Dear Editor; I have a copy of the article in the last Popley Matters in front of me, in the report from the Community Wardens it states they and the police are targeting riding motorcycles dangerously. Surely it is for the police to say what is dangerous, not the general public it could have said illegally. Then there is the bit at the bottom, have you seen a motorcycle being ridden in your neighborhood? do you know anyone who has a bike and rides it? Maybe you have seen a neighbor taking his bike out from the garden?

I do all of these things and so do people in Popley, these statements seem too broad you could get people just phoning up because a chap takes his perfectly legal bike out, it seems not to be worded the best way.

I do not condone the use of bikes that are ridden illegally and I know it is a problem also in Brighton Hill as one of the chaps was telling me on Thursday. Some of the people at the Motor Cycle Action Group club have asked me to look into the matter. We used to have a problem with skate boarders and bmxers and now they have got parks to do it on, but the problems with bikes is insurance and they are not that popular with the general public Finding people to help to educate these youths on how to ride, fix and look after motorbikes might not be a problem as I am on good terms with Nick Robinson Motorcycles and Just Motorcycles. The problem of somewhere to do it is a bit harder, MAG Basingstoke

Back in my much younger days I was a "rocker" and rode pillion. One lady who is severely disabled had to be pushed against the shopwindow to save her from being knocked down. I dread to think how badly she could have been hurt and this was a lady who works so very hard in the community despite her condition. This sort of behavior is just not acceptable and I am sure you agree. I have asked about a youth facility for repairing cars and bikes for a long time but there was no one to help or place to go where it would not disturb people. If there are people out there who are interested perhaps we could get together and see if it is a viable issue.



Thank you to every one who voted to re elect me on May 5th, I hope to achieve a lot in the next four years. The New John Hunt Community School will be built and the start of building new homes so that our children and future generations will have homes of their own to bring up their families in. With Paul Harvey as the Leader of the council and his interest in Education and regeneration Popley will be bound to benefit.

The youth facility should be finished soon by Popley Fields right by where the new temporary fire station is. The Fire Service are also offering a free fire safety check on all homes in Hampshire with advice on how to make your home safer and should you need a smoke alarm or your old one is past its best the fire-fighters are fitting them for free. You do not have to take their advice but it would make sense to do so.

Yellow lines will soon be painted on roads where it is considered to be dangerous to park and certainly near the Abbey Road shops is a key area. Lorries, vans and cars parked opposite the T junction are obstructing the view for drivers.

The pharmacy is opening soon a little later than was first anticipated but it is amazing how many different papers that have to be signed.

The new path from Dryden to Shakespeare House will be started once the public consultation has finished and if there are no real objections.

The number 5 bus service update: well the tenders are in for Hampshire County Council to apply to subsidise. Thank you to all the wonderful people that wrote letters to support the need to continue this vital service. I am more than hopeful in fact quite confident that we will keep this service and maybe still on the every 15 minutes.

What brilliant sunshine at the Popley Festival. This year was the biggest and best ever. Visitor numbers were estimated at 12000 to 15000. We are always proud of Popley but that Sunday was glorious I spoke to people from Newbury, Reading and lots of our villages they were all saying how wonderful it was. Read the report on page 16.



GREETINGS FROM THE POPLEY PARTNERSHIP

It has been a little while since you last heard from us, not because we have been doing little but so much has been going on!

The Partnership met on four occasions during 2004 and once so far this year.

We have been concentrating on three main areas where progress is being made through joint working; The Longfellow Parade Regeneration (refer to Issue 39 of Popley Matters); the North Popley Development and the Local Strategic Partnership (LSP) Popley Project.

The Partnership is keen to be the eyes and ears of the North Popley Development so apart from receiving presentations on the key issues we are also being kept regularly informed as progress is made. In this way the Partnership can offer advice and guidance to the right people so that there is a local voice being heard.

The LSP Popley Project is in its infancy. This project is taking the information from all the surveys and consultations that have taken place over the years, along with Government Office statistics and looking at the key areas that you have said are important to you, education, crime and income. The Project hopes to bring together the agencies and other groups including local people to see what can be done to make improvements in these three areas. It is early days yet but the intention of the LSP is to use the Popley Partnership as one of the Groups that can help the Project move forward.

