#### Message From the Editor

Another Popley Matters it does not seem possible that we are into our 12<sup>th</sup> year. So much has changed since I first moved into Popley in February 1971; I think you will see what I mean on page 18.

What are your memories of when you moved in? I moved from the now demolished maisonettes in Oakridge with my friend Mary. Mary and I moved while our husbands worked at Lansing Bagnal, we pushed our two prams full to the gills with items for our new homes. I can't remember how many journeys we made but Mary moved in one week and I moved in the next we shared an old Vine potato van when a kind neighbour offered his works van for us to use for the large furniture.

I am so proud of Popley I suppose that it is obvious to many of you as I am always talking about it. Popley has had such a varied history, one day when I get time I will write it all down, well maybe not all. The Pen and Parchment, DrydenHall and the old Marlowe surgery have been removed and it looks so different with the landscaping. However, some of the biggest changes will come in a few years time with a new school, shops, doctor's surgery and other amenities. The new John Hunt School is due to be built and ready for January 2007 and there will be new houses. Popley North and Popley Fields will have around 1600 dwellings of which nearly 500 will be key worker and social housing, giving young couples a start much like many of us did in the 60's and 70's and it will be welcomed by the 4000 people on the housing list. Many families want to live near each other and Popley is a place that has a strong community feeling. I am sorry Sherborne St John residents are so against the developement, and they would rather not see any Popley houses but most people in Popley are glad to see that there will be homes for young and elderly alike. It will also bring a better bus service especially to Popley West. Aldermaston Open space will be developed into a good family leisure facility nearby a sports field and an all weather pitch.

#### YOUTH PLAY AREA

The consultation display by Tewksbury Close was very well attended and there have been many questionnaires filled in and returned to Ian Harris the council officer responsible for play areas. Most

of the visitors were nearby residents and it was good to see lots of young people there and hear their useful suggestions. It seems that the majority of people were in support of having an area that the youths can use. It has taken two years of consulting, looking at suitable areas to place the area and to find out the best ideas and equipment available. £25,000 was given by MEPC (Chineham Business Park, as it was then) and that does not go too far when an average size play area costs £85,000.

The previous consultations included Councillors, Police, Popley Forum, Popley Partnerships, youth groups, residents and youths on the estate. Everyone said the same, that an area is needed as we can't keep just moving the children on. They wanted a place that would not be too near to residents but not so far away that our children would not feel safe. People also wanted the location to be in an area that the police could watch over. The most central area of Pershore Road was the area that got everyone's votes. The Aldermaston Open space will be developed into a family leisure area when the new houses are built.

The equipment consists of a teen shelter and tyre slide and some goal posts - if we have the money to do it all.

At the consultation there were some negative remarks "I brought up two children and they didn't have this so the kids should not have it now" If we all felt like that there would never be any progress we would not have radio, TV, cars - the list would go on forever. In fact we did have youth facilities very near there in the area where the medical centre is now. You can still see where the pitch was and the lamp-posts where the lighting was and of course the building where they met is still there.

The youths themselves said that the site could be moved a bit further away from the nearest residents as they did not want to disturb them; I thought they were being very responsible. They also did not like the style of shelter and I agreed as it was bright blue and florescent orange and did little to any one shelter from anything.

The consultation has now ended and we await the final outcome.

On-line portfolio available by request Two local charities are looking for volunteers to become advocates. Speakeasy Advocacy and Basingstoke Advocacy Service are Lottery funded projects that have been providing advocacy for people in Basingstoke for 10 years.

#### What is advocacy?

To advocate means to speak for either a person or a cause. Citizen advocacy is a world wide movement, where volunteers are matched with an individual to work in partnership. There are a number of projects throughout the UK, coming under the umbrella of organisations like the National Coalition of Citizen Advocacy Schemes.

#### Who needs an advocate?

Anyone who is at risk of being ignored, disempowered, or socially excluded. Speakeasy gives a voice and support to people with learning difficulties, autistic spectrum disorders including Asperger syndrome, while Basingstoke Advocacy Service works with all other people who have difficulties in expressing what they want or getting others to listen.

