

Save Chineham Park Primary School





On October 15th Hampshire County Council decided to open consultation on the closure of Chineham Park Primary School.

This is down to falling numbers on roll and "surplus places" in other schools.

A Save Chineham Park campaign has been set up by a group of parents headed by Sharon and Barry Lunnon. A facebook group called "Save Chineham Park Primary School" which has attracted over 260 users in its first 10 days. A petition (including an e-petition) has also been started at: http://www.gopetition.co.uk/online/31570.html

The decision to close is premature for three reasons:

- 1. Over 1500 new houses are to be built in Popley in the next 2 years. Using Hampshire County Council's own predictions, Marnel Infants and South View Infants will be overfull by 2012.
- 2. Some of the "alternative" schools would mean children as young as 4 having to cross the A33 with no marked crossing or a 1-mile detour via Faraday Road and Wade Road.
- 3. Following an Ofsted inspection in January, which put the school in Special Measures, the Board of Governors was disbanded and replaced by an Interim Executive Board in June this has not been given time to work. The school is improving the latest SATs of 205 and Value Added of 100.9 are well up on last year. Interim HMI inspections show the school is on course to get out of Special Measures and reject the view of Hampshire County Council that this is a failing school.

To close this school would be a hammer blow to the staff, parents. Pupils and the local community whose only community facility left is in the school. The school also provides a number of essential services such as the Breakfast Club: many children would otherwise go without breakfast. Such facilities are not necessarily provided elsewhere.

Formal consultation on closure starts after Half Term. There is a public meeting on Monday November 9th at the school at 6pm. Cllr David Kirk, the man who made the decision, will be there!



The Parish Council met twice in September – our normal meeting on the 4th Monday of the month (28th), and a special Merton Rise / Speckledwood Road / Marnel Park meeting at Everest Community College on the 16th. Sadly the turn-out for the latter was poor – we are now looking at forming a subcommittee for this new part of the Parish. If you are keen to get involved, please contact Cllr Jonathan Eales or Mrs Clover Morgan the Clerk.

We are delighted to welcome our new 'Beat Officer' WPC Miriam Edwards to the Parish. We trust that she will enjoy her time here – please help her to maintain the strong tradition of community cooperation.

The SID (Speed Indicator Device) continues to move around the Village – it appears to be very successful in reducing average speeds your views on how well it is working would be most welcome. The chicane in Elm Road has – at last – been repaired by Hampshire CC. If you do see dangerous driving or excessive speed through the Parish, please note the number plate and let us know - or inform WPC Edwards.

Chute Play Area – the Parish Council is giving serious consideration to a basketball / football 'kick-around' area to replace the tennis practice wall. As always, we are looking for an affordable design. We will be constructing a walkway from Vyne Road up to the car park – to enhance safety, by separating vehicular and pedestrian access – later this year or early 2010. The football season has started again – the success of the Sherborne St John Football Club is most welcome, but it does mean that we need to consider usage of the playing fields and ensure that parking on match days is properly managed.

Bonfire/Firework Safety.

REMEMBER:

- Fireworks are explosives.
- Always buy fireworks that comply with the British Standard.
- Follow all instructions and always put safety first.

ALWAYS:

- Light sparklers one at a time and wear gloves.
- Dispose of sparklers in a bucket of water as soon as they are finished.
- Never give sparklers to a child under five.
- Ensure that all children with fireworks are well supervised.
- Keep fireworks in a closed box or tin.
- Use them one at a time, replacing the lid immediately.
- Follow the instructions on each firework, using a torch never use a naked flame.
- Light fireworks at arm's length using a taper or a firework lighter.
- Do not drink alcohol if setting off fireworks.
- Stand well back.

NEVER:

Never go back to a lit firework, it could explode in your face.

Never put fireworks in your pocket.

Never throw fireworks.

BONFIRE TIPS:

- Never use/pour petrol or other flammable liquids onto a fire to get it going.
- Always start and keep bonfires away from buildings, sheds and fences etc.
- Check the bonfire for animals/pets that may be hiding within it before lighting it.
- Be aware of neighbouring/nearby thatch properties.

Councillors Page: Paul and I were sad to hear of the death of John Blairman who was a councillor for Popley from 1988 to 1999 with his wife Ann. Both John and Ann kept in touch with what was going on in Popley.

