safer surface of Tarmac. If you know of an area in Popley that needs dropped surfaces please get in touch with any member of your Labour Team Paul Frankum, Andy McCormick, Jane Frankum or Rob Donnelly.

Talking of safe paths Councillor Jane Frankum and myself went on a walk around Popley with Martin Bennett as we were concerned that there were areas that it was difficult or imposable to cross the roads safely and there will be a program of supplying dropped curbs. The road improvements near Chineham Park school have made it a lot safer thanks to Andy McCormick's hard work with the residents.

After a long battle to get money already donated by Bewley Homes when Specklewood was built the play area in Trinidad and Tobago should be replaced well in time for the Summer.

The reuse of Bermuda Close old surgery looks likely soon as a pre school in partnership with a local school, Hampshire County Council and led by Basingstoke and Deane Borough Council. Marlowe House old surgery is a dream of all your Labour Team to see it used as a Family Centre and we are progressing all be it too slowly but it should be going before cabinet soon. The empty shop left when the pharmacy moved out has been taken by Fastfare and Dev and Nana would like to know what type of goods you would like to see sold there. We were pleased that the wishes of Popley's residents won the day.

The community surgery is held the first Saturday of the month and there are usually County and Borough Councillors, Police, Oakfern and a Industrial relations consultant (for work related problems). We have also had Link to Learn, Health visitors and Welcare to name a few. If you have any concerns why not come and see us at John Hunt School from 12 till 1 on the first Saturday of the month.

I would like to add my best wishes to Captain Dave Phillips who I have known since I joined the Boys Brigade twenty four years ago. It was a great experience for me and I enjoyed going away to camp. Dave had a real influence on my life and I hope you have a long and happy retirement with Blue by the sea in Morecombe. *Paul Frankum*.