#### What does an advocate do?

An advocate will encourage and support people to speak out for themselves, but will speak for them if that is what they wish. The advantages of a volunteer advocate are that they are independent, loyal to their partner and listen only to their partner's wishes. The role of an advocate is varied and may include:

- · Supporting people in deciding what they want
- · Helping people say what they want more effectively
- · Making sure the person is heard
- Supporting the person in making links with the community
- Accessing complaints procedures
- Providing practical support to resolve issues and achieve aims

#### Who can be an advocate?

Anyone who believes that everyone has the right to be heard and be included in their local community. We provide the training and support for all of our advocates, and welcome enquiries from anyone who is interested. Get in touch with us even if you only have an hour a week to spare – that hour can go a long way!

#### MILLENNIUM VOLUNTEERS

In the 3 years since MV started in the area the demand for volunteering has grown. We now have more than 350 young people on our books, some have come and gone but many stay in touch and let us know what is happening in their lives.

The vast majority continue volunteering after they have gained the "Award of Excellence" from Millennium Volunteers and have moved on to a different phase in life, whether to University, Employment or whatever.

We are now part of the Connexions Service funded by the Government, this is an information and advice service for all young people 13-19yrs (however, the age range for MV remains 16-24yrs) We look forward to starting a new contract with Connexions in April this year.

In December we held a Celebration/Christmas party at Reading University in conjunction with projects from Oxford, Windsor & Maidenhead, Reading and High Wycombe. The party theme was the "Wild West" and a really wild time was had by all. Our local MV "DJ" Kyle Parker from Popley, provided a wonderful disco and great live entertainment was provided by MV James Mitchell with his group "The Guy Morgan Project"


Also in December we were lucky enough to be featured on Meridian TV in a series of programmes called "Just a Moment" 12 young people from Popley fields youth club contributed to one of the episodes, this gave us excellent advertising and also a good advertisement for Festival place as some of the filming took place there.

The next big event on the agenda is the "Millennium Volunteer of the Year Awards" to be held 28<sup>th</sup> March in London. Two nominations were sent from this project and one group has been nominated for a national award, so we are keeping our fingers crossed that they will win a national prize! The group is called "Respect" it comprises a group of young women who have developed a sexual health education display and video to tour the local schools. (this was organised by the Youth Service in Fleet) We wish them lots of luck!

We have recently become a member of Youth Action Network this organisation supports the development of voluntary youth action in England. We look forward to working with them.

#### Walking for Health

The Health Improvement Team and Park Rangers at Basingstoke and Deane Borough Council are encouraging everyone to improve their fitness in 2004 by taking part in the "Walking for Health" programme.

A new eight-week pilot scheme started on Friday, 13th February leaving from the Popley Fields Community Centre at 11am, where free car-parking is available. The walk will last about an hour and will be between one-and-a-half and two miles long, returning to the Community Centre for a welcoming cup of tea and chat with fellow walkers.

I thought the readers of our magazine might find these two old photographs, which turned up when I was searching for something else, of interest.

They were taken about 33 years ago when I first moved to Abbey Road.

The first picture shows Abbey Road, from the corner opposite where "The Popinjay" was later built, looking towards Sherborn St John.

The two things that became

immediately apparent in this photograph are the lack of shops; we used to cross the bridge to the Co-Op Oakridge Road, and the absence of parked cars. When we first moved to Basingstoke, and all the estates were owned by the Council, we were asked if we owned a car and if you replied "yes" you were allocated a house with a garage. Most of us were only too pleased to use our garages, as this was a luxury unheard of in London! This was a time when we all had young families and we didn't envisage three and four cars to a house as the children grew up.

The second picture shows the Ring Road with Oakridge Towers to the right. The most obvious difference between then and now is the lack of traffic using this road.

When we first moved to Basingstoke we lived with my sister, and her family, in Stratfield Road, and watched our estate being built from her upstairs window. Our houses used to arrive as giant "flat packs" on lorries! The plywood sections were then faced with the bricks and cladding.