I went to the meeting called by the parents and supporters of "Save Chineham Park School" it was well attended. A parents Forum is to be formed from the parents at the meeting. There is an action plan being formed on how to support the school and children who attend it. The main concern is that parents do not take their out of the school. It was stated at the meeting that the reported SATS were not the entire or true reflection of the school. There is a further meeting on 9th November at the school at 6p.m Paul and I have been doing a survey on the paths over this year and have secured some path improvements to some of the worse areas in Tintern, Buckfast, Romsey, Fountains, and Glastonbury. If you know an area that has a significant problem with the paths please contact us. We have also been looking at dropped kerbs and where there may be more needed.

The Old Codger came up with the idea that it would be useful to have a map for disabled residents and indeed for Mums with prams of where dropped kerbs are. A good idea and I am working with HCC officers to see when and if this can be done? Cllr Jane Frankum 819924, write to 405 Abbey Road or email jane.frankum@hants.gov.uk.

Popley West: I have been contacted about dogs especially dangerous dogs that are out with no leads. I witnessed two youths, one on a bike and the other on foot with two Staffordshire Bull Terriers. The dogs were being encouraged to bite and tug on an inner tube. I was told that this strengthens their jaws. What for? There have been reports to us Councillors and the police lately from worried residents and one resident who has had two of his dogs attacked in fairly recent times. If you suspect that people are not looking after or controlling their dogs you can call 101. Most dog owners are very caring and look after their dogs very well.

Still on dogs and dog walking, we are pleased to see that provision for the dogs and walkers have been taken into account with the new park. It is hoped that phase one of the park should be ready by the end of the year (weather permitting).

I did a walk about with an officer and pointed out where it is felt that the improvements to 1 to 213 Abbey Road need finalising, and there will be up to 7 new formal parking spaces created.



We met with Sentinel to discuss the Faroe and Maldive Scheme. The Council very nearly killed the scheme by wanting to take 3 months to decide in principle to transfer the land at nil value. The £14.1m Homes and communities Agency grant stipulates work must start by March 2010. We managed to bring the decision forward by 5 weeks and this has helped keep the scheme on track. Sentinel now want to start demolition in January 2010. The remaining flats in Faroe Close are expected to be empty in the next few weeks. Cllr Andy McCormick 01256 419376 or 07879 436985

New parking restrictions to help keep roads and paths safe

New parking legislation, making it an offence to park in front of a dropped kerb and to double park, is being implemented across the borough from Thursday 1 October 2009.

The new legislation is part of a crackdown on motorists who cause traffic hazards or danger for residents by parking inconsiderately.

From 1 October it will be an offence for any vehicle to park in front of dropped kerbs, including blocking driveways, or to double park. Motorists not adhering to these new rules could be fined.

Cabinet Member for Community Safety, Development and Transport Cllr Clive Sanders said: "The Highway Code advises drivers not to stop or park where a kerb has been lowered to provide access or to help wheelchairs, mobility vehicles or cyclists.

"Blocking dropped kerbs can cause considerable inconvenience and put vulnerable road users at risk. Despite this, some inconsiderate motorists still think it's OK to block driveways and safe crossings. That is why we need to take action.

"There are practical exceptions allowed for residents, such as unloading, so the legislation is not being introduced unreasonably but it does mean the Council can and will fine people who choose to ignore these rules."

Exemptions to parking in front of dropped kerbs include:

- Vehicles unloading or loading or carrying out waste collection, building work or road works.
 - Vehicles parked outside a residential driveway with the owner's consent.


Exemptions for double parking include:

- Vehicles parked in a designated parking place
- Vehicles loading or unloading.
- Vehicles used for waste collection, building work or road works.

To introduce the legislation, leaflets will be given out over the coming weeks to motorists currently parking illegally to encourage them to act responsibly. Residents will also be encouraged to let the council know where offences are taking place.

After the initial four week period, fines of up to £70 may be imposed.

A couple of months ago, myself and Damien were saying how good it would be to have a David Beckham Academy type football venue in the Popley area, It started out as a joke, but when I actually sat down and thought about it, it didn't seem like a bad idea Why couldn't we have a football venue, if we could come up with the funding? The idea is to have a main build with reception, cafe, bar, Internet, Sky Sports, toilets and changing rooms with locker and shower facilities. The main features would be a full size all-weather pitch to be marked in white, a junior 11a-side pitch to be marked in yellow and 3 mini soccer pitches to be marked in blue; 5 pitches in 1. There would also be 4x5a-side and 1x7a-side pitches in the venue for those who just want to turn up with 3 or 4 of there mates for a kick about.