Other issues discussed by the Popley Partnership have been parking and garage problems, Sentinel Housing Group's Pride in Your Place Walkabouts, litter removal and the bus service.

At our last meeting in March we also had a presentation from Basingstoke and Deane Borough Council on the outcome of the 'Perception of Crime and Safety Survey'. This is very interesting and details can be found on Basingstoke and Deane Borough Council's website.

Finally, we have been spending quite a bit of time at our meetings reviewing and updating our original Progress Plan so that we can make sure that the issues outstanding are still relevant and if so progressed. When this review is complete we will celebrate with you and Popley Matters all the successes





Different Worlds

Supporting Parents of Children and Adults on the Autistic Spectrum

We are a group of parents, carers, friends and relatives and all have personal experience of Aspergers Syndrome or other Autistic Spectrum Disorders. The group was set up by parents for parents and other carers etc to find, and, offer some badly needed mutual support in this very challenging and often distressing area of daily life. There was no other support or help available locally that catered for Aspergers Syndrome so the decision was made to start our group in December 2003.

We remember a couple of years ago when our son was uncontrollable, and not having a proper diagnosis, as a last resort we turned to the Social Services for Respite. We had no extended family. We were turned down after going through a humiliating assessment - which was full of inaccuracies, and mainly lies from my son's former school, but enough said about them.

We meet fortnightly and invite 'Guest Speakers' along to the meetings. We have had visits from Social Services, the Local Education Authority, and Alternative Therapists re. dietary advice etc.

We don't judge people and we genuinely want to help parents and perhaps it's because of our own experiences that we feel this way. Having two older 'normal' children - now young adults, we never knew of the horrors that parents could face until I had an ASD child ourselves. We knew nothing about Autism until our mid 30's so we had a lot to learn, especially as Steve and Michelle are 'normal'. We had no-one to turn to, and so Different Worlds was started.

Don't be worried about walking into our group as you can sit with someone sympathetic who fully understands the situation you are in. No-one will ask you embarrassing questions or make you feel awkward. You may be a single parent and think that you're alone here - you are not! Whether you're working or not, married or not, how many children you may have, race, religion or colour, you are very welcome.

Our sole object is to help Parents to help the children, so even if you come the once or can't make every meeting because of babysitters etc we understand, but do try and come along. We hope that you'll be pleasantly surprised and maybe make some new friends who understand your situation. The Group also welcomes adults with AS, as no-one knows the condition better than them.

Popley Conservation Volunteers

After all the hard work put in by the volunteers it was disappointing to see in early April the pond afloat with cans, bottles and other rubbish. Someone had apparently held a party at the pond. Unfortunately because it is the middle of the Great Crested Newt breeding season it will not be possible to clean up for several months. After the exceptionally dry winter it looks as though the pond will dry up this summer. If it does we should be able to get most of the rubbish out.


Although it is not possible to work on the pond at the moment PCV have been active in other areas. Several of us are working towards an English Nature Survey and Conservation License. Working towards this end we hosted a training course delivered by the Herpetological Conservation Trust held at Popley Community Centre. We invited a number of guests from outside of Basingstoke. Great interest was shown in the pond and we received offers of help.

The prime reason for conserving the ponds is for the large population of Great Crested Newts. Quite a lot is known about their range in the fields north of the ponds but we know virtually nothing about where they are in the Popley estate. We would like to get a better idea of their range within the estate. If you have seen one in your garden we would like you to tell us, as the information will help us to better understand the population range and movement of these animals.

Is there anyone who remembers Popley before the estates were built? If so we would like to hear from you. What was the area like? Who lived here and what did they do? The area must have been very rural. Perhaps you have a story about a local character or farmer. If so we would really like to know and have a chat with you.

Anyone travelling along Carpenters Down road cannot have failed to notice huge piles of clay and soil behind the fencing in the new development area. This is due to some new ponds that have been dug as part of the conservation strategy. With so much green space being built over it is good to know that the newts have done us a favour and that due to their presence we will all be able to enjoy a natural green space within Popley. Although it has been a dry winter the ponds are now full. Once they are planted and become established they should become an attractive feature. David Glover Popley Conservation Volunteers