Despite our misgivings as to the unconventional construction of the houses we truly couldn't express our delight at being allocated a three bedroom centrally heated house for only 10 shillings (that's 50p to you youngsters!) a week more than the rent we

were paying for one damp room, and a shared bathroom and toilet in London.

I have seen many changes to Basingstoke in the 33 years I've lived here, as we all have, mainly for the better. I have excellent neighbours; I feel part of a community and with one or two notable exceptions the local children are friendly, helpful and polite. On balance I'm still delighted to live in Abbey Road.



Following the demolition of the Pen and Parchment, Dryden Hall and the Marlowe Close surgery, the sites have now been landscaped.

Sentinel Housing Group and Basingstoke and Deane are in discussions about the possible refurbishment or regeneration of the Longfellow Parade area. Once we

are clear on the future, and if a regeneration scheme in the area is possible, we intend to set up a project team including local people to progress things.

All residents will be consulted on any future feasibility studies, the extent of the project and the timescales.

If a redevelopment scheme is possible, it could not take place for several years as it would need to await the availability of Government funding. Bearing this in mind, Sentinel Housing Group will need to consider what shorter term works we might undertake in the Longfellow Parade area.

#### **Magnolia Court Sing-along**

What a great time was had by the residents, the community warden's, children from Merton Junior school, guests and yours truly at Magnolia Court. We all had our wartime identification cards which entitled us to a really good old fashioned home made nosh up. I am surprised we still found the energy to sing from all the song sheets provided. Although I wasn't born until the war was over I was surprised by how may of them I knew! Two of the Community wardens played musical instruments, the trumpet and trombone - what talent.

And Jack? Well he played the organ and encouraged us all to sing along. I would like to thank all the community wardens that came, I know you enjoyed yourselves, as I know I did too. Thank you to Julie Pior (manager) for being a gracious host. We all decided we must do it again and next time invite as many people that would like to come. We got even more ambitious and thought it would be a good idea to have a big old dance party with real dance band and sing song next year at the memorial park, and have all of Basingstoke and its lovely villages invited. Wow what a party that would be.

Dear Readers,

Basingstoke and Deane Borough Council have just announced their 3 year council plan and budget and as part of that process have set the council tax for 2004/05. This year there is an increase of 2.5%. The average household in Popley, living in a band C property currently pays £915.11 per year in council tax. Of that £915.11 only £77.91 is collected by Basingstoke and Deane Borough Council. The majority goes to Hampshire County Council and the Police. With the 2.5% increase the average Popley resident will be paying an extra £1.95 per YEAR for the services the council provides. That equates to only an extra 0.44p per week. Less than ½p a week.

So what is it paying for? The council tax contribution that goes to the borough pays for the regular emptying of dustbins, the emptying of recycling bins and banks, the regular cleaning of the street environments, the parks and green areas. It also pays for our community centres and the regeneration schemes that are happening or going to happen in some of our local areas.

Popley residents have seen the regeneration in Longfellow Parade start with the demolition of the pub and toilets, and regeneration is earmarked for the Milton and Keats Square. Some of the other noticeable regeneration achievements in Popley can be seen at the Madeira and Abbey Road shops.

The increase in council tax will also contribute towards the continuation of the Community Warden Scheme over the next 3 years. The wardens are out and about in Popley and I know they have met a number of the community groups and residents in the area. They are also working with the council and police to ensure that Popley stays clean, is safe and remains a pleasant place to live. The wardens are there to help communities, to work with residents and community groups - feel free to approach the wardens if you see them around.

So I am pleased to inform you that with the lowest council tax in Hampshire, with the lowest council tax increase in the Country, with the introduction of the wardens and the regeneration schemes planned for the future, Basingstoke and Deane Borough Council have been awarded EXCELLENT status by the Audit Commission. They have said and I quote - "The council is in a much better position to face future challenges" Cllr Rob Donnelly Popley East