I drew a plan of what it could look like if it went ahead and asked 20 - 30 people in and around the local areas. It and had a great response, from all age groups. Possibly try and get professional clubs to use us as a base to work from in the holidays, Manchester United or Chelsea Soccer Schools. There are loads of ideas I could come up with for the venue, but the main one is to give kids that opportunity to get off the streets.

Budgeting

Christmas is only a few weeks away. It is an expensive time for us all as we look forward to extra food and drink, buying presents for friends and family, going on special outings. Now your community is the time to start thinking about our finances to ensure that we can enjoy the festive time without burdening ourselves with large debts.



Budgeting can help you to know where your money is going, avoid getting into debt, make savings and have more choice about what to do with your money. Setting aside just a few minutes a week to review your finances can help you to live within your means.

Drawing up a Budget.

Start by listing all the monies you have coming in (INCOME) i.e. pay, benefits, tax credits, bank interest, rent received from a tenant or lodger, commission, bonuses. Add to find the total income.

Then list all of your outgoing costs (EXPENDITURE)

- Household food, utility bills, mortgage, rent, service charge, Council Tax, phone bills, TV licence
 - Child childcare, child maintenance, school outings/events
 - Travel –getting to work, car (tax, insurance, MOT, maintenance)
- Leisure going out, takeaways, alcohol, cigarettes, holidays, club memberships, books, magazines
- Financial Products loan/credit card/hire purchase repayments, pension contributions, savings, investments, life insurance, building and or contents insurance, car, medical, mobile phone insurance
 - Other clothes, shoes, toiletries, medicines,

Add to find the total EXPENDITURE.

You can do this on a weekly or monthly basis. Do remember to include those once or twice a year payments. You may need to keep a diary of your outgoings to check that your figures are accurate.

Once you have drawn up your income and expenditure lists calculate the total for each. Take the expenditure total away from the income total to work out what is left over for the week or the month. You can then see how much you have to spend on those extras for the festive season or those special occasions.

If you are regularly struggling to make ends meet you will need either to increase your income or reduce your spending. At least by drawing up a budget and sticking to it you will be aware of where your money is going and can start to manage your finances.

Dear Friends

It may well be that by the time you read this the ashes of Bonfire Night will have cooled and all the fireworks will have been set off, except maybe for that big one you're saving for New Year's Eve! I remember Bonfire Night as a boy in Manchester as a time of wonderful community. For weeks beforehand the boys in the neighbourhood would all be out every spare moment gathering bits of wood (or anything else that would burn) and piling it onto the bonfire in the field near where we lived. Competition for "penny for the guy" would be fierce among the children as we scrabbled for the best pitch – usually outside the pub!

On Bonfire night we'd rush home from school to get changed and gather around the pile of wood and stuff. As it was lit and the flames reached hungrily into the cool of the November evening air fireworks of every colour shape and size would crackle and flare, lighting the faces of adults and children alike with their bright, eerie colours. We'd share 'hard as rock' treacle toffee, toffee apples and potatoes baked to charcoal in the intense heat at the edge of the bonfire. As the bonfire died down we children would wander home to bed and the grown ups would sit around the glowing red embers swapping tall stories and drinking warm, flat beer! The next day the air would be thick with bonfire and firework smoke and the lingering smell of expended gunpowder. For me Bonfire Night conjures up very pleasant, powerful and evocative memories.

Community is a vital part of what it is to be human. I'm not talking just about the social gatherings like Bonfire Night which are usually such great fun! It's the sense of community that takes pride in its surroundings, which cares for the vulnerable individual whether old or young, rich or poor, which takes the time to smile, to greet, to look in on someone. In fact it's the community that God created us to be a part of, and to take part in! Unless we all buy in to this idea of community it will never be as it should and that diminishes all of us!

As a Christian I firmly believe that St Gabriel's as a church is called to be a people that reflects the nature and character of Jesus to our community. Jesus was the Master of caring and sharing, listening and talking with those among whom he lived and worked each day. I hope that His example and desire today for true community is what forms the heart of our vision for our church and for Popley.
